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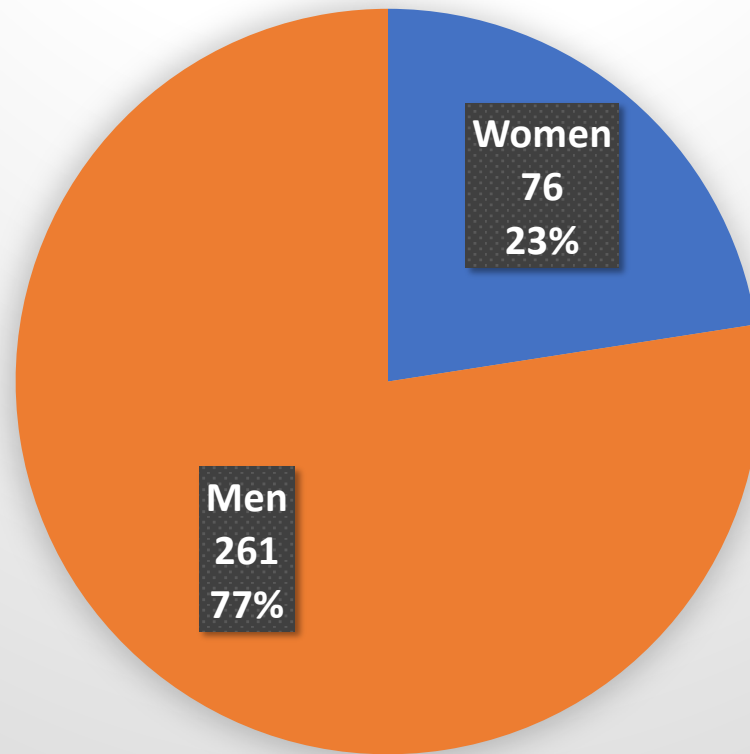

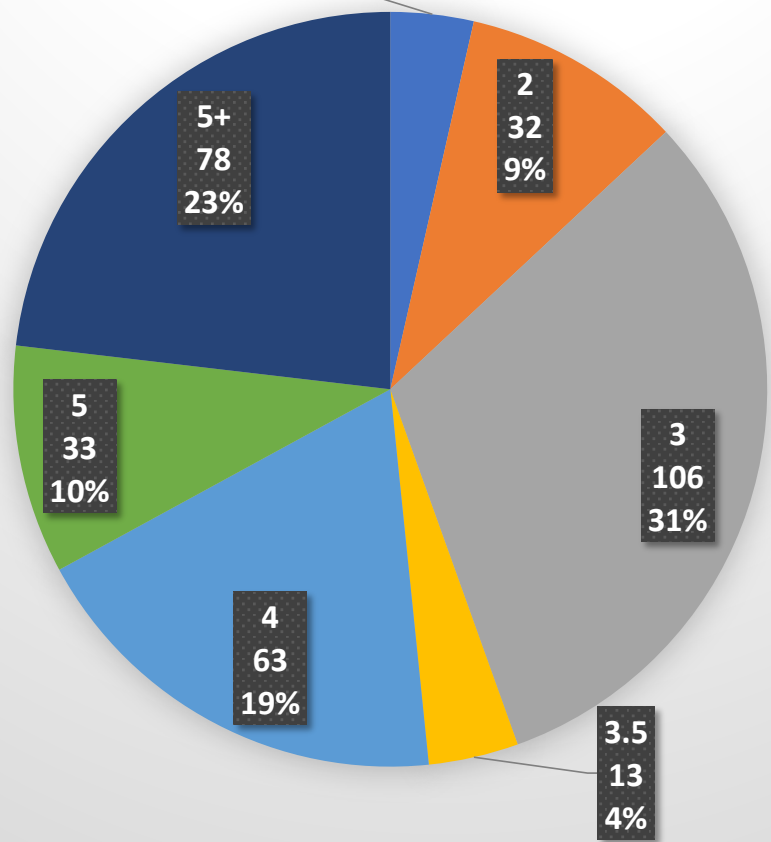
Count of Women and Men



The 5 stages of Homelessness that were used for this expedited triage:

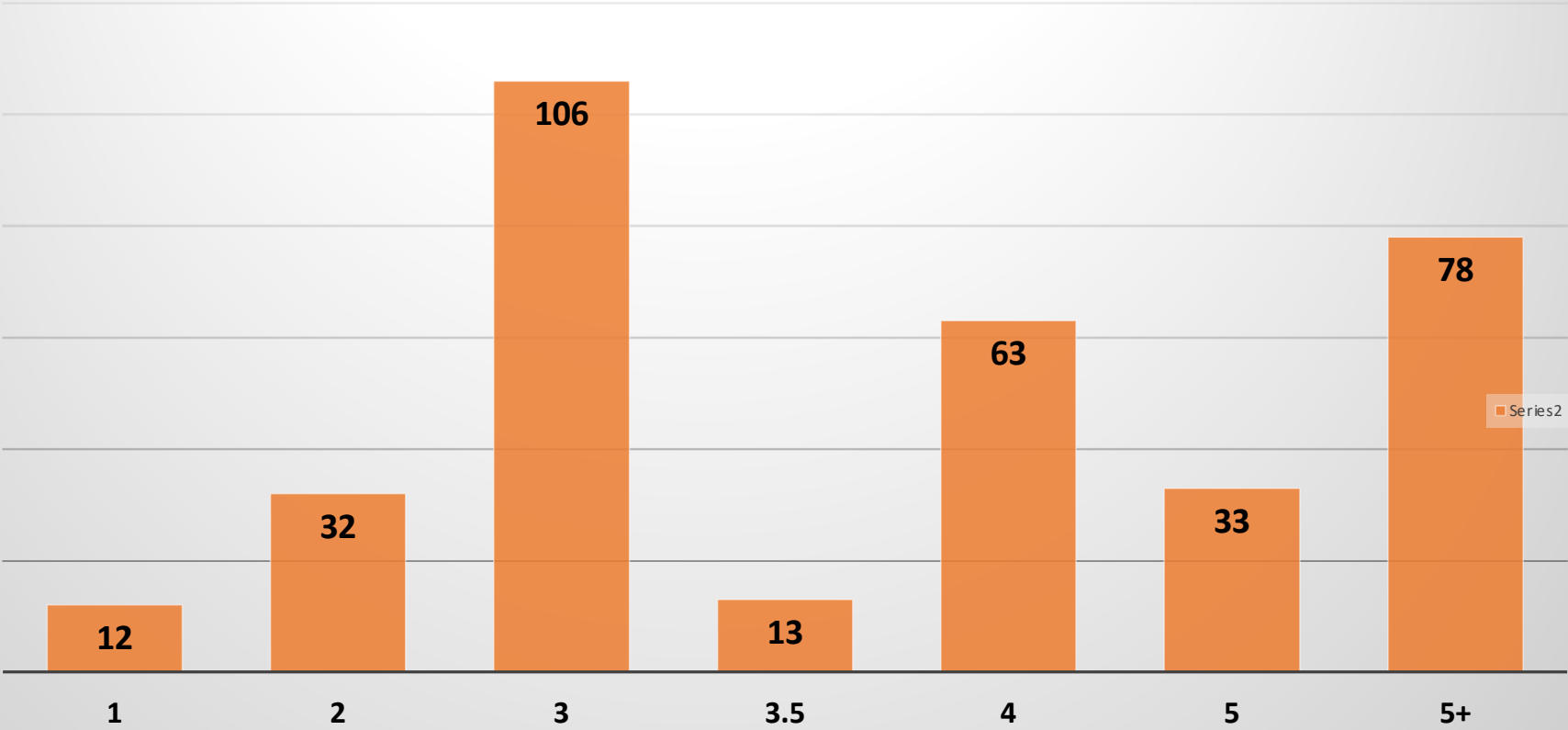
1. Situationally Homeless. Able to resolve with minimum support.
2. Working, work ready and/or purpose-driven. Able to exit emergency shelter with minimum to medium supports.
3. Homeless as a result of substance abuse, unresolved trauma, lack of stable supports, etc. Able to exit emergency shelter with medium to high-medium supports. 3.5 Need high support to resolve homelessness.
4. Chronically unstable; those who live with significant health and/or mental health challenges and need ongoing support.
5. Homeless and in survival mode and not willing or able to leave the lifestyle. 5+ Homeless, in survival mode and have significant health and mental health challenges.

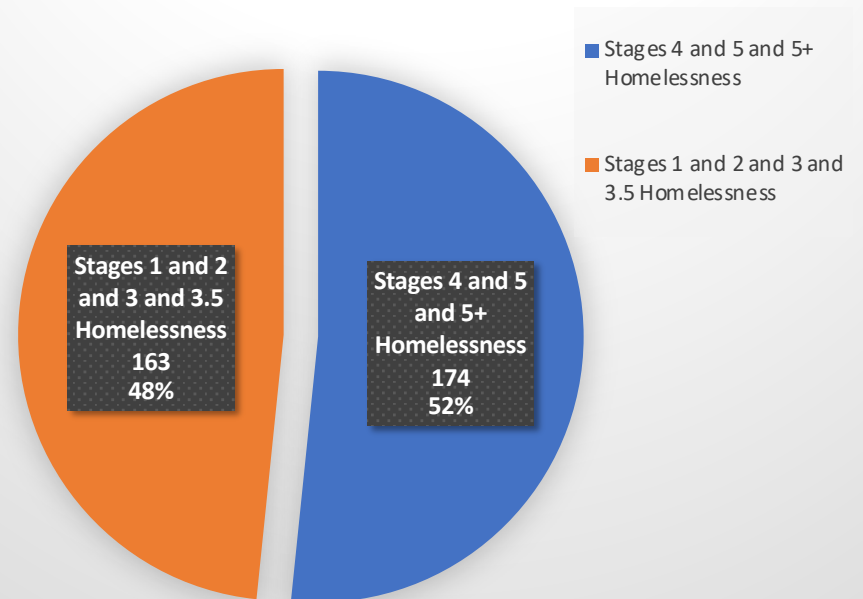

Summary

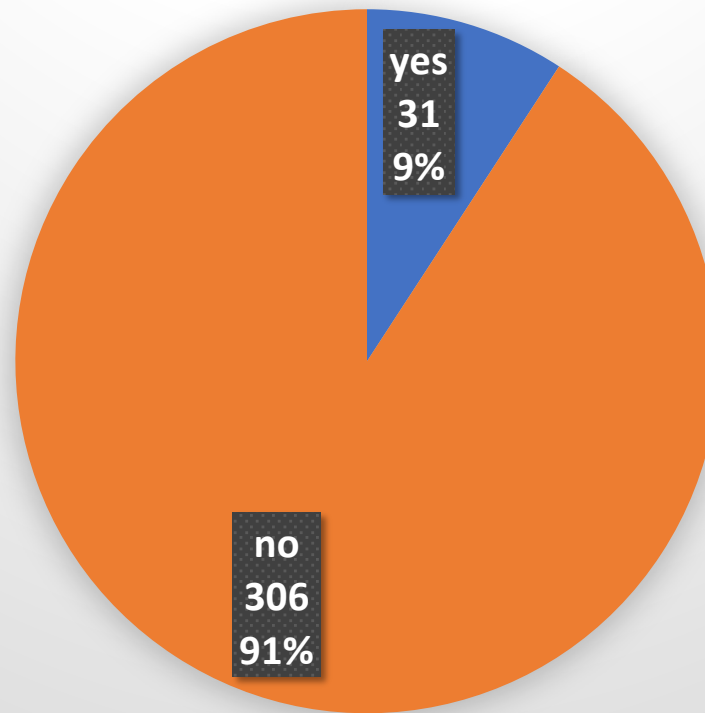
- The total individuals at stages 4 + 5 + 5+ = 174
- These individuals are at significant risk
- These individuals include:
 - Men in the medical wing
 - Women in the women's section with medical issues
 - Individuals who use a wheelchair or walker
 - Individuals who are unable to care for Activities of Daily Living (ADLs)
 - Individuals with active mental illness
 - Individuals with active addiction
 - Individuals with significant medical issues

(number of Individuals)**

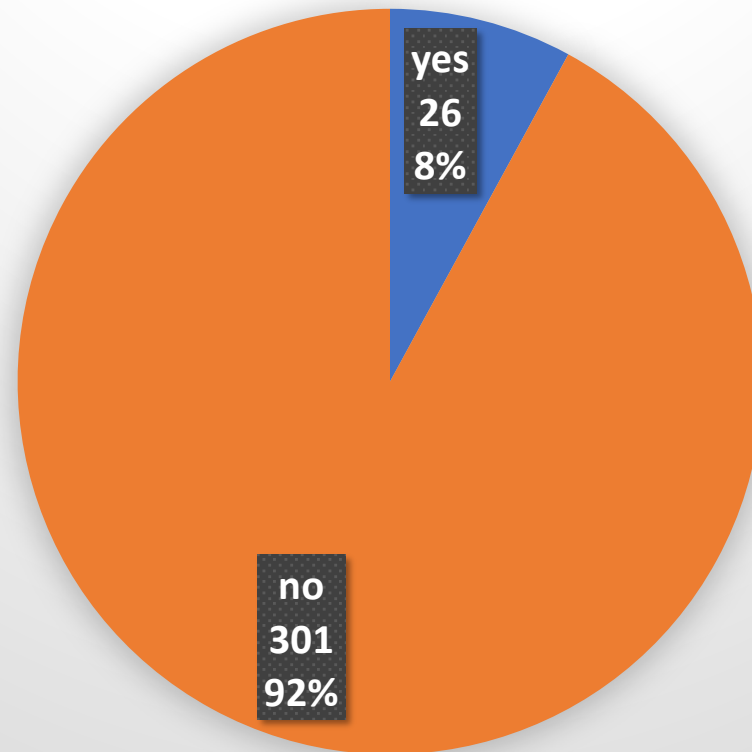


Staying in the Medical Hubs (men only)

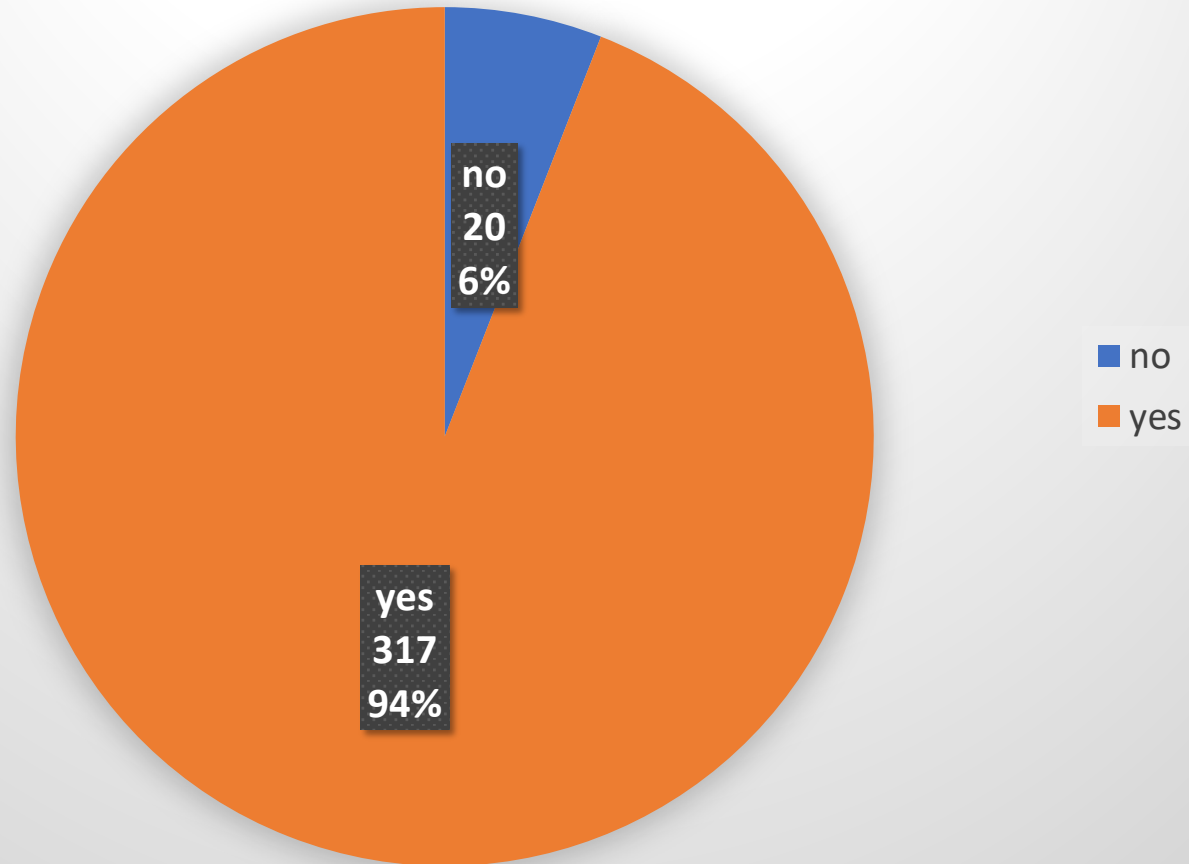
Note: Women live in separate section which includes medically fragile



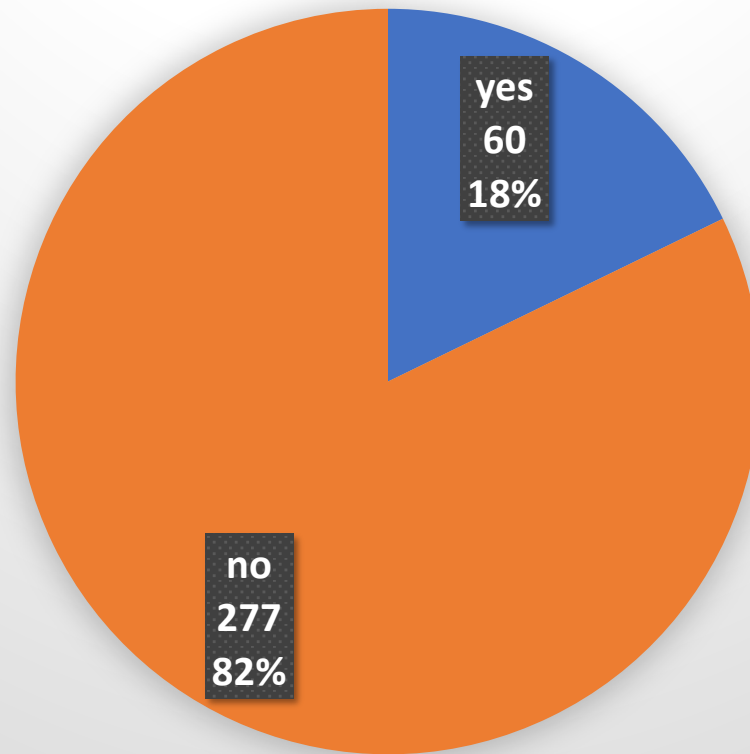
Wheelchair or Walker (women and men)



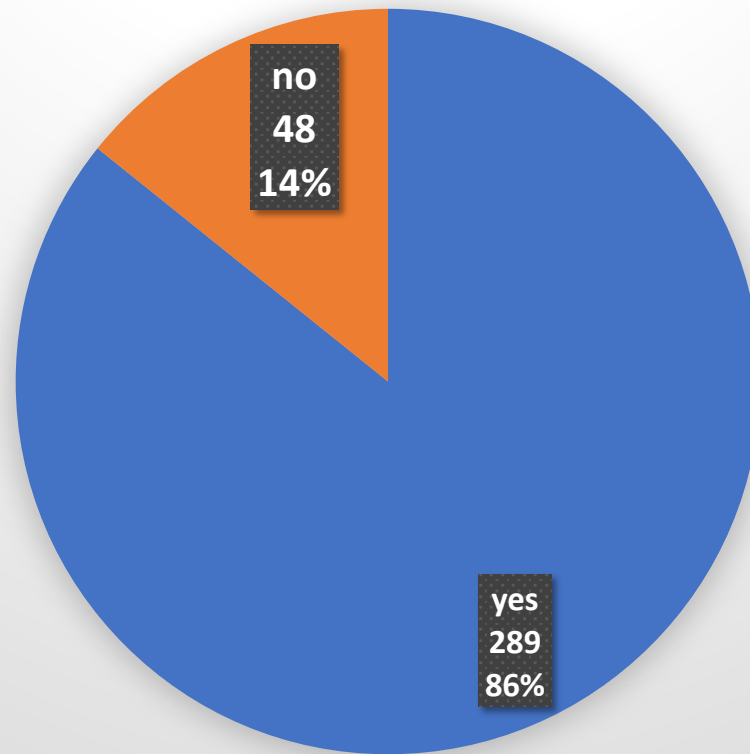
Able to Care for Activities of Daily Living



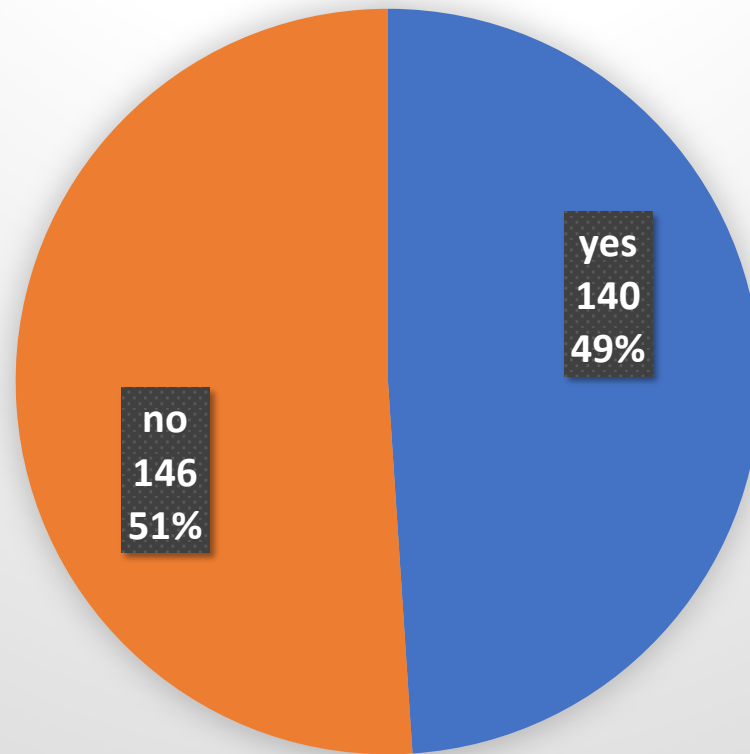
Active Severe Mental Illness



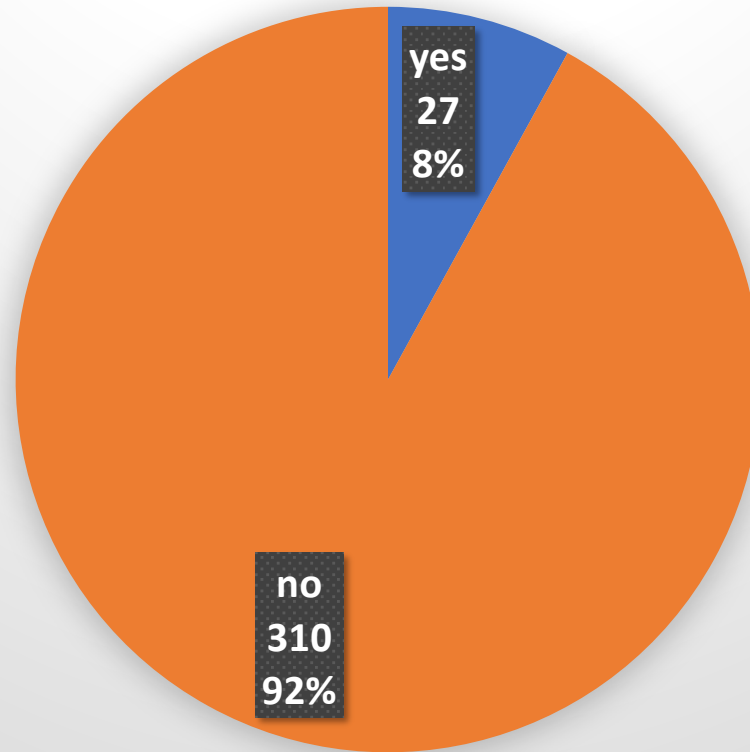
Substance Use Disorders



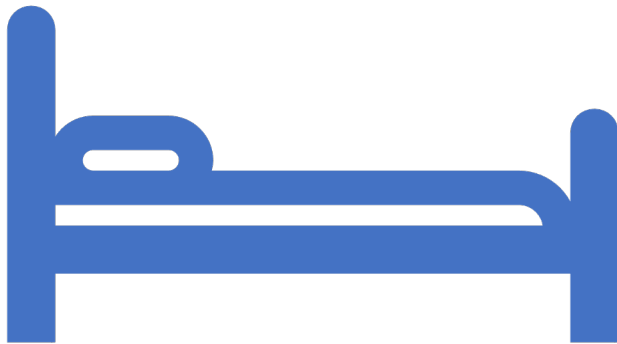

Summary



- Sullivan Arena low barrier shelter is scheduled to close 4/30.
- There are currently about 350 guests staying each night at the Sullivan.
- There are up to 100 people in the warming area each night.
- This quick assessment indicates that there are about 174 individuals that are at significant risk when Sullivan closes.
- Consider keeping Sullivan open until 5/31 for up to 190 guests.
- Immediately start step down process at Sullivan.
- A long-term low barrier shelter plan must be formed ASAP.
