Schools breakfast and hot lunch

- We got in contact with Bestie Wild the founder for Dare to Care Program. That helps pay for students Breakfast and Lunch. For families who didn't qualify for free and reduced lunch who make too much to get that program but not enough to make ends meet and pay for school food. Her Program helps provide over 20 children in that area.
- Nurses fighting against hunger Bestie Wild took over this program. With this program was able to go to food bank and get pre packed weekend meals for students to take home. The pre pack meals had milk, cereal, juice, peaches, applesauce, mini can beef stew and frank&beans.
