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Youth Risk Behavior Survey

The following tables and graphs report selected results of the 2009 Alaska Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) for the Anchorage School District (ASD) and the state of Alaska, and provide similar selected results from the 2007, 2005, and 1995 Anchorage YRBS reports.

The YRBS is part of an epidemiological surveillance system that was established in 1988 by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to help monitor the prevalence of behaviors that not only influence adolescent health, but also put youth at risk for the most significant health and social problems that can occur during adolescence and adulthood.

YRBS data is collected and analyzed by the Alaska Department of Health and Social Services, Section of Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion. The tables and graphs in this report are based upon information provided by the State.

The 2009 YRBS, like those in 2007 and 2005, was conducted with active parental consent. Parent permission forms were required before students could participate. Survey administrators at each high school worked diligently to collect permission slips and were specially trained to conduct the survey in a consistent and confidential manner. Following CDC protocol, each administrator was given a script to read to students that established guidelines for student privacy and anonymity and the importance of the survey. Each student was given an unmarked envelope in which to seal his or her survey before returning it. These survey envelopes remained sealed until received at a central state collection site. No individual identifiers were recorded on the surveys or sealed envelopes.

How the Data is Reported

This report takes the data provided by the Alaska Department of Health and organizes it so that trends in traditional high schools can be identified over time, so that the current ASD YRBS data can be compared between different school types, and so that the statewide average can be compared to the Anchorage School District.

Each section of tables and graphs generally focus on the combined responses to a question on the YRBS (the number of students who “strongly agree” combined with those who “agree”, for instance). The CDC, the Alaska Department of Health, and the Anchorage School District have routinely compiled and analyzed the responses to the YRBS in these categories.

School-Type Comparisons

There are three different school types surveyed for the ASD YRBS: Traditional, Alternative, and McLaughlin. A list of the schools, number of students surveyed, and response rates can be found in the table “2009 Response Rates.”

Valid Responses

Analysis included performance of extensive edit checks to identify survey inconsistencies. When inconsistencies were found, responses were excluded from the analysis. For example, if a student reported in one question having never been in a physical fight, but then reported in another question being hurt in a physical fight, the data for that student were excluded for the two questions related to physical fighting. These inconsistencies were rare.

Weighted Data

Weighted data means that the results are adjusted to represent all students of that school type. For example, if the percentage after adjustment of cigarette smoking is 25% according to the ASD YRBS, then it is correct to assume that 25% of ASD traditional high school students smoke cigarettes.

Unweighted data means that the results represent only the students who participated in the survey. For example, if the percentage of cigarette smoking is 25% according to the ASD YRBS, then it is correct to assume that 25% of alternative school students who took the survey smoke cigarettes.

Eligible traditional high school classrooms in the Anchorage school district were randomly selected to participate in the YRBS.

The minimum target response rate in order to be able to generalize the results to the ASD high school student population (weighted data) is 60%. Sample size and response rates were as follows:

Data Not Collected

Sometimes the YRBS has questions added or removed. In these cases, data may not be available for comparison in previous or subsequent years.

Data Not Available

Sometimes data has been collected but not analyzed by the state, and therefore is not available for this report.

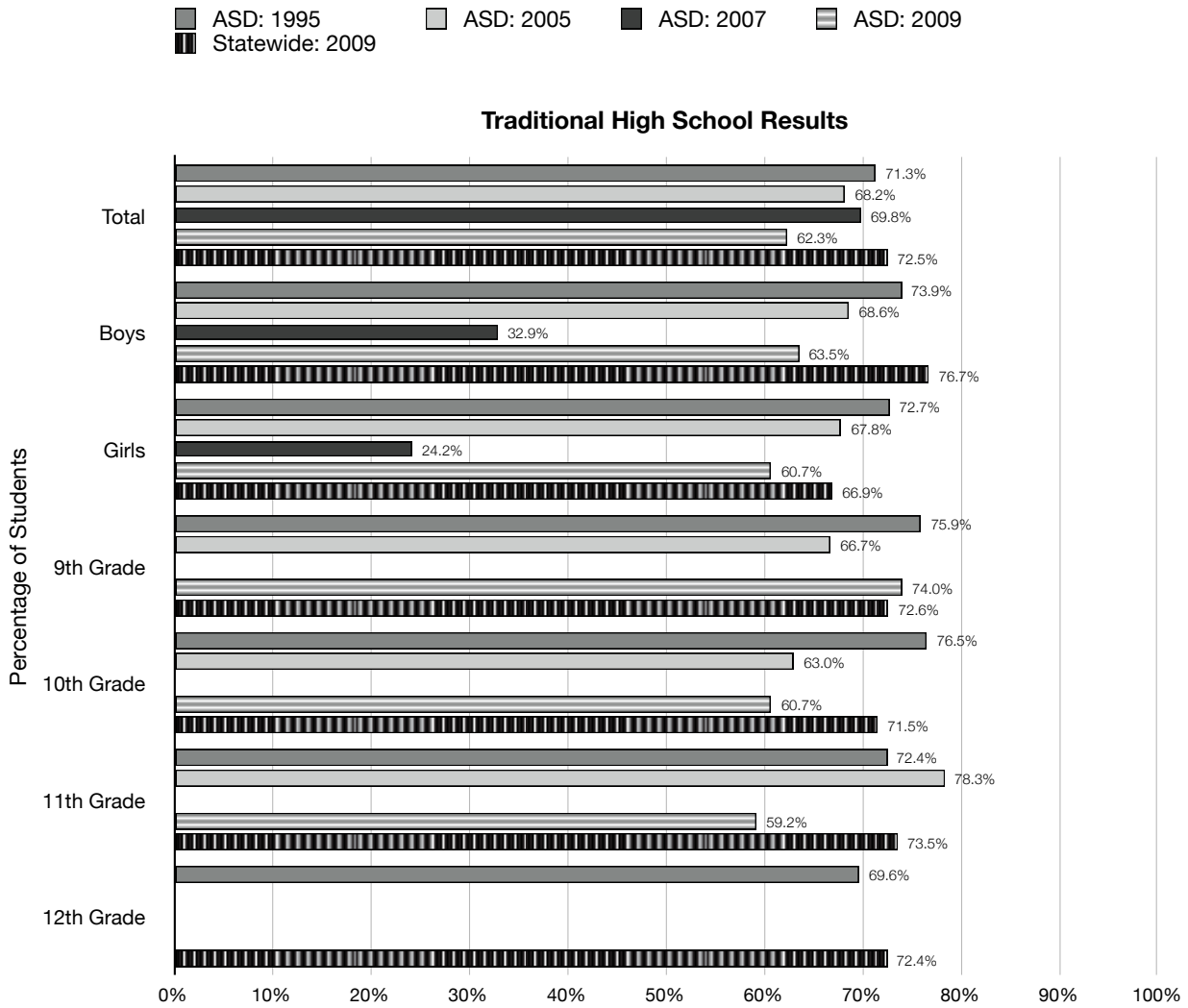

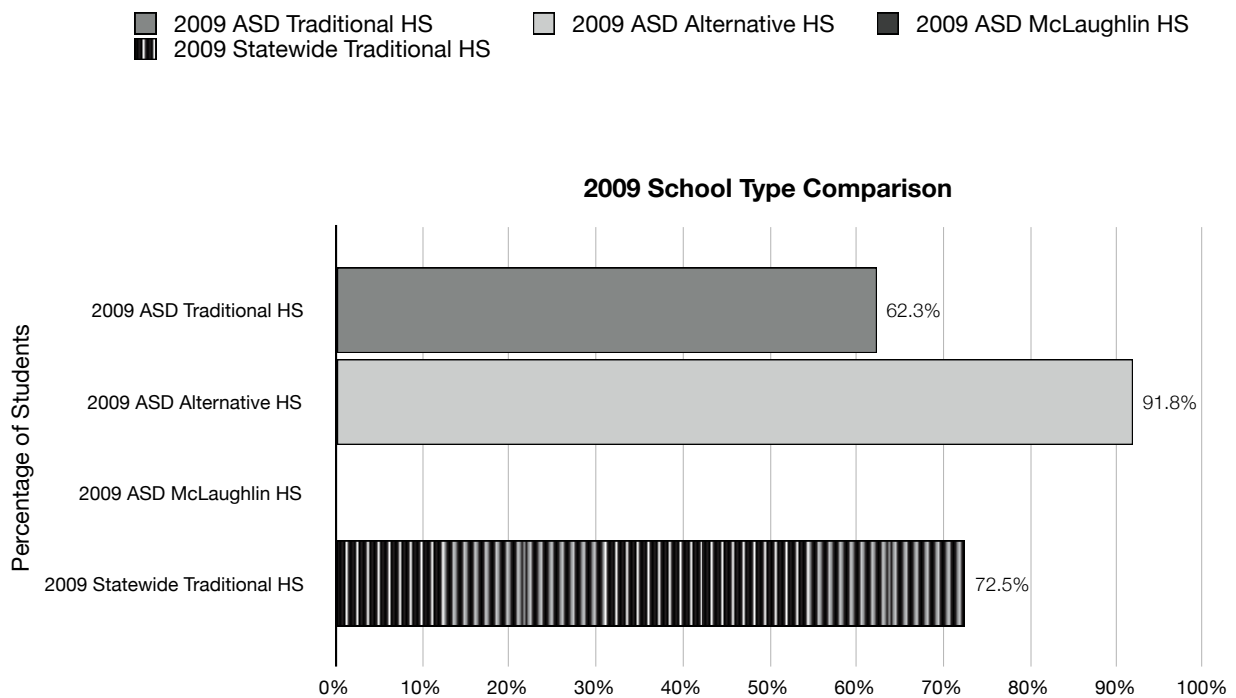
Question 9: When you rode a bicycle during the past 12 months, how often did you wear a helmet?

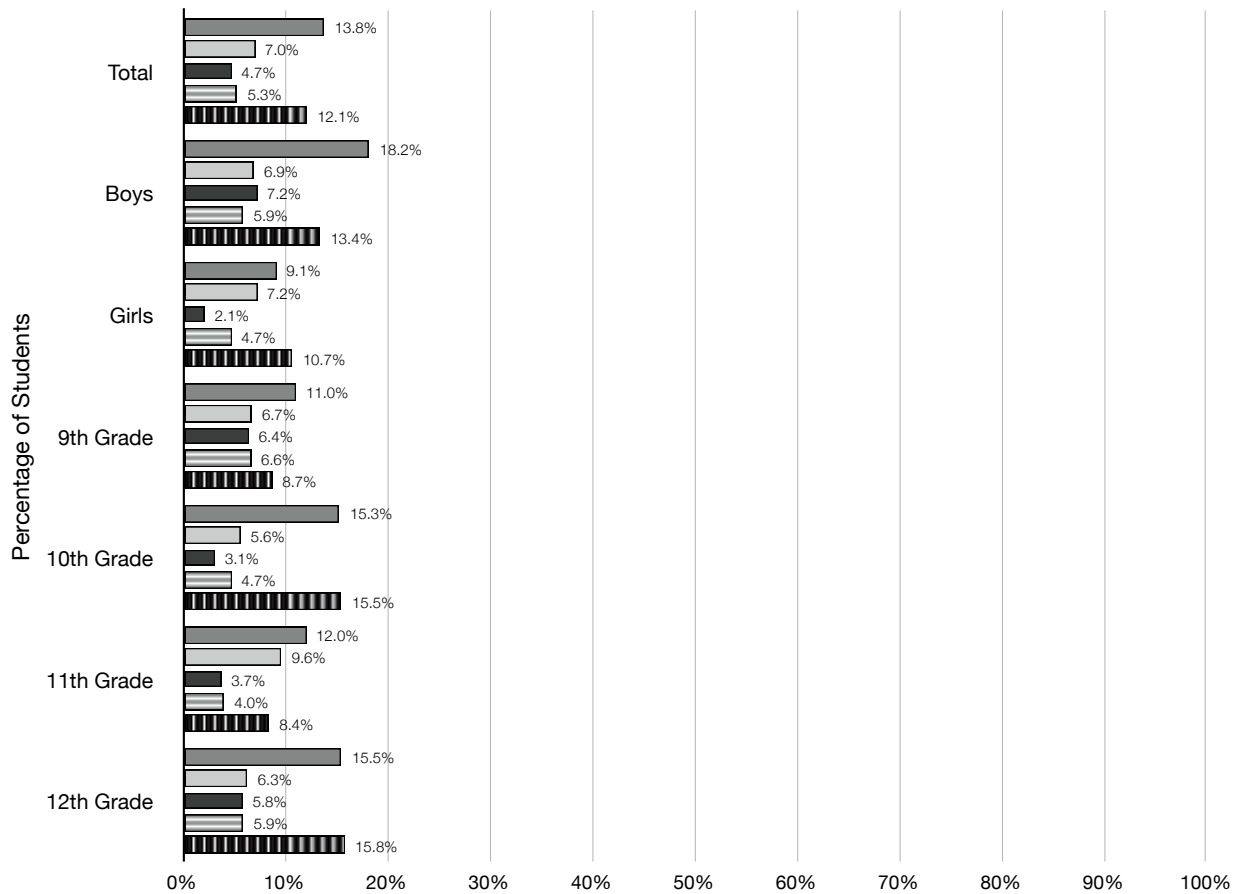

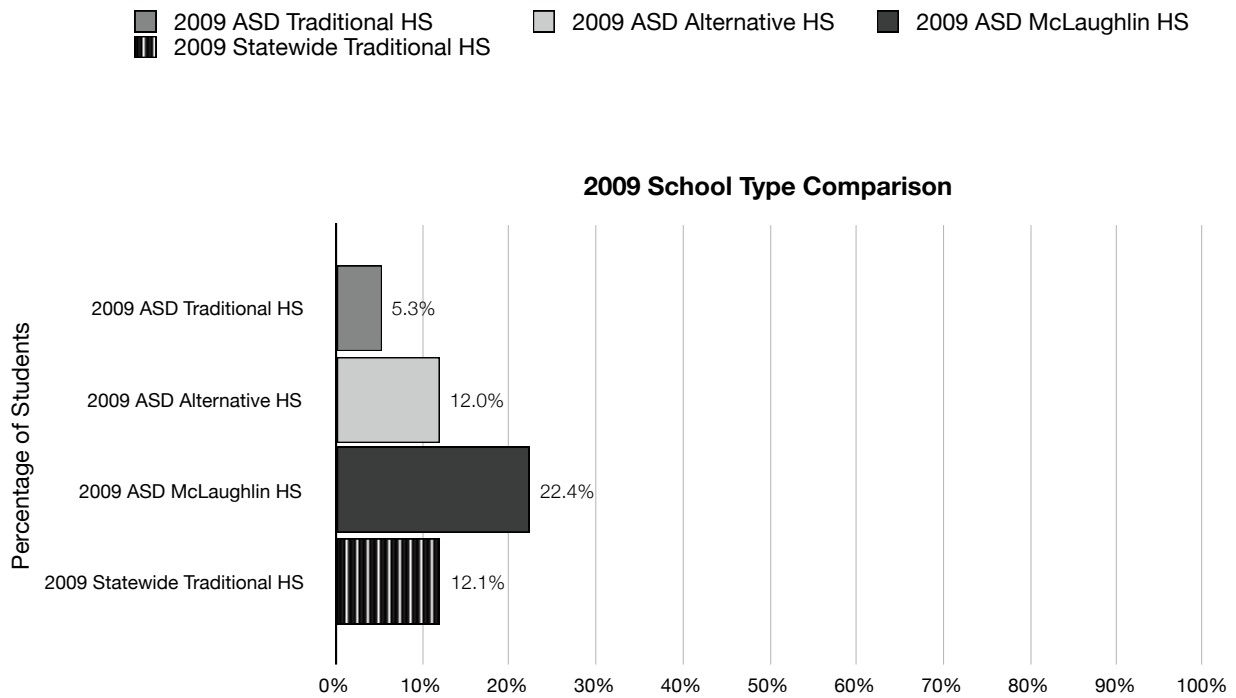

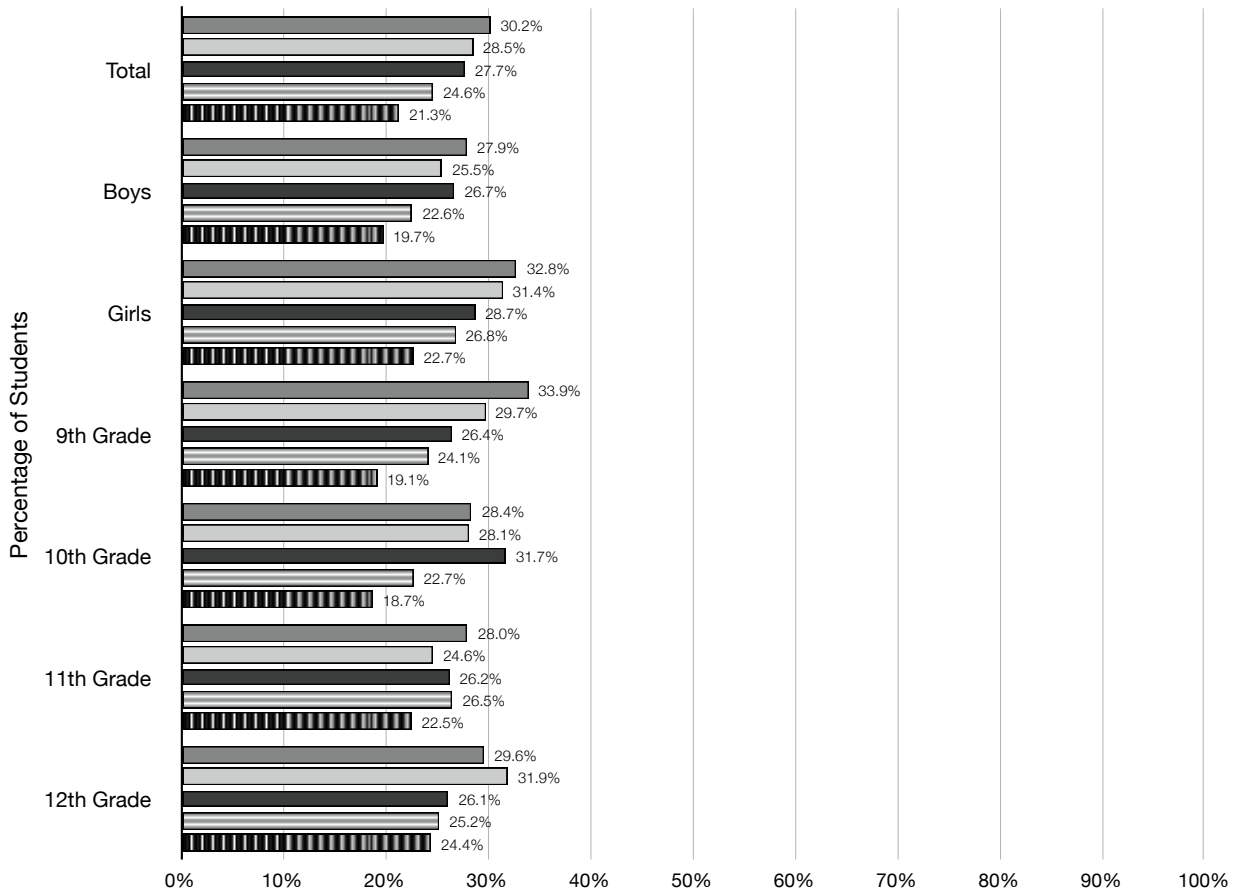

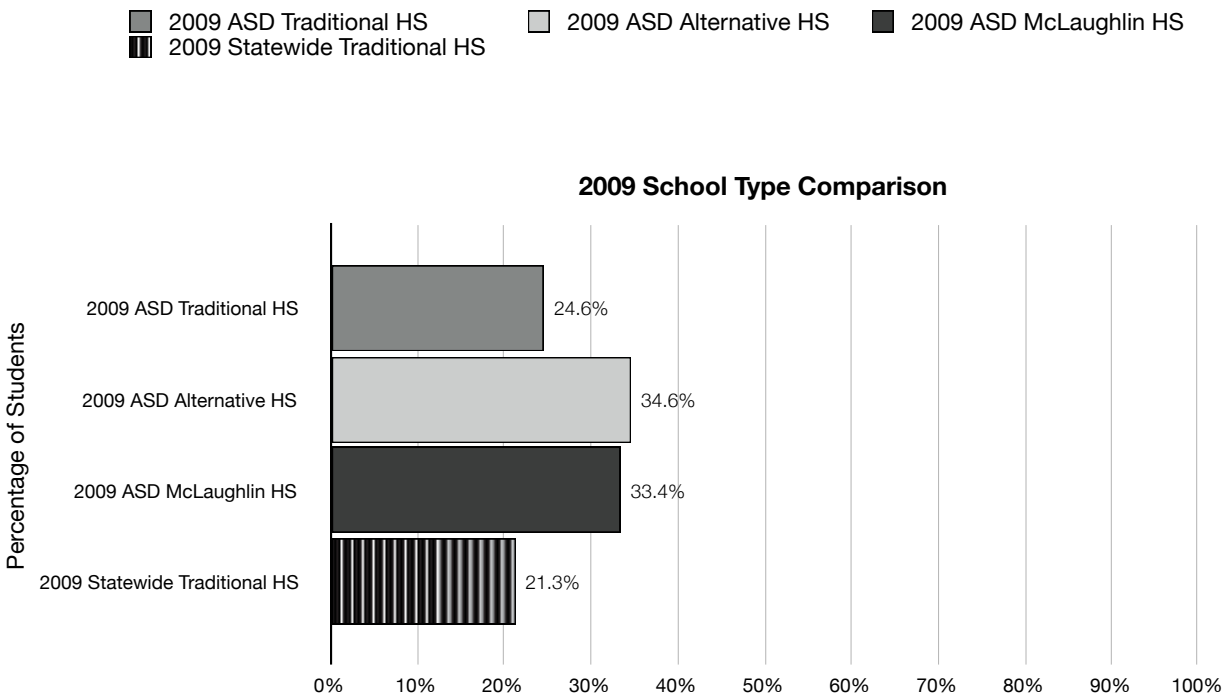

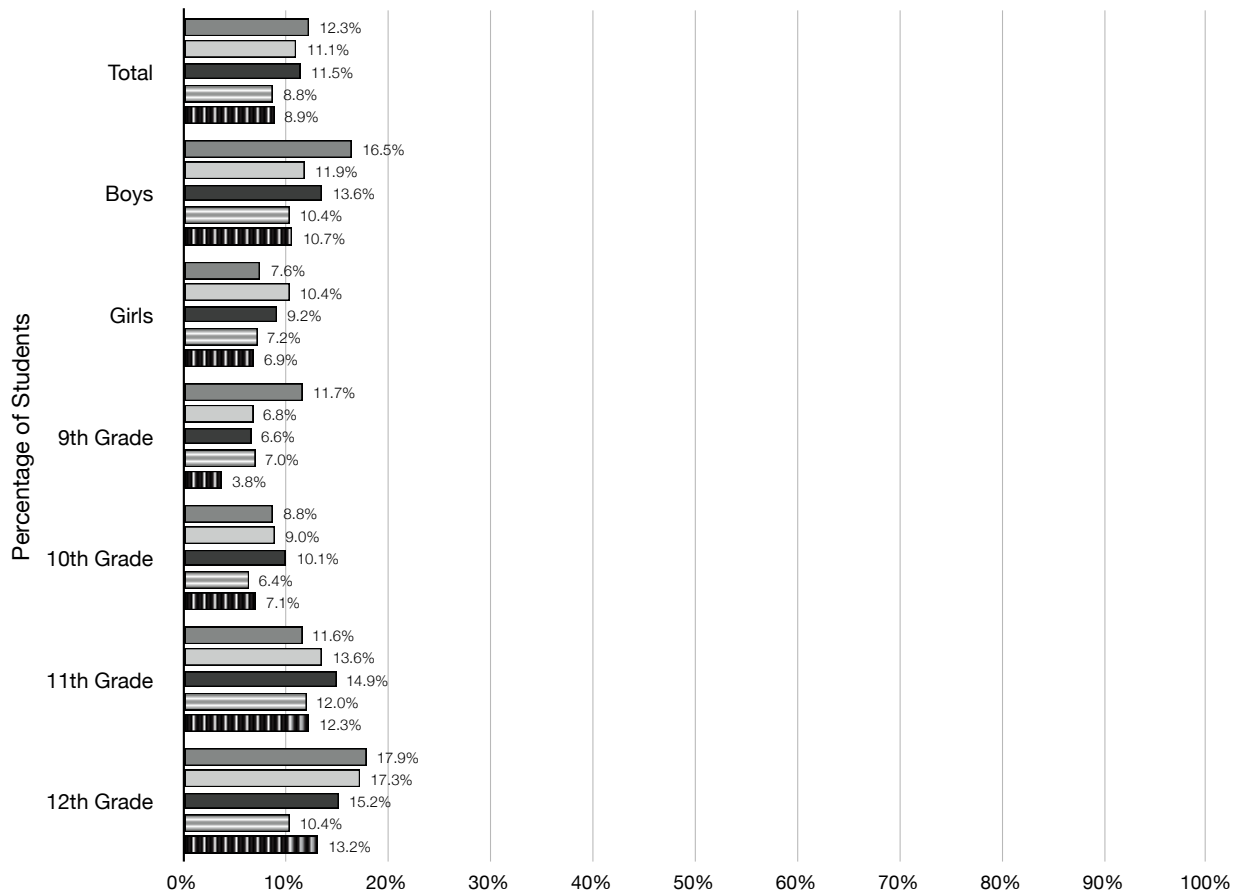

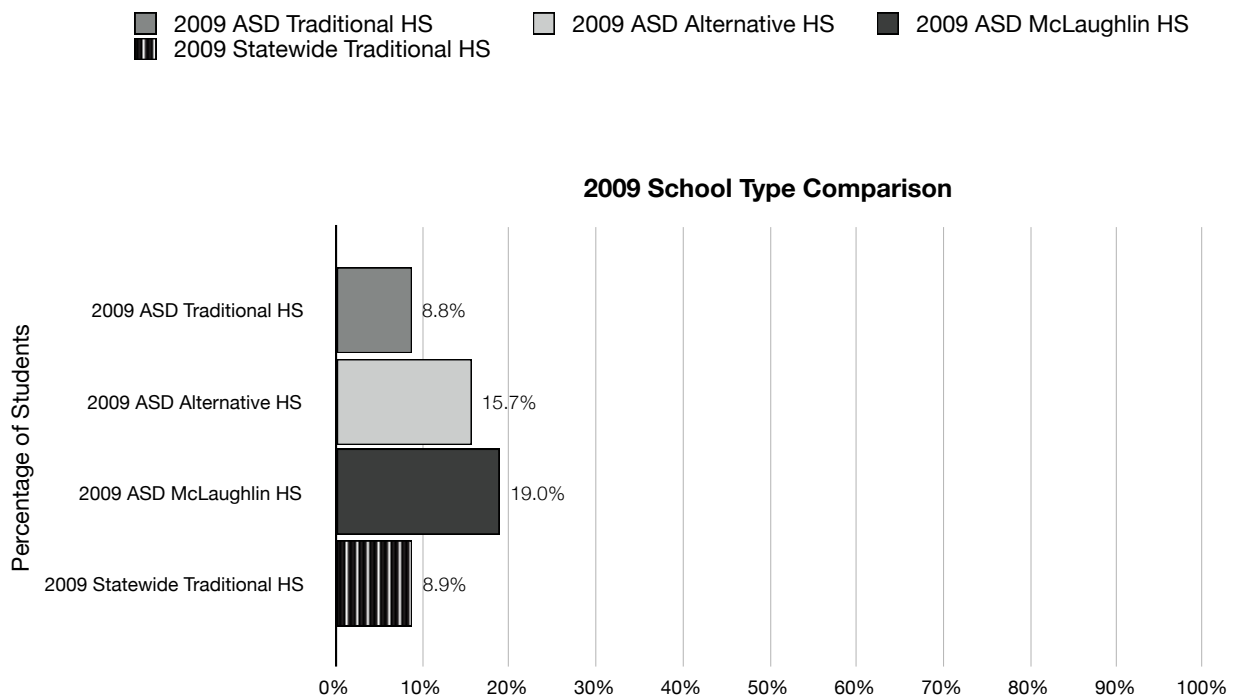

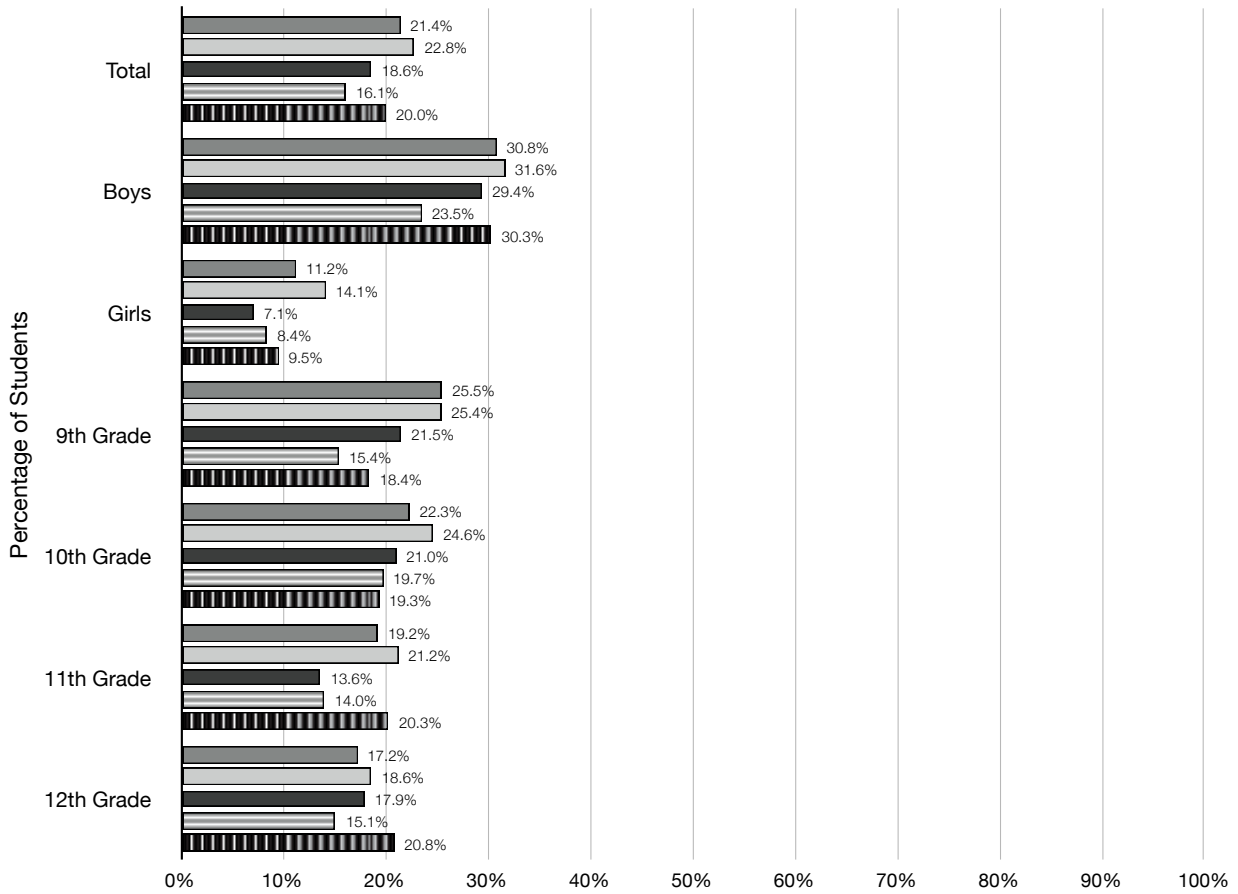

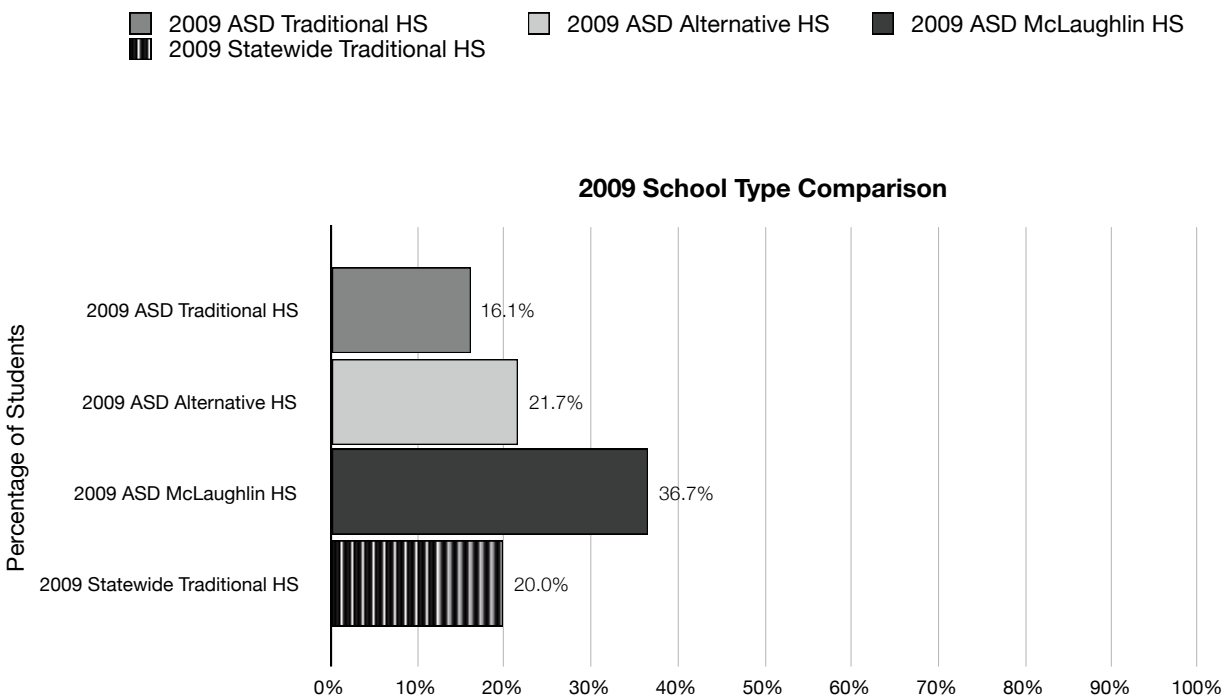

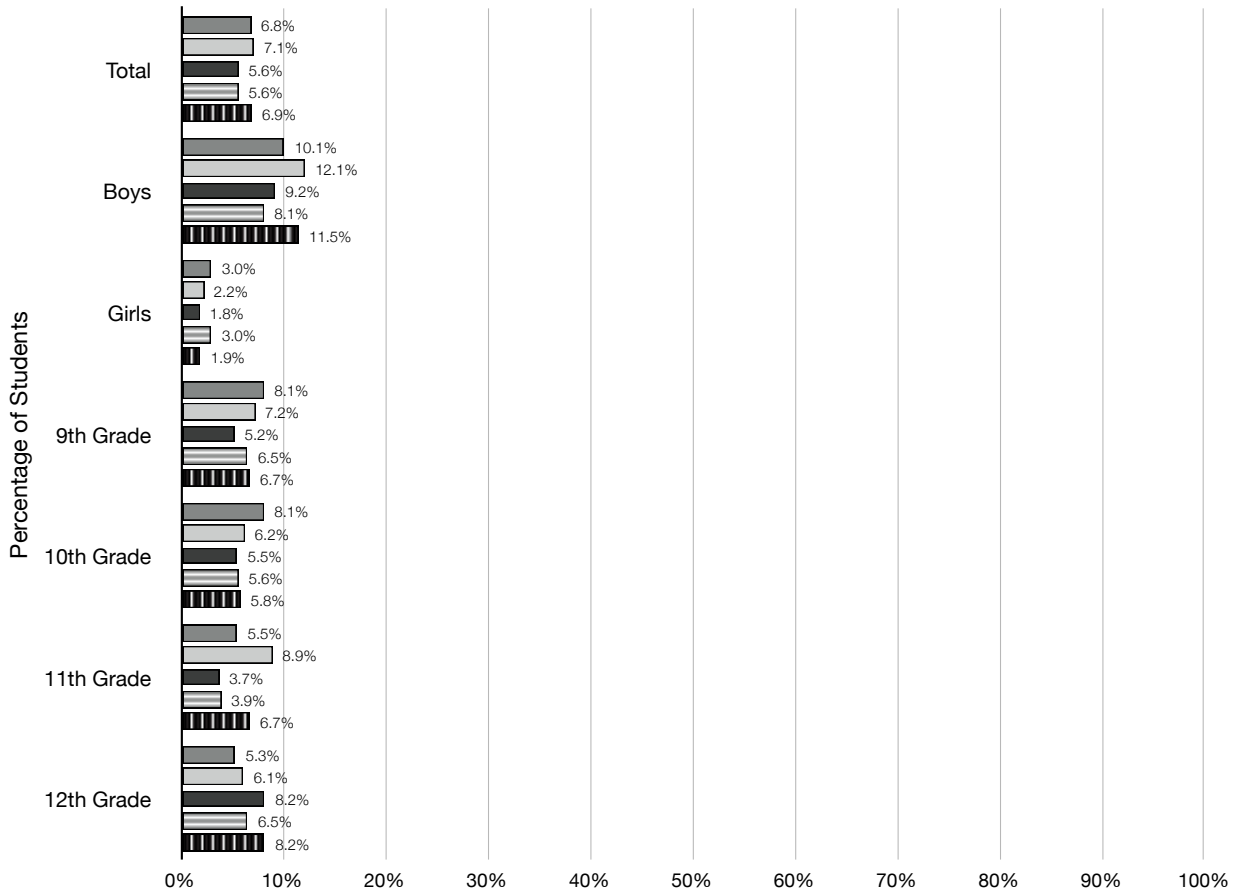

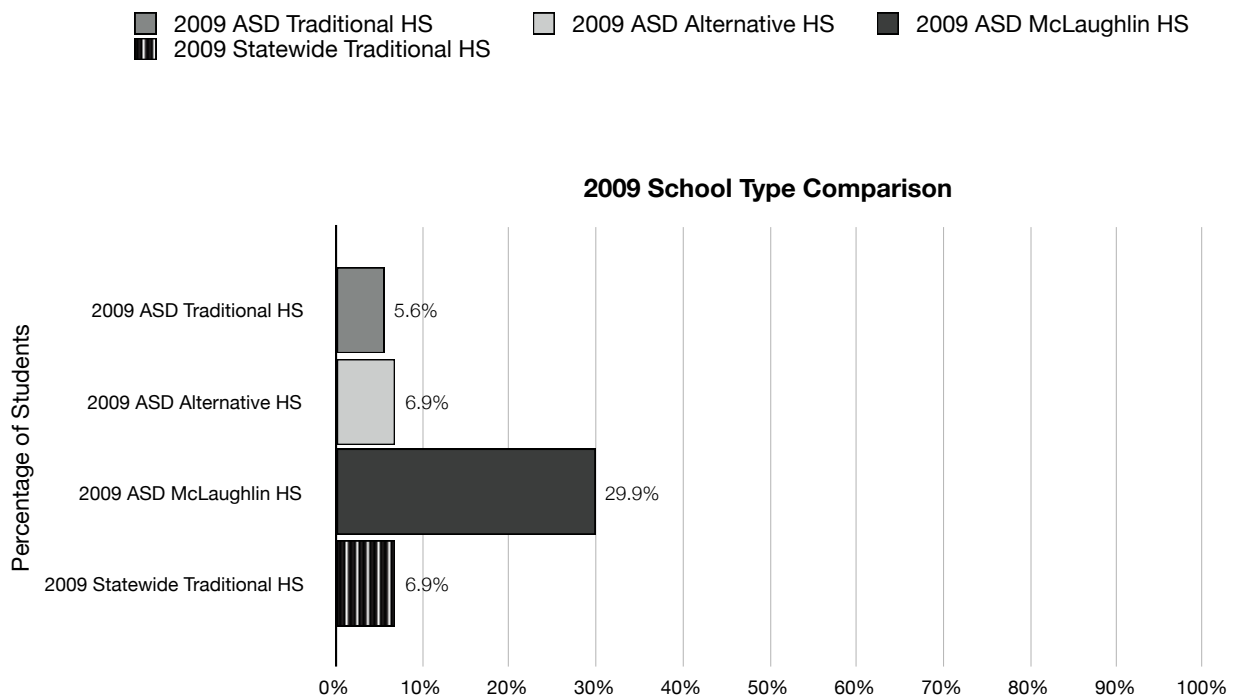

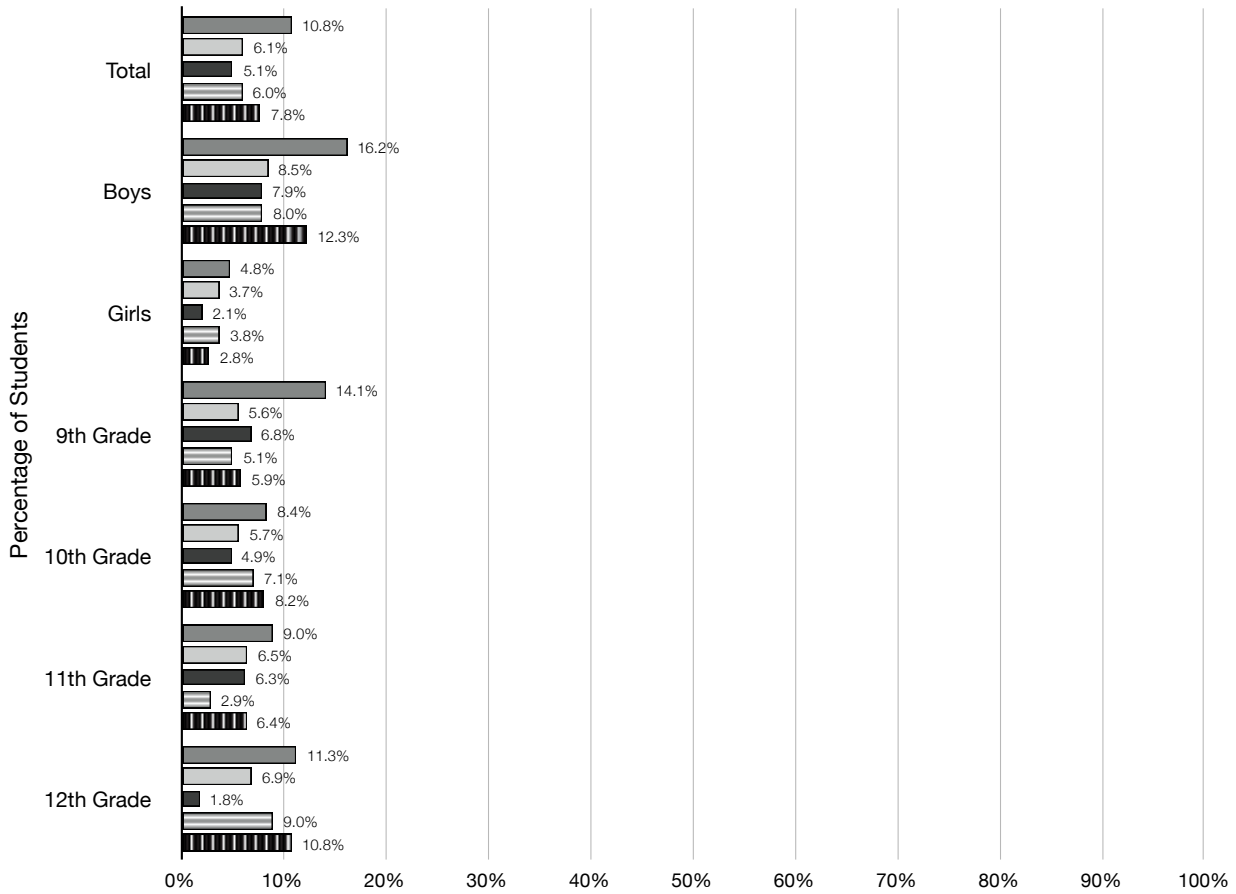

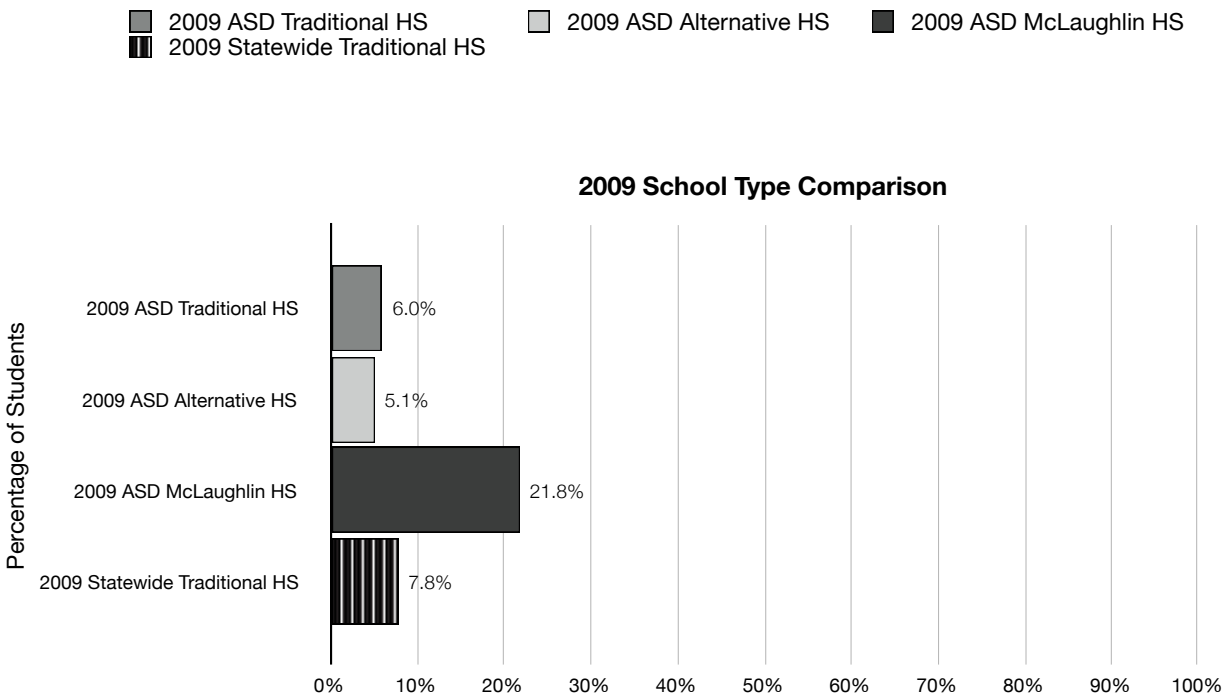

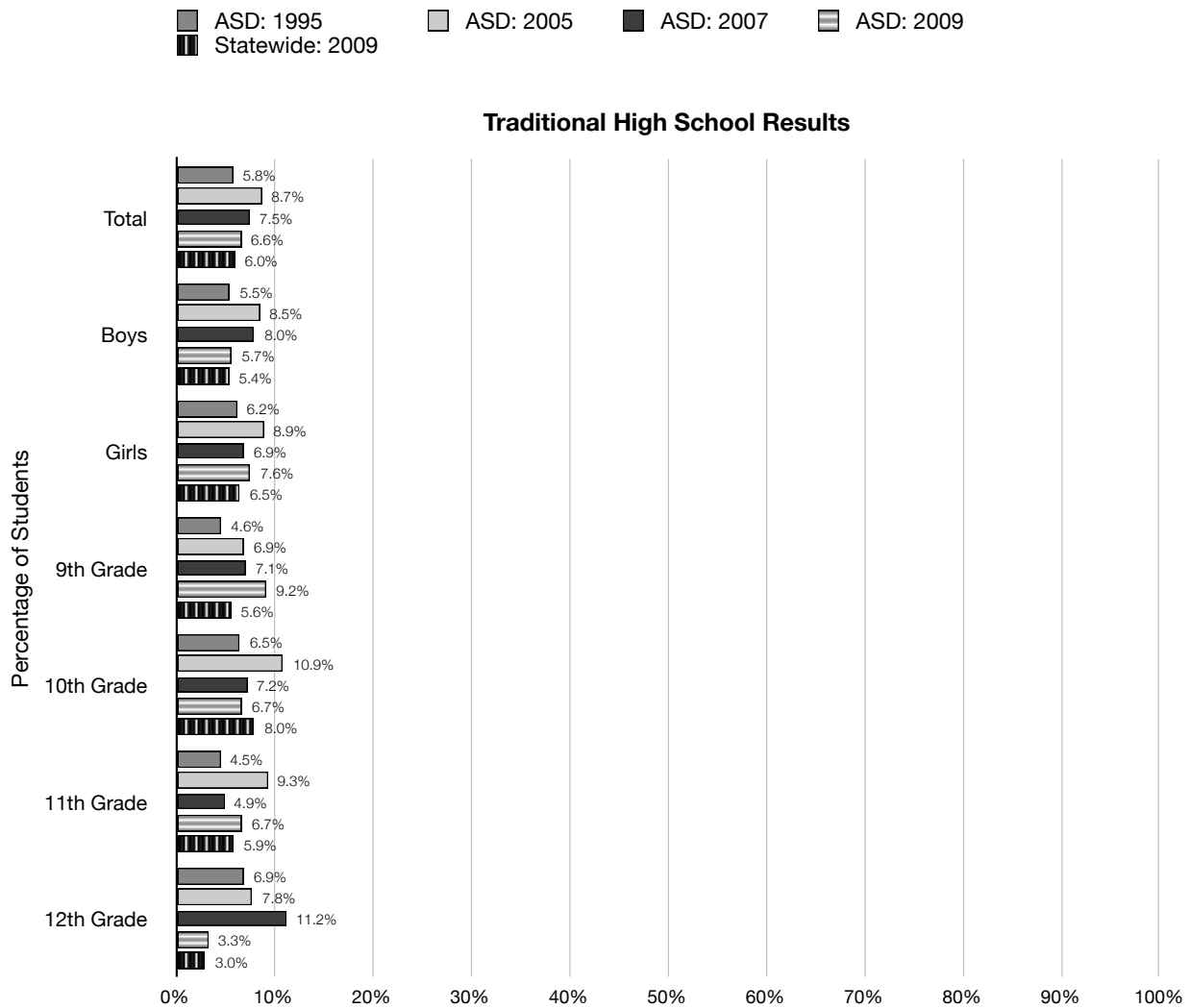

Percentage of students who did not go to school on one or more of the past 30 days because they felt unsafe at school or on their way to or from school

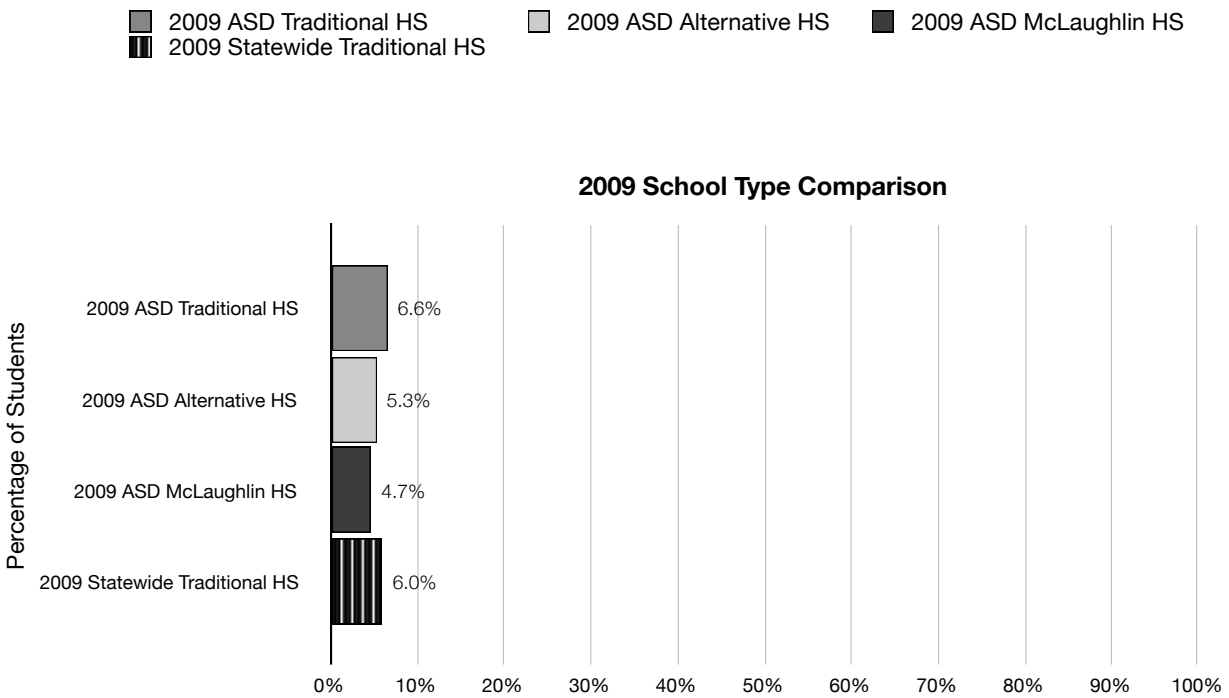
Question 16: During the past 30 days, on how many days did you not go to school because you felt you would be unsafe at school or on your way to or from school?

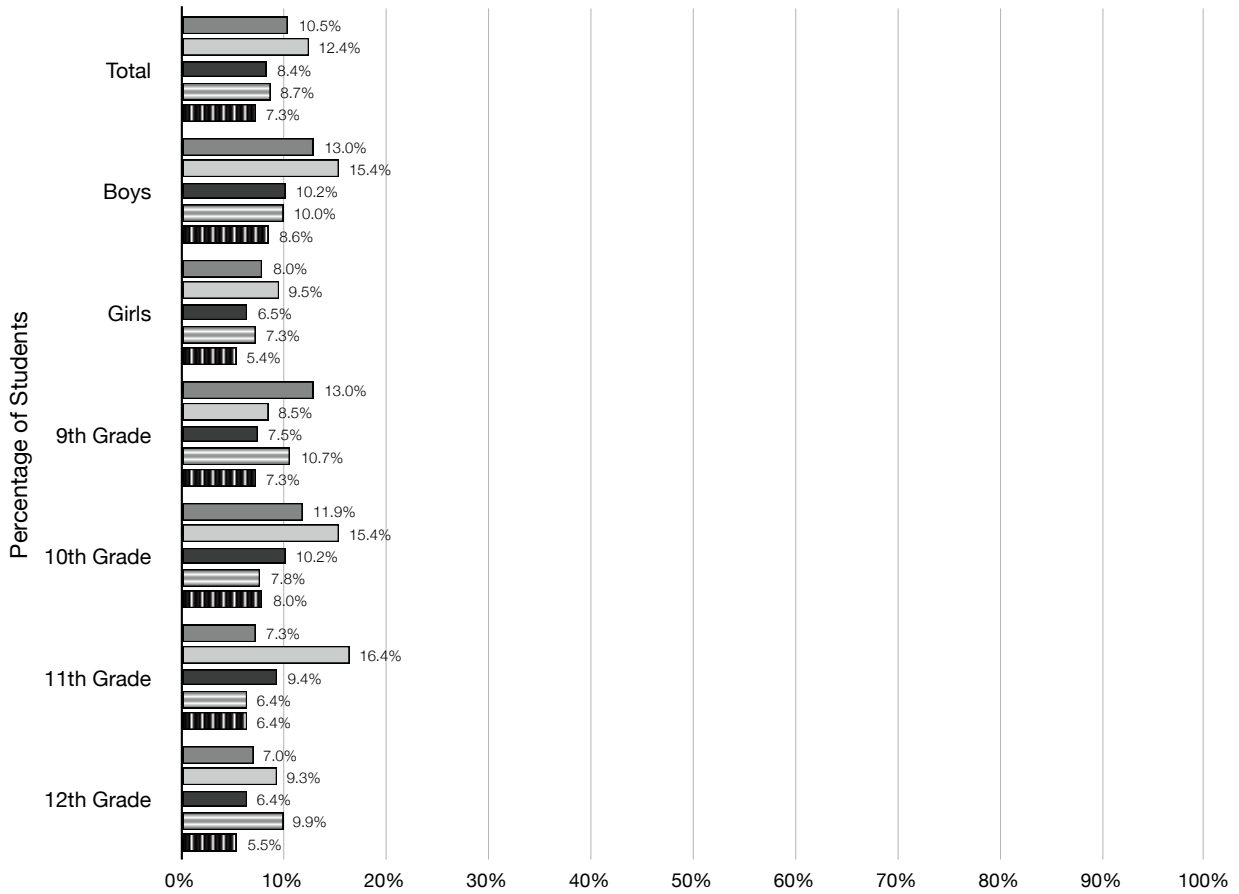

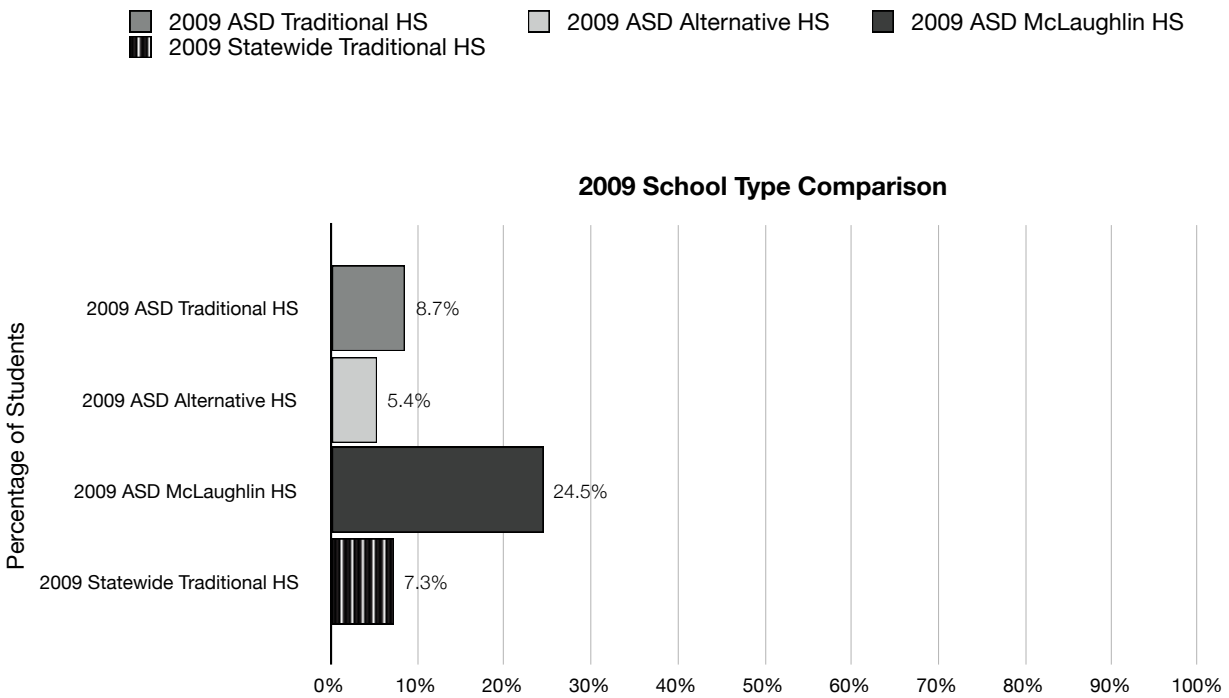

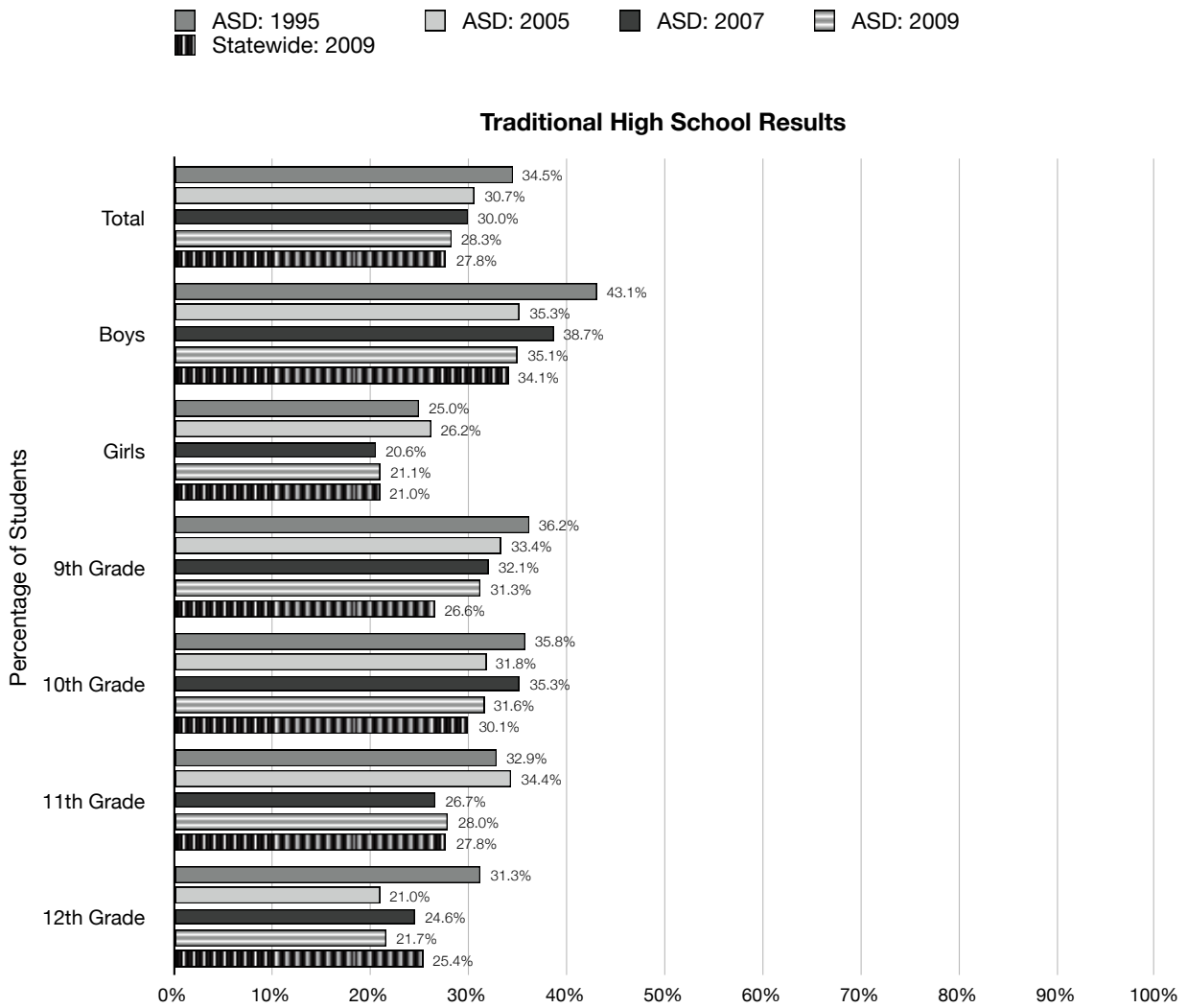

Percentage of students who were in a physical fight one or more times during the past 12 months

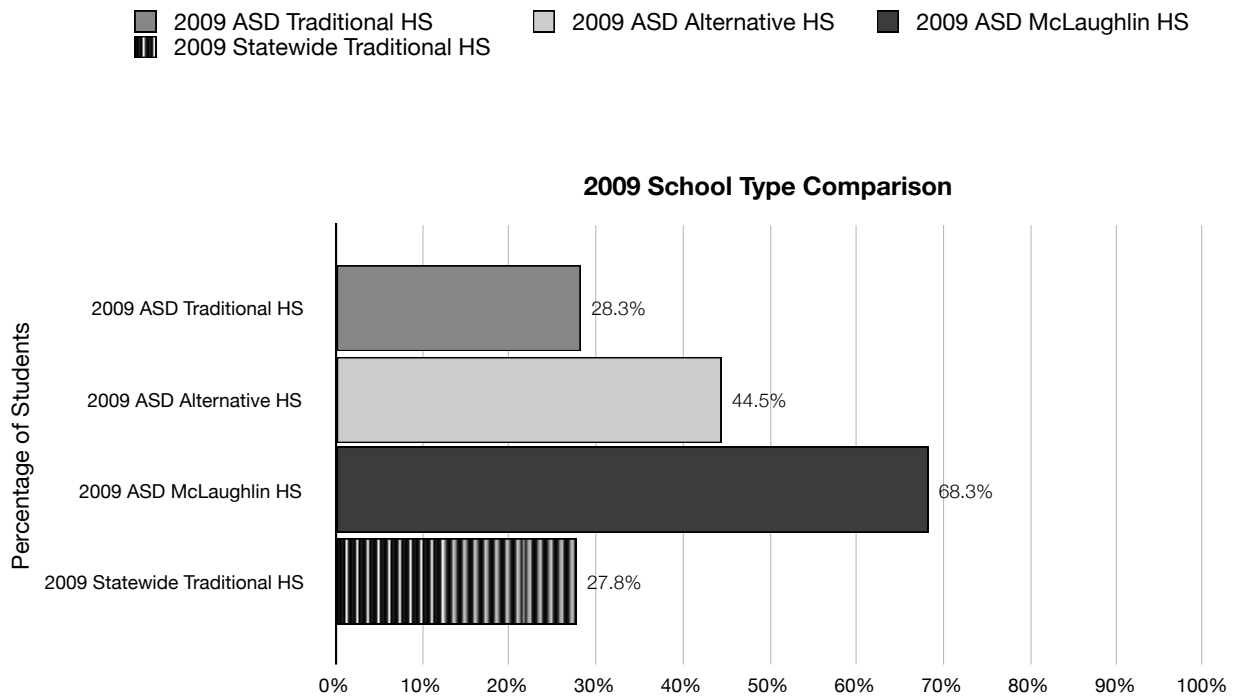
Question 18: During the past 12 months, how many times were you in a physical fight?

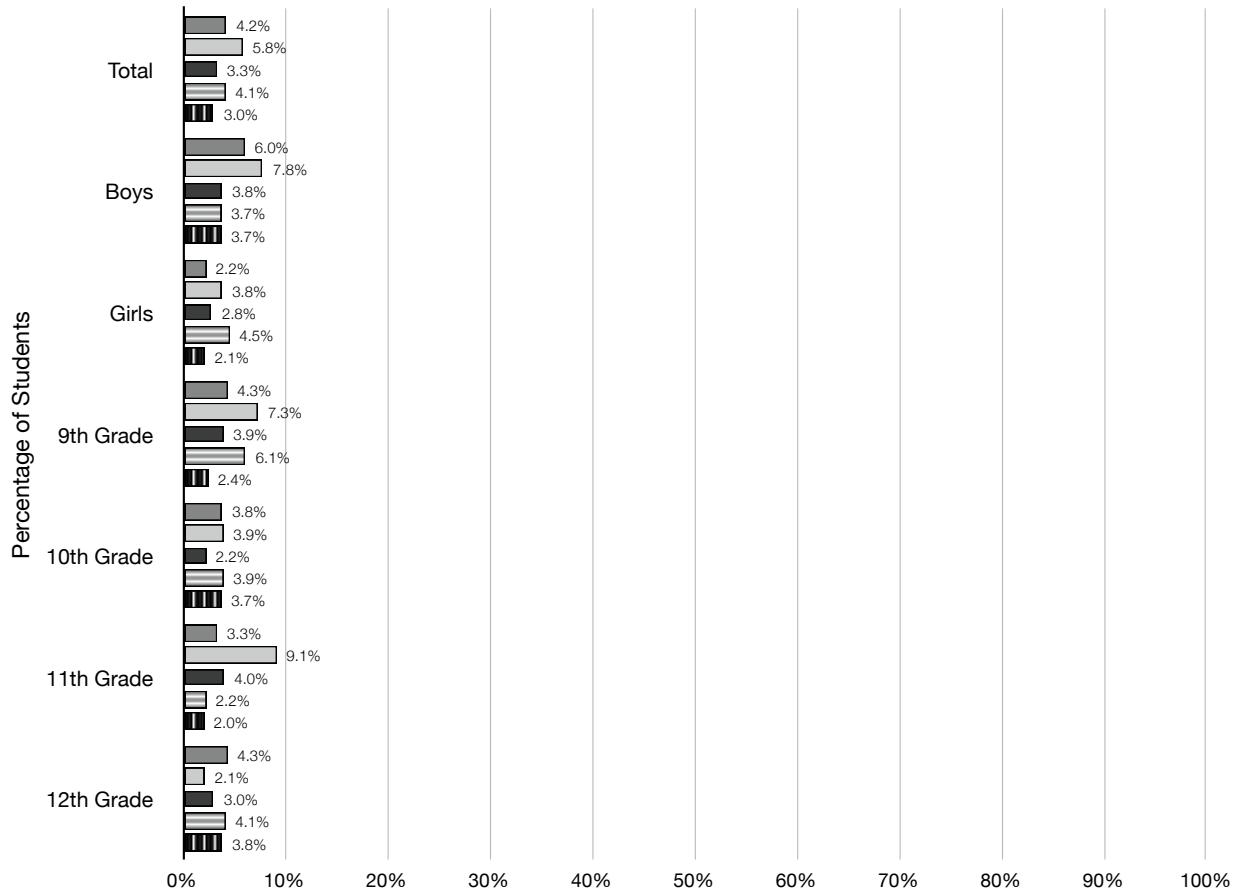

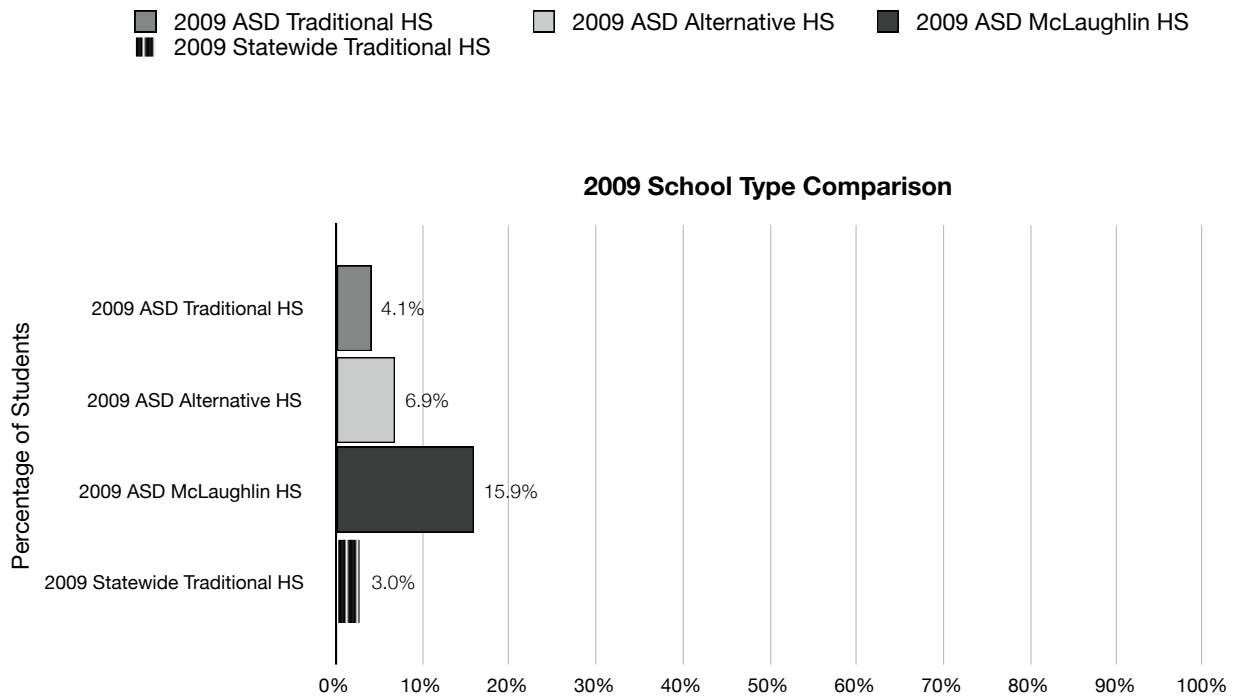

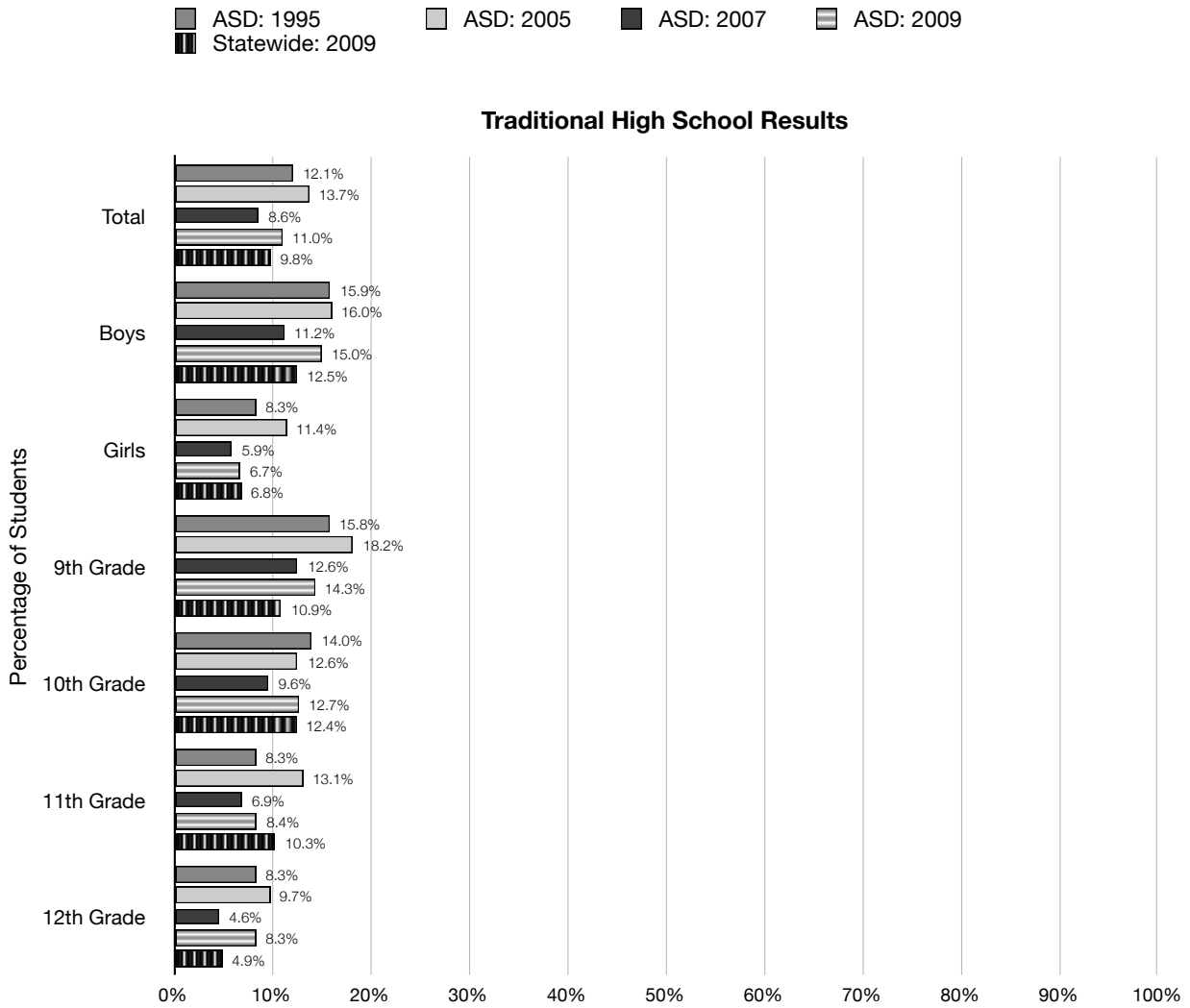

Percentage of students who were in a physical fight on school property one or more times during the past 12 months

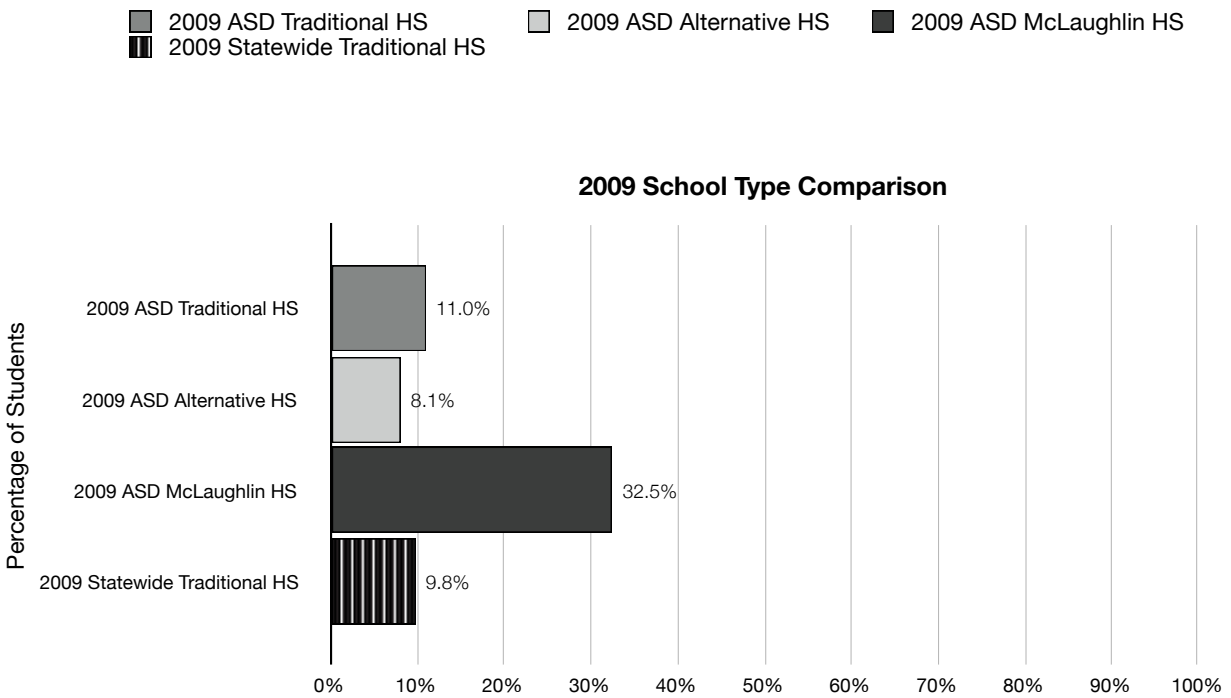
Question 20: During the past 12 months, how many times were you in a physical fight on school property?

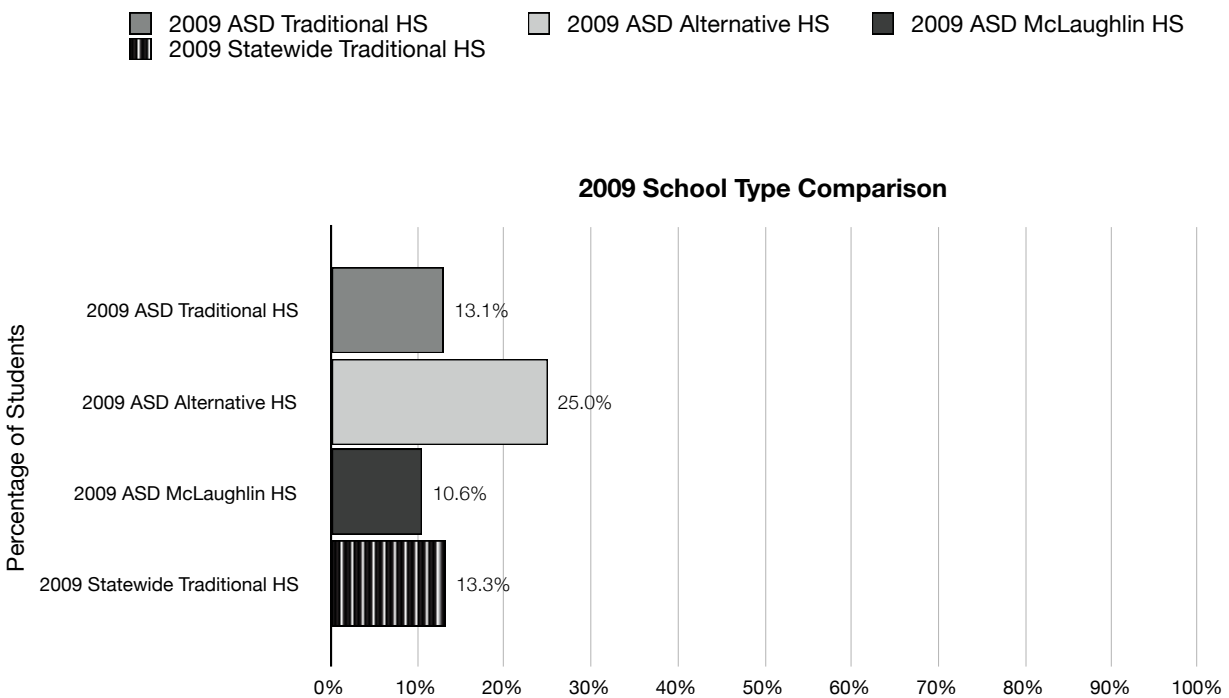

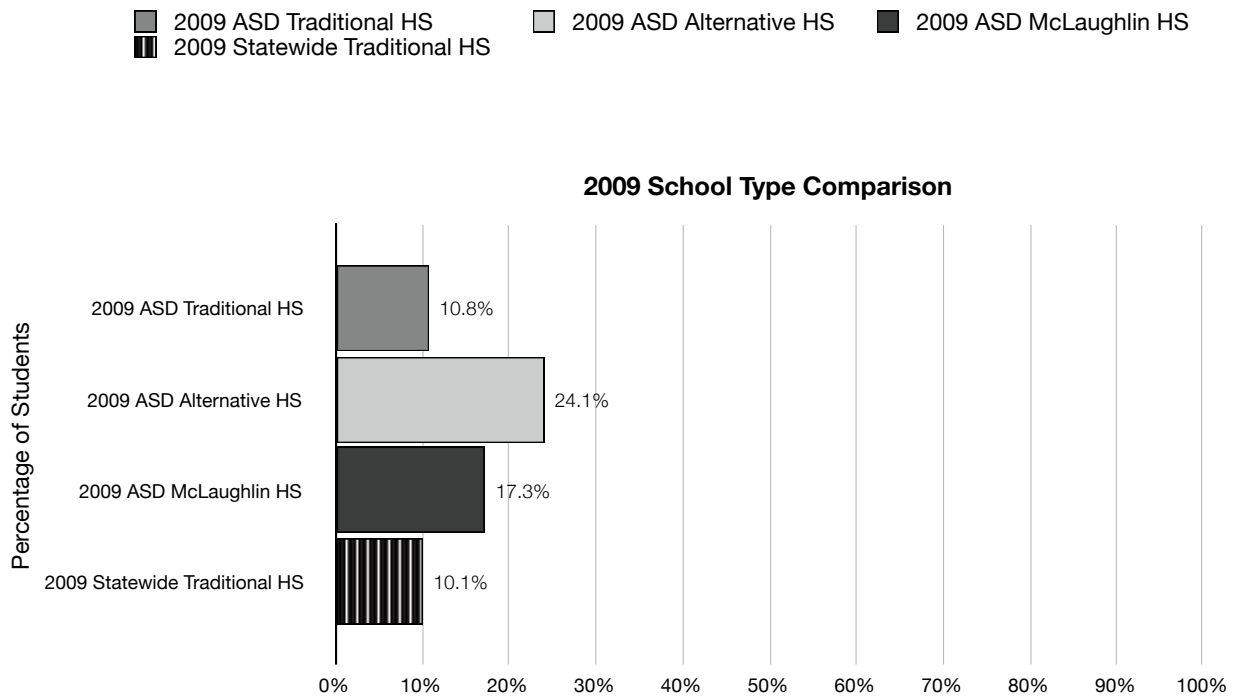

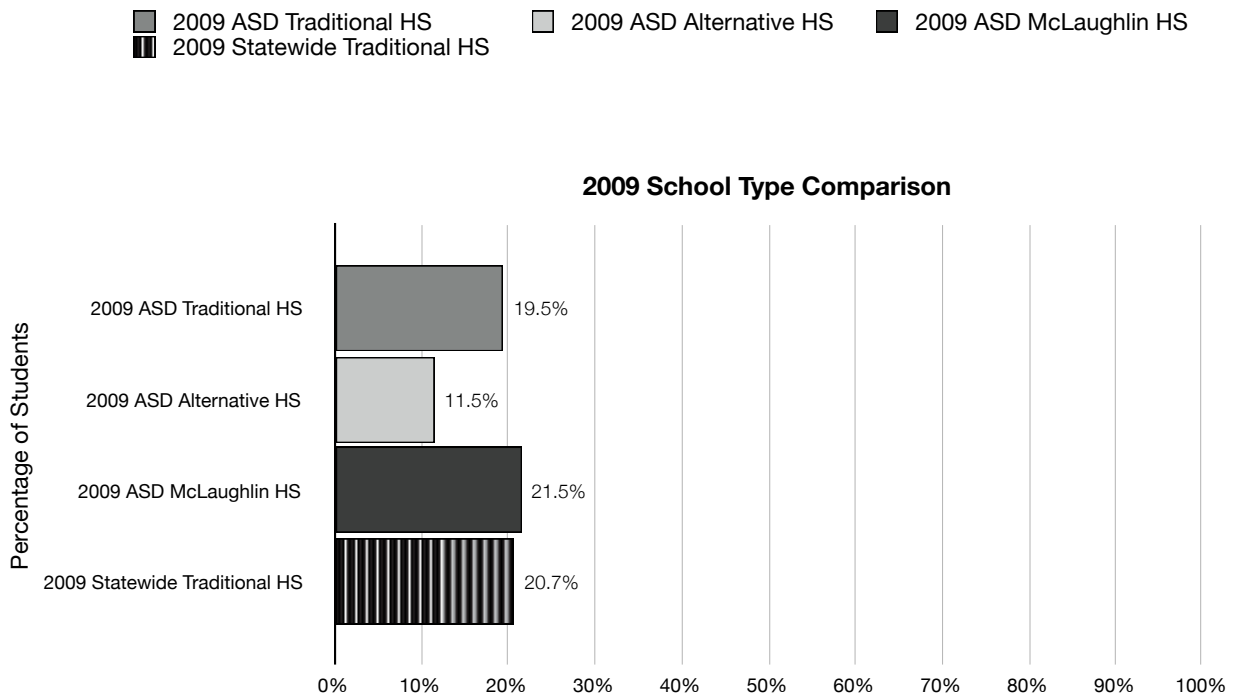

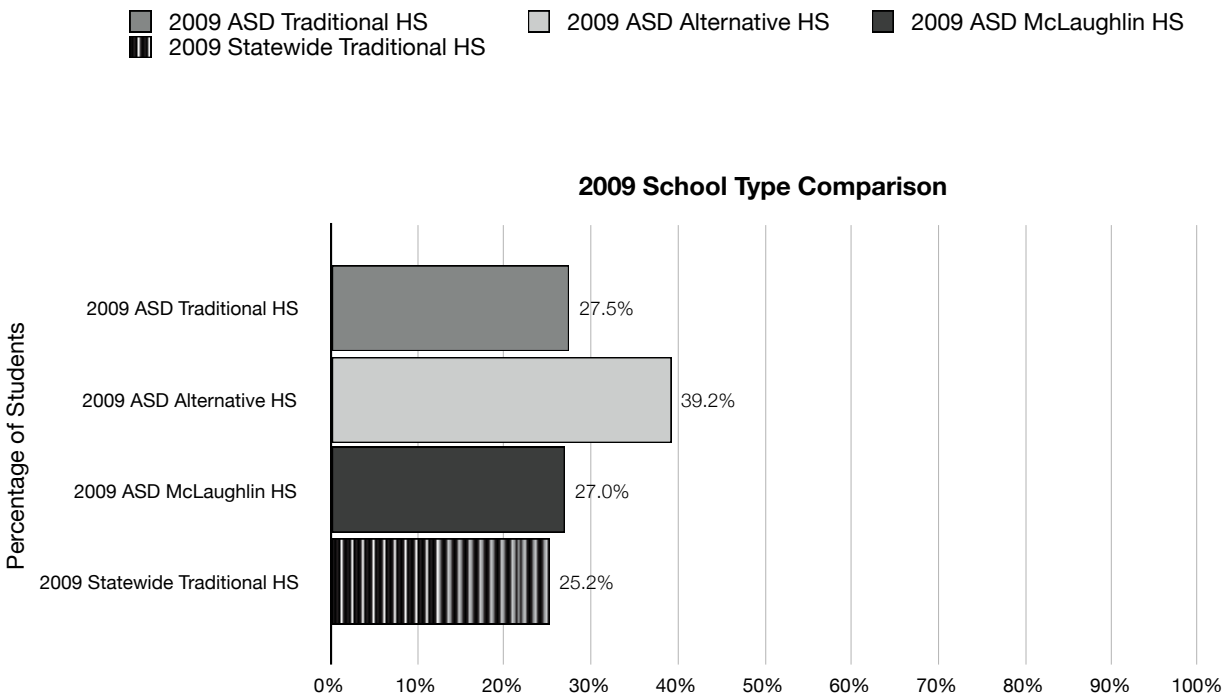

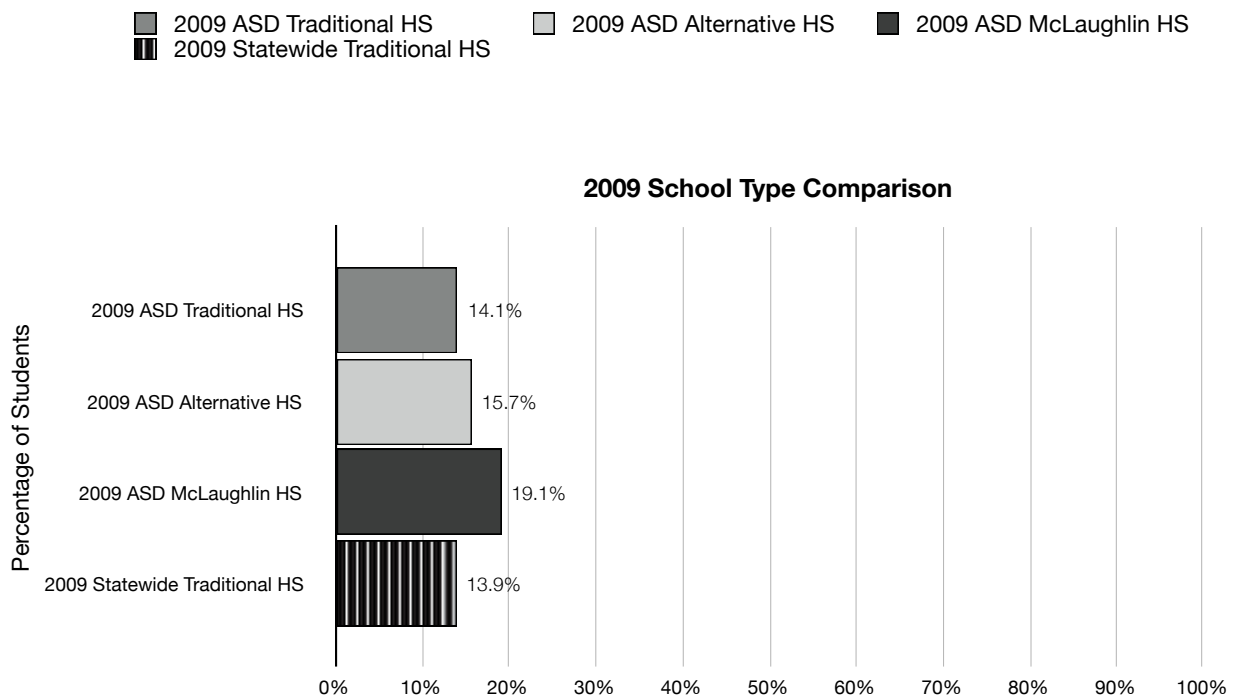

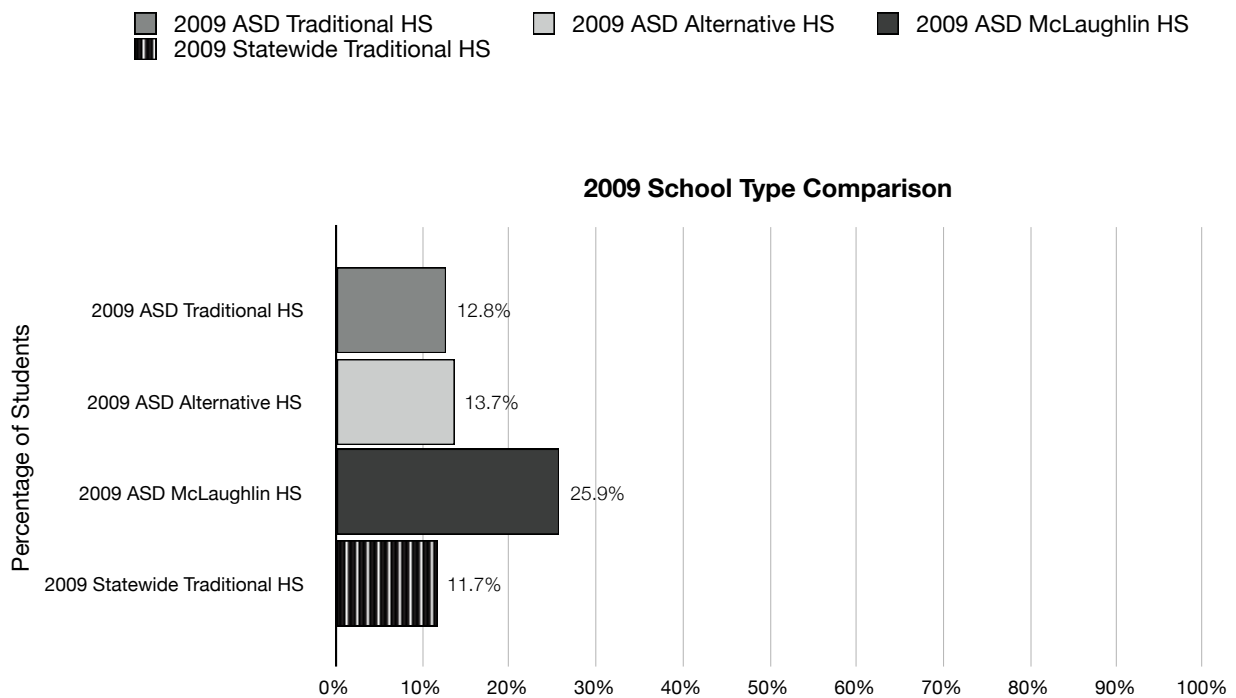

Percentage of students who actually attempted suicide one or more times during the past 12 months

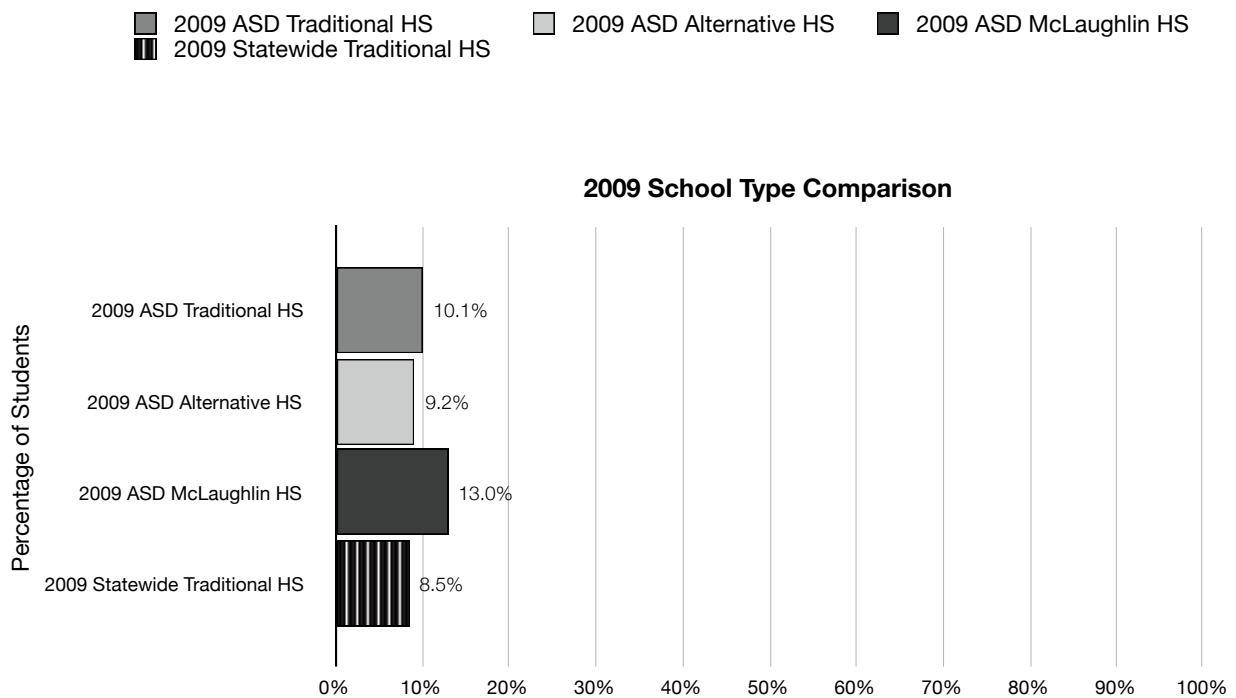
Question 27: During the past 12 months, how many times did you actually attempt suicide?

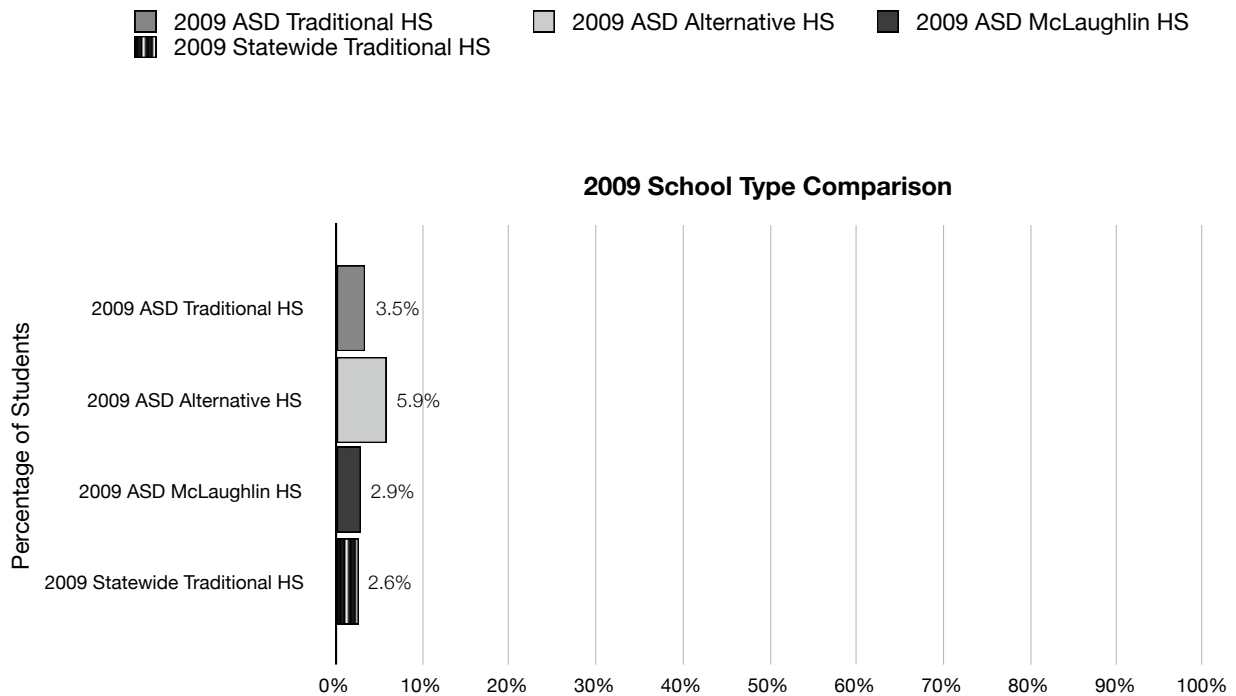

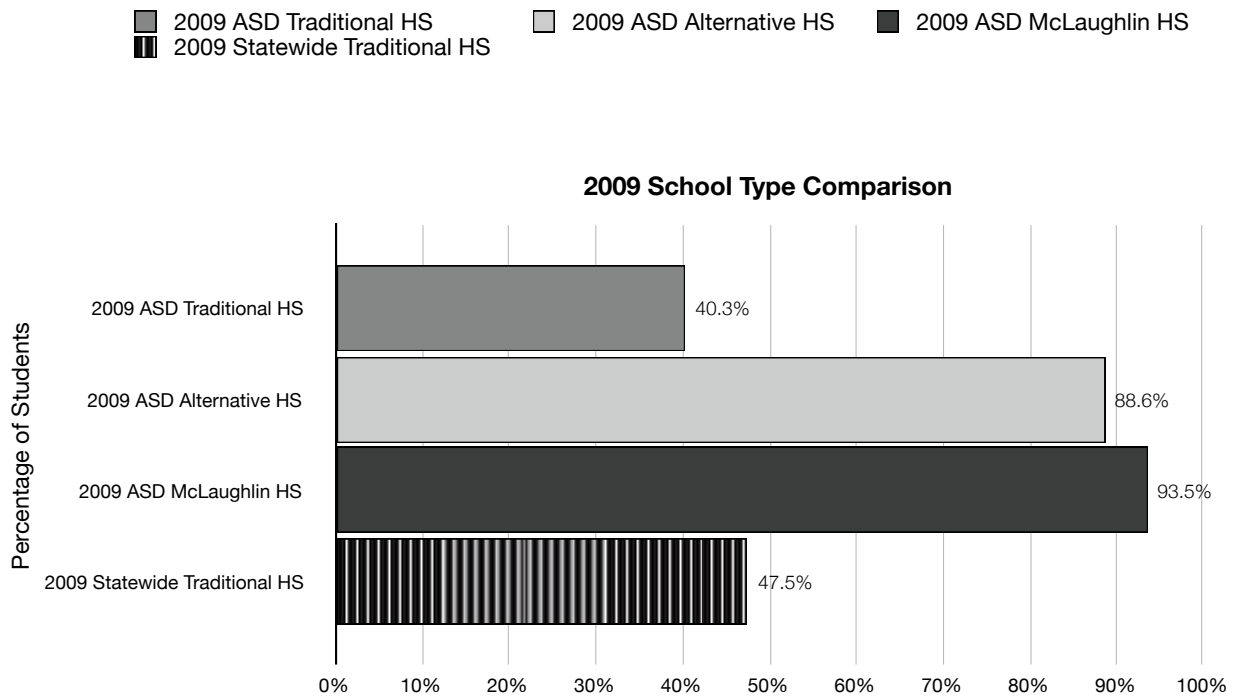

Percentage of students who smoked a whole cigarette for the first time before age 13

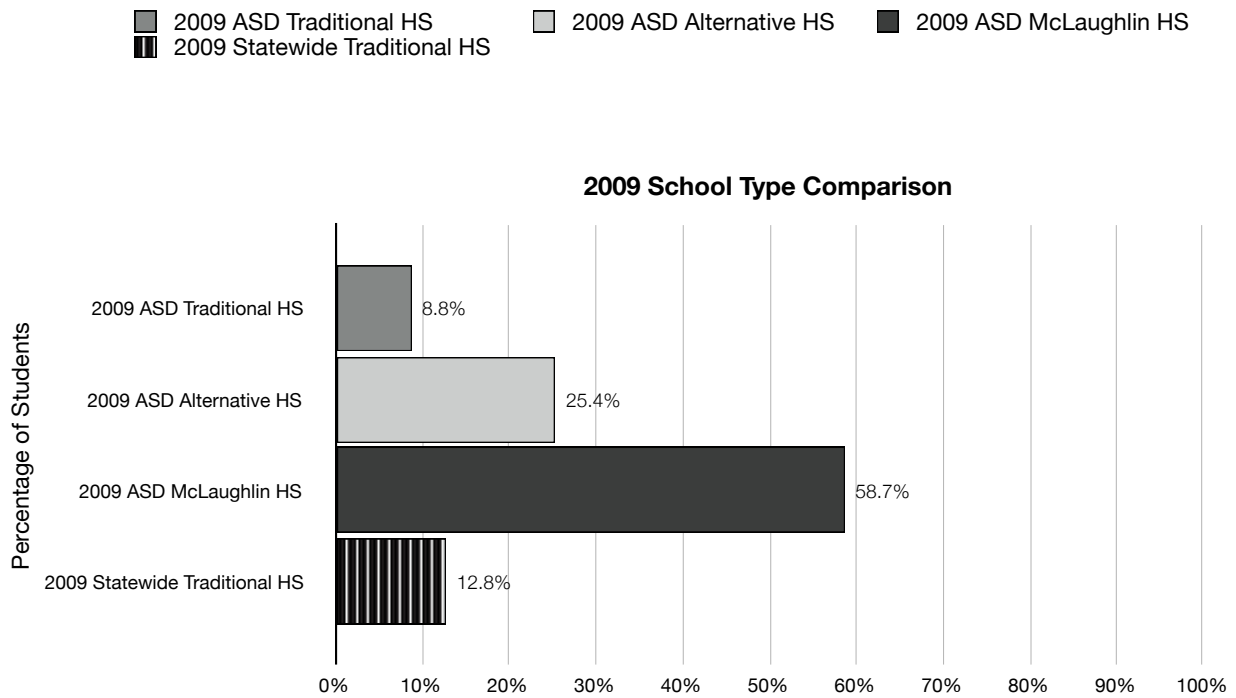
Question 30: How old were you when you smoked a whole cigarette for the first time?

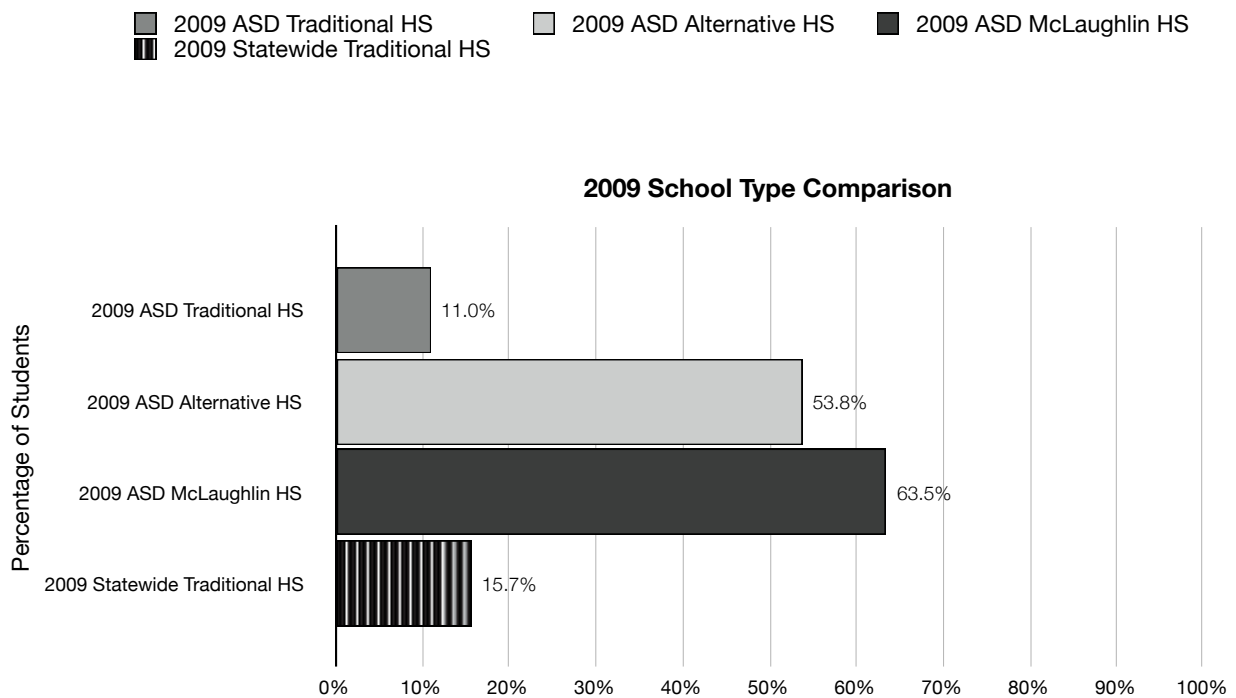

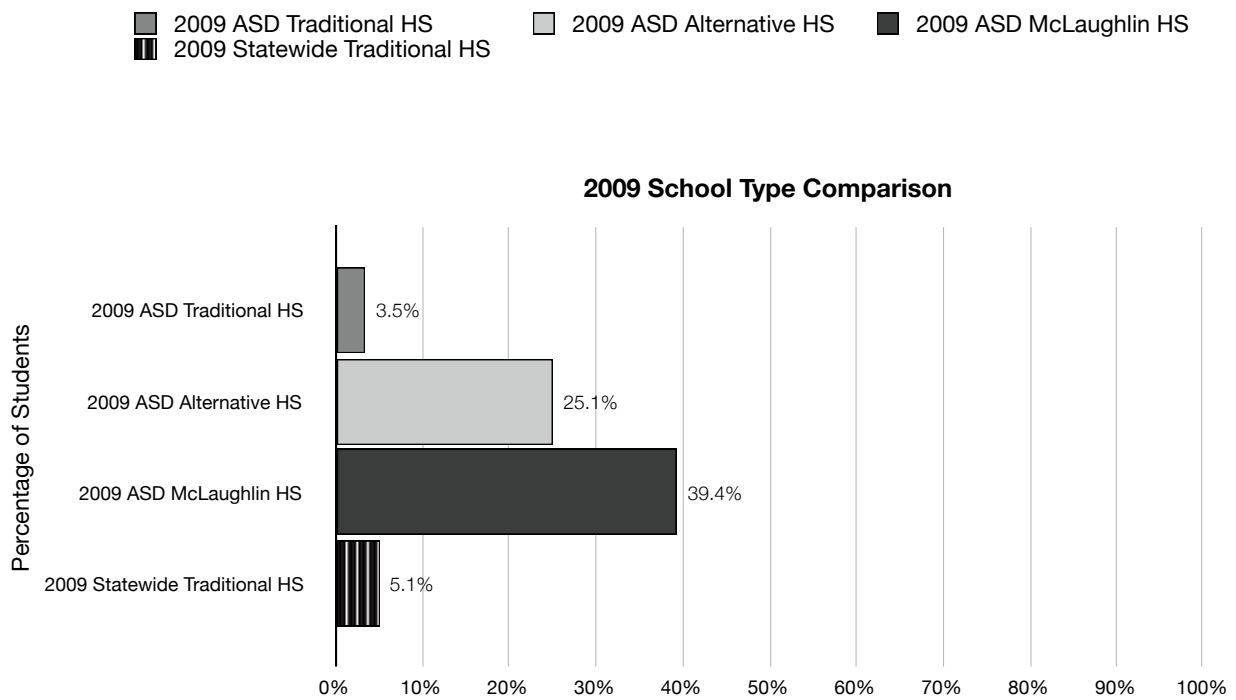

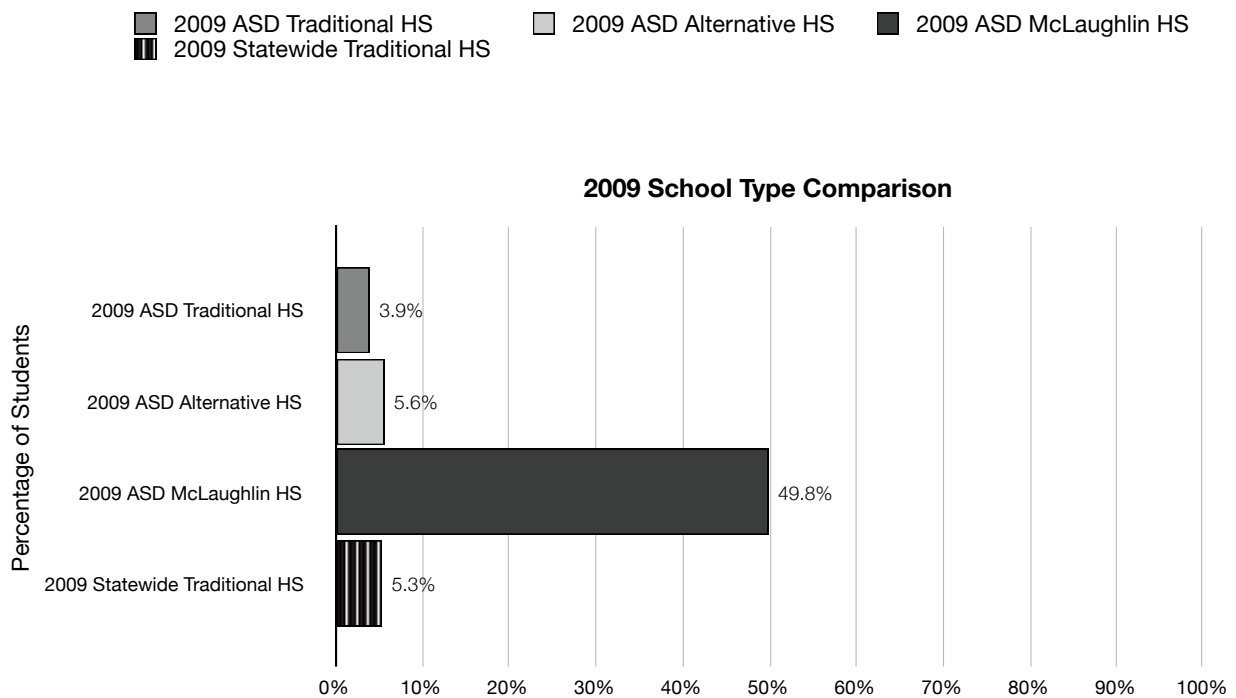

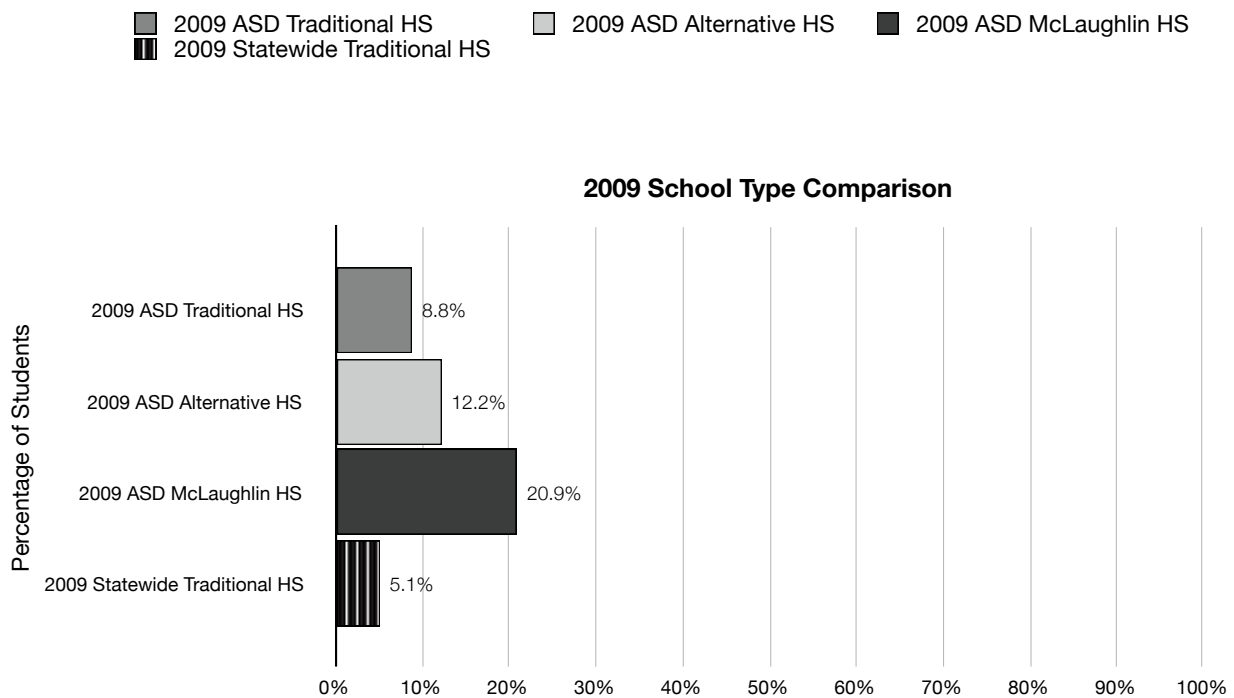
Question 33: During the past 30 days, how did you usually get your own cigarettes?

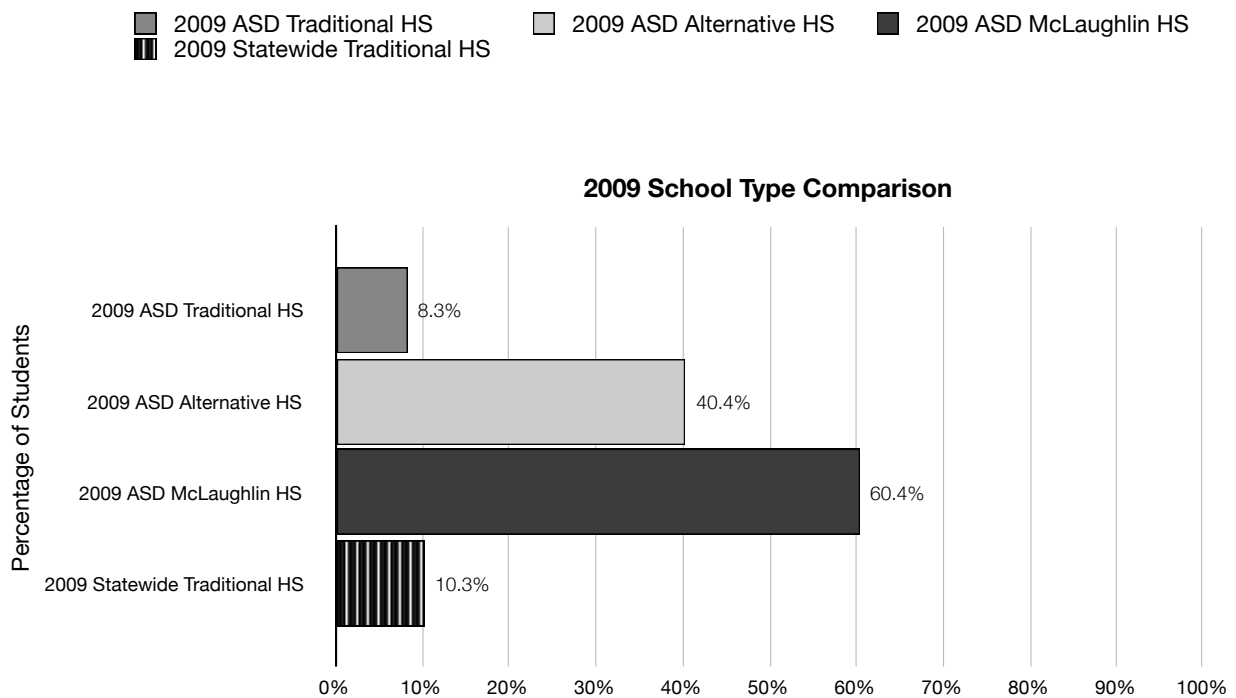

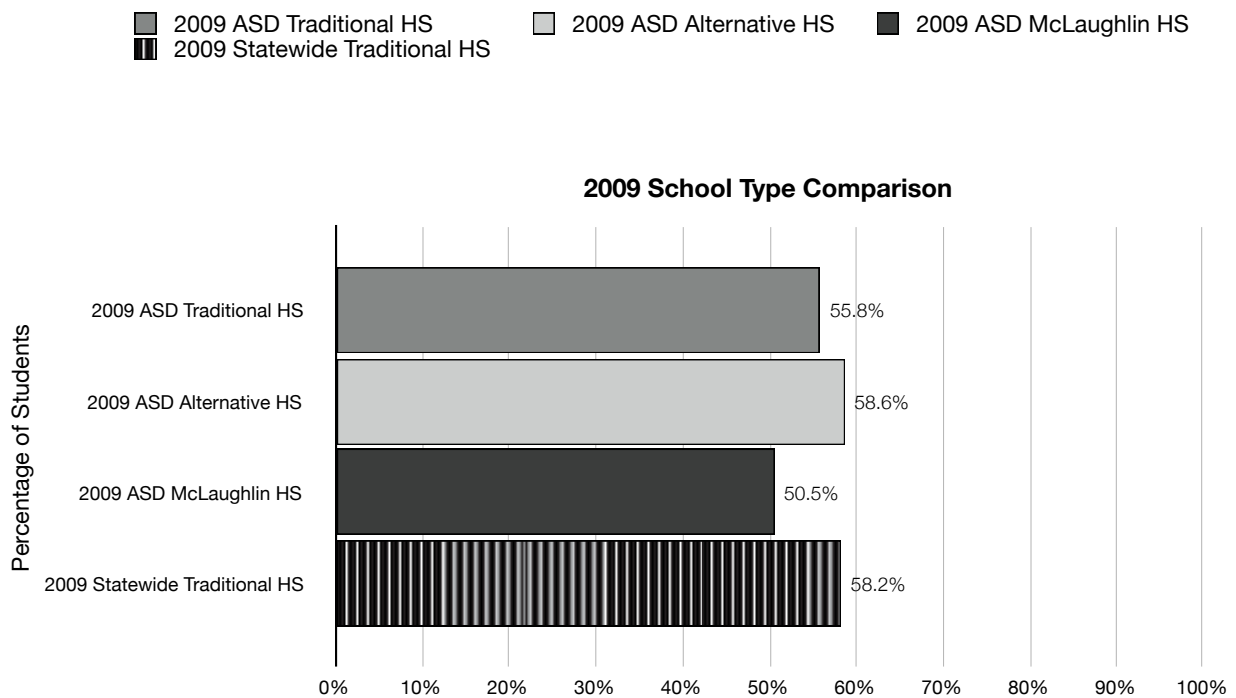

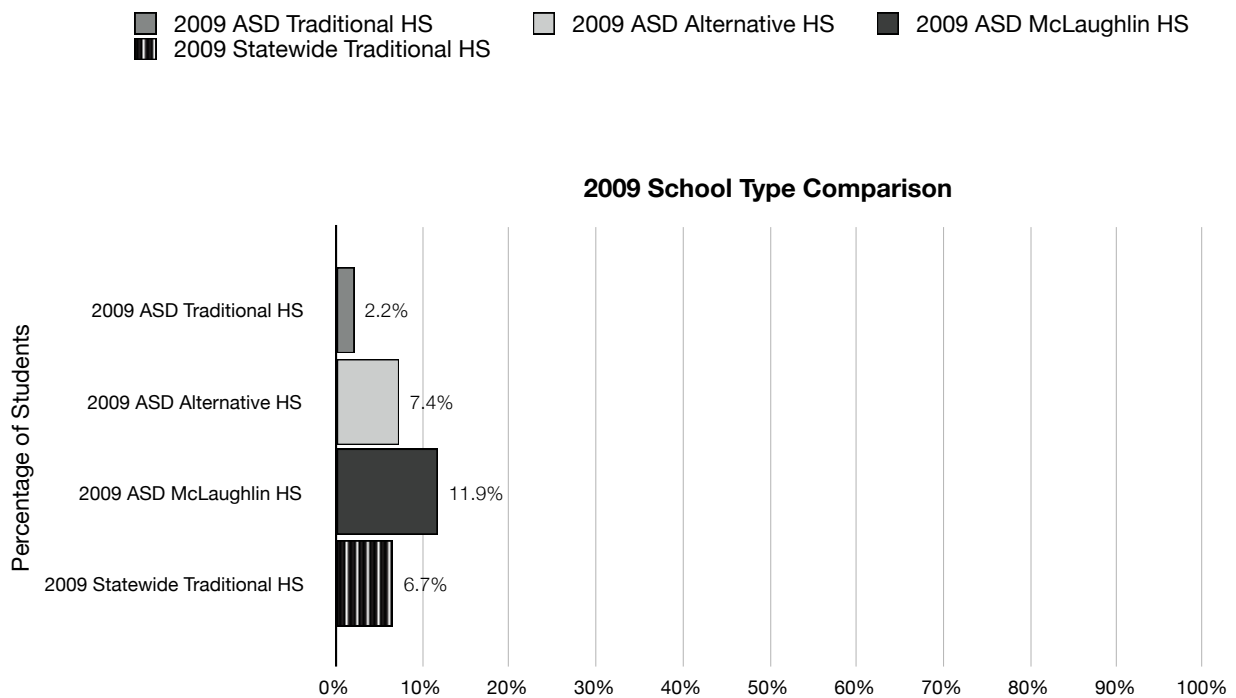

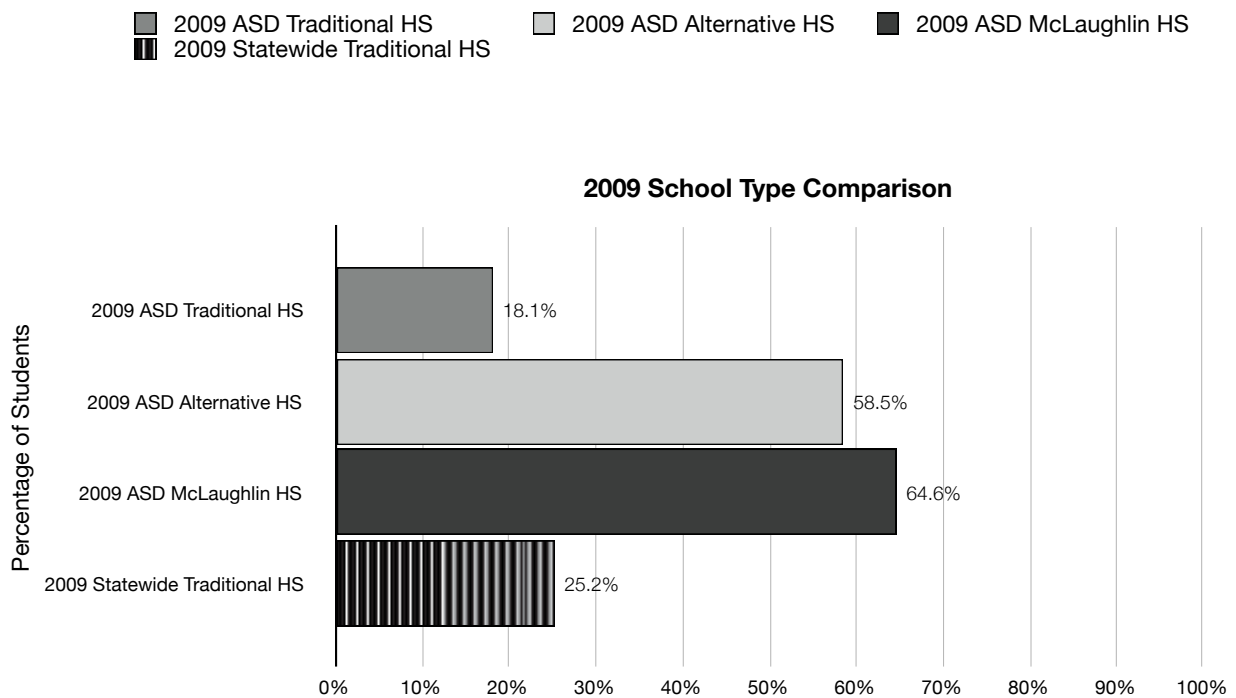

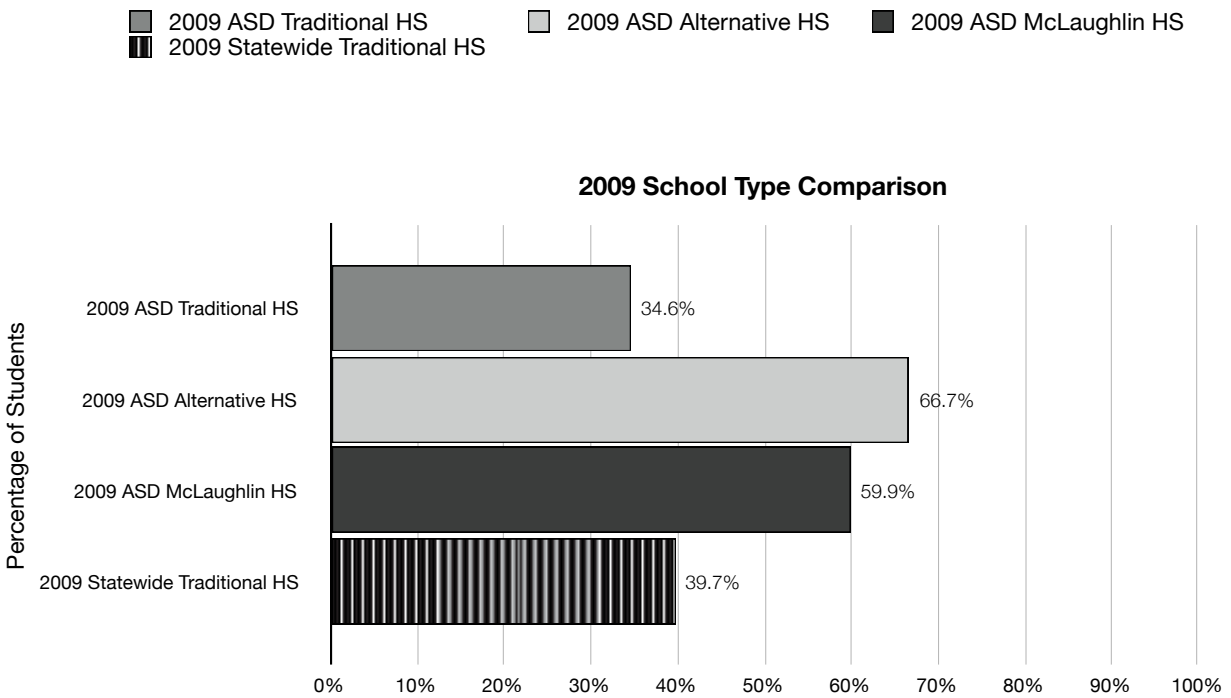

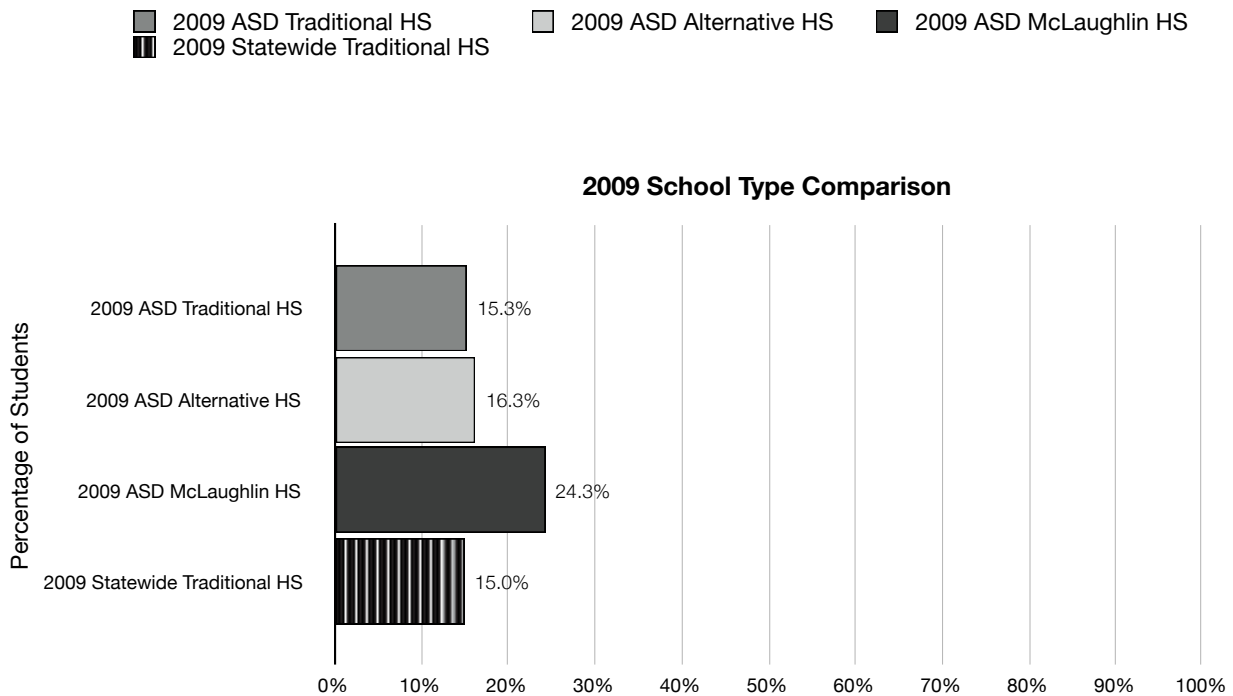

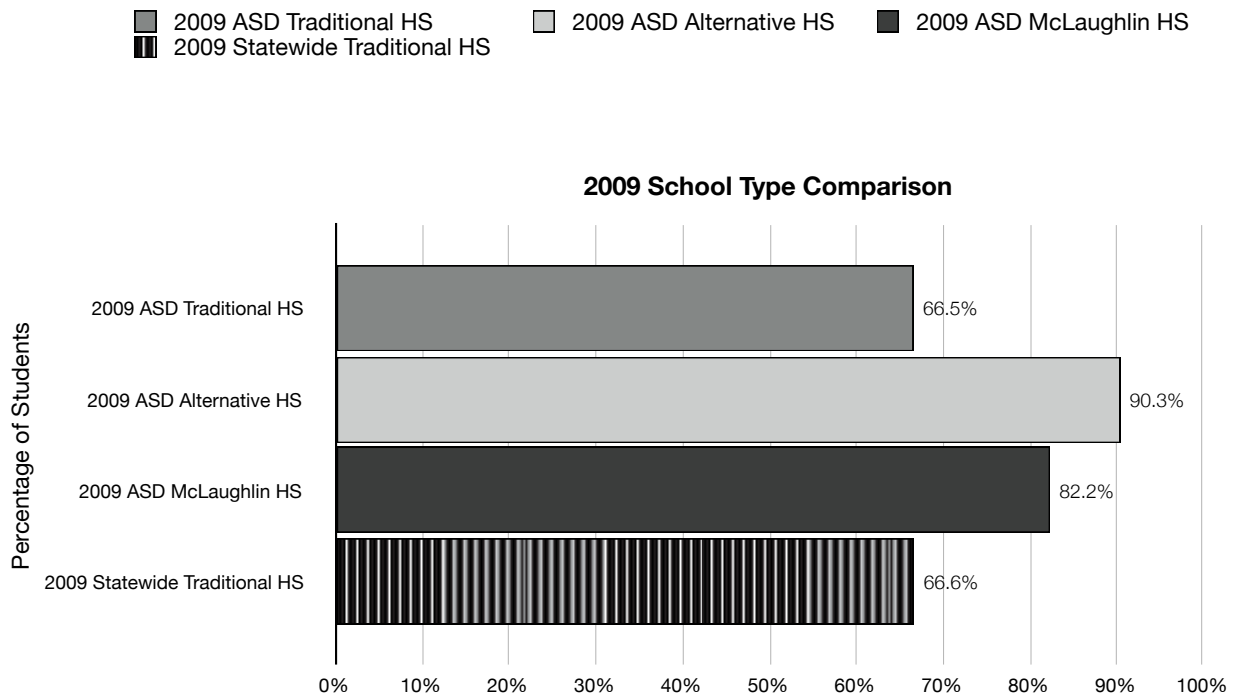

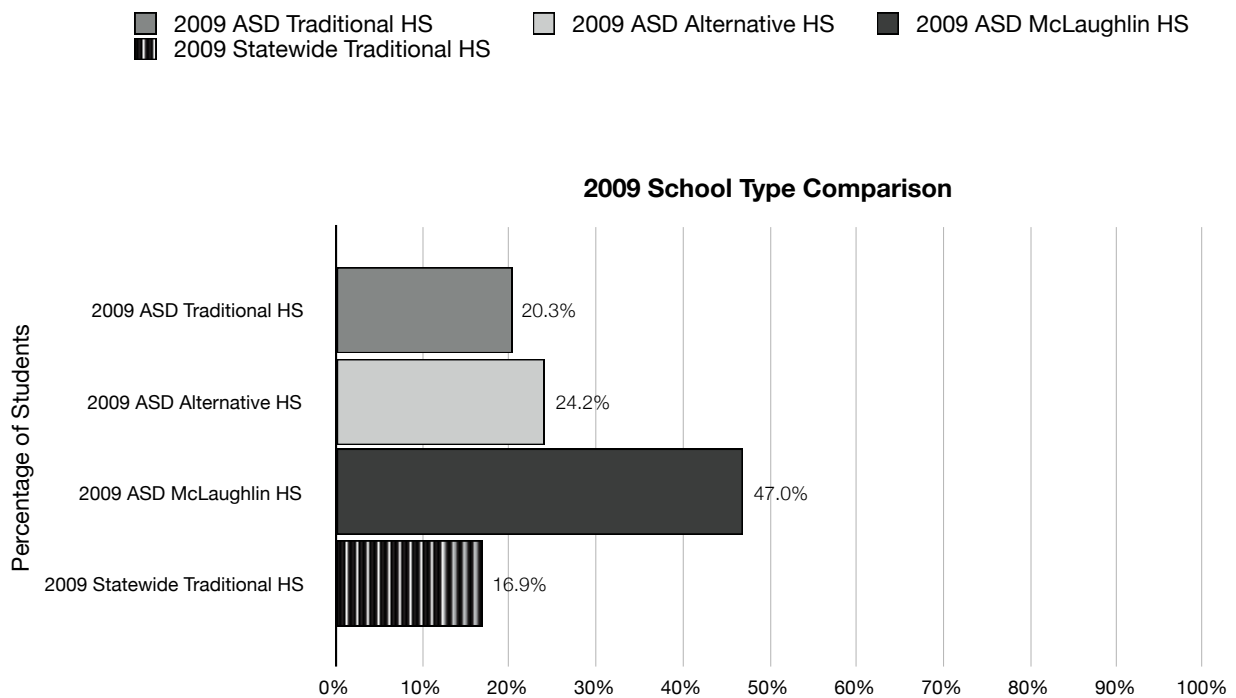

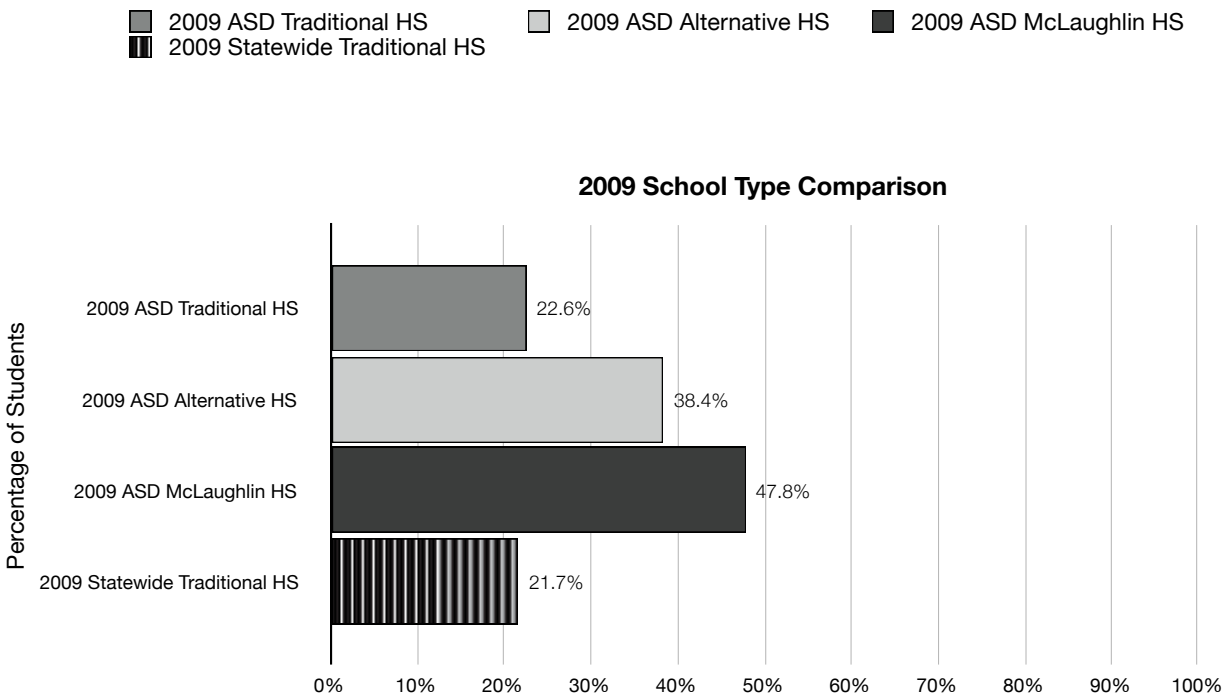

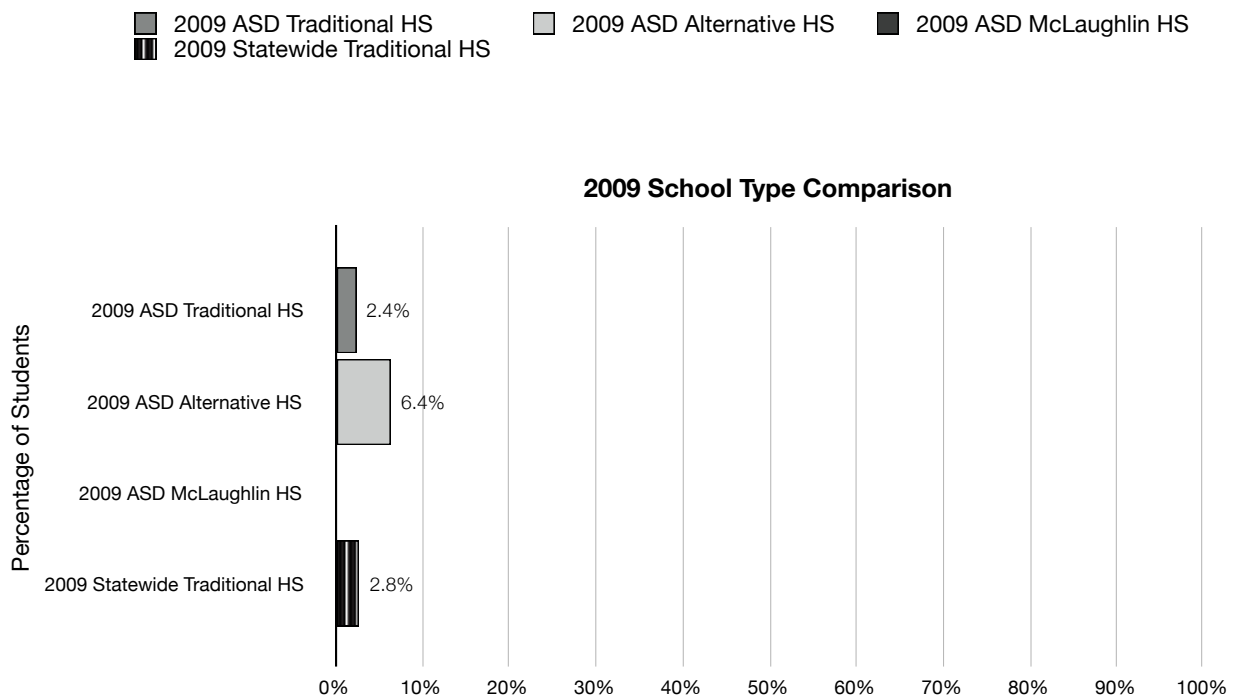
Question 46: During the past 30 days, how did you usually get the alcohol you drank?

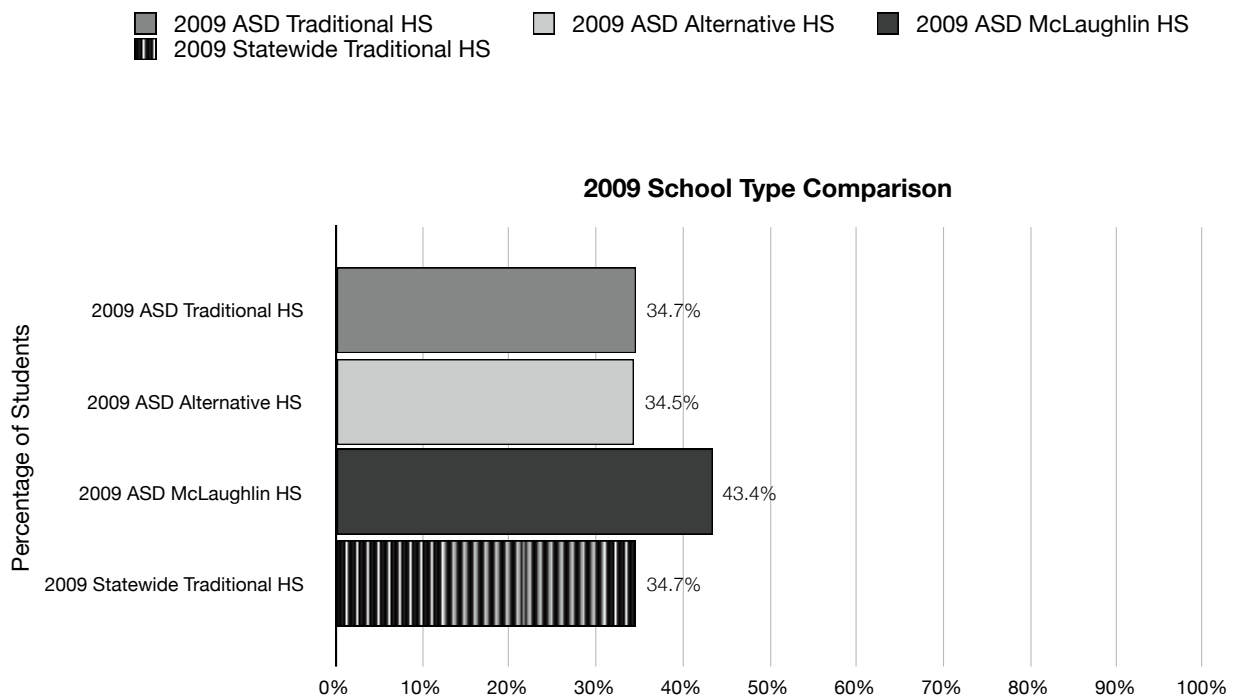

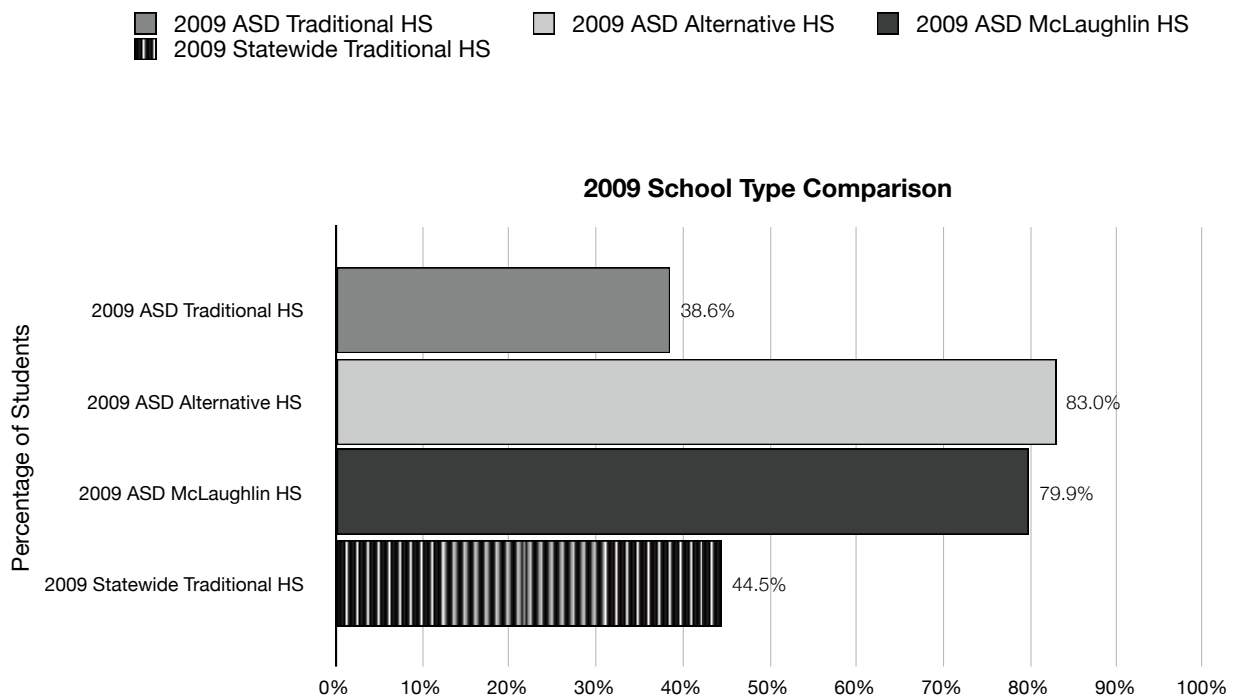

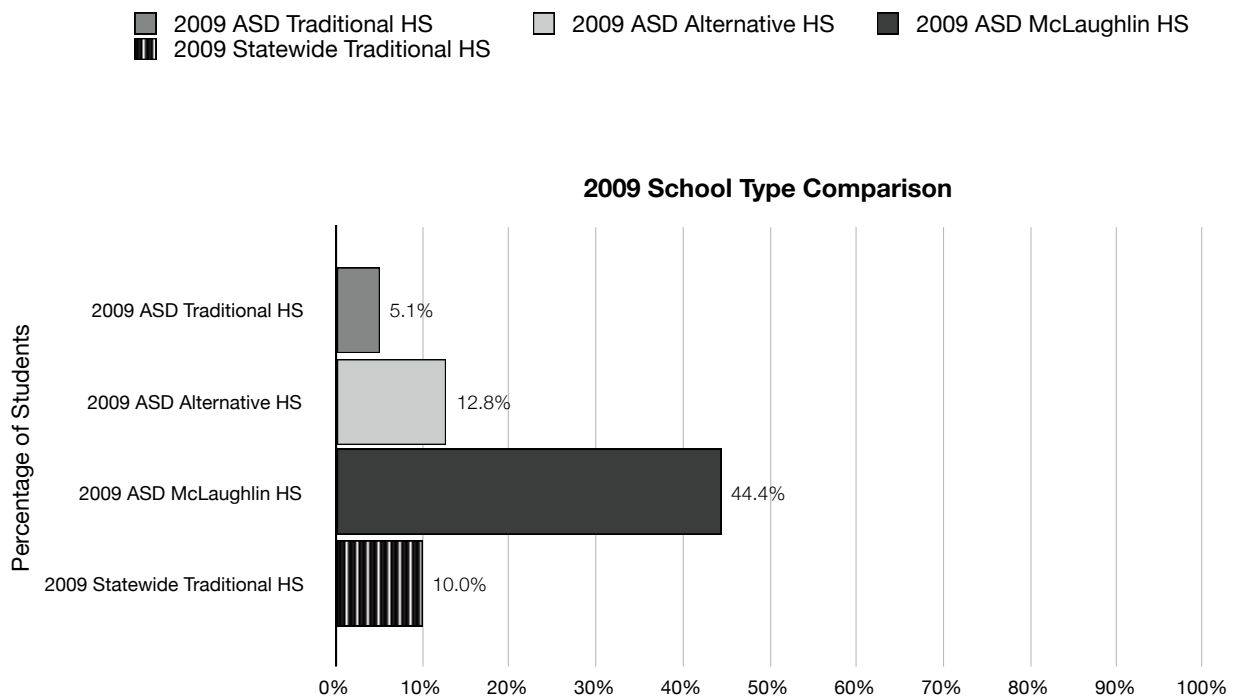

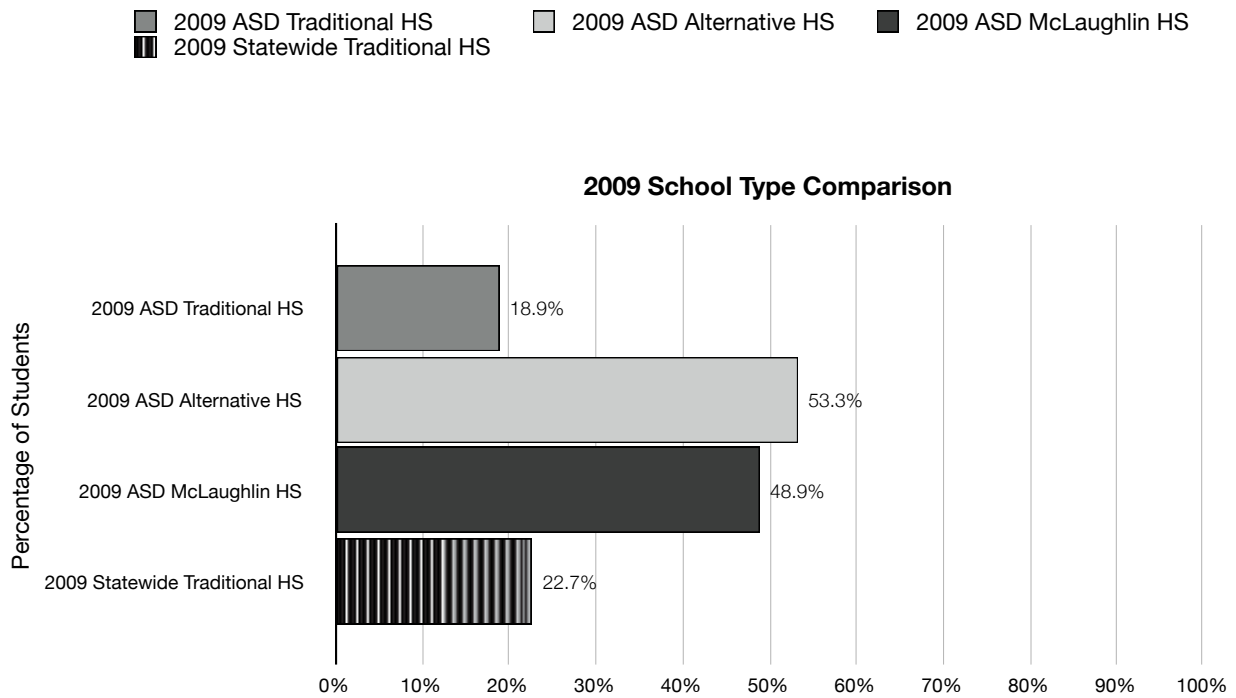

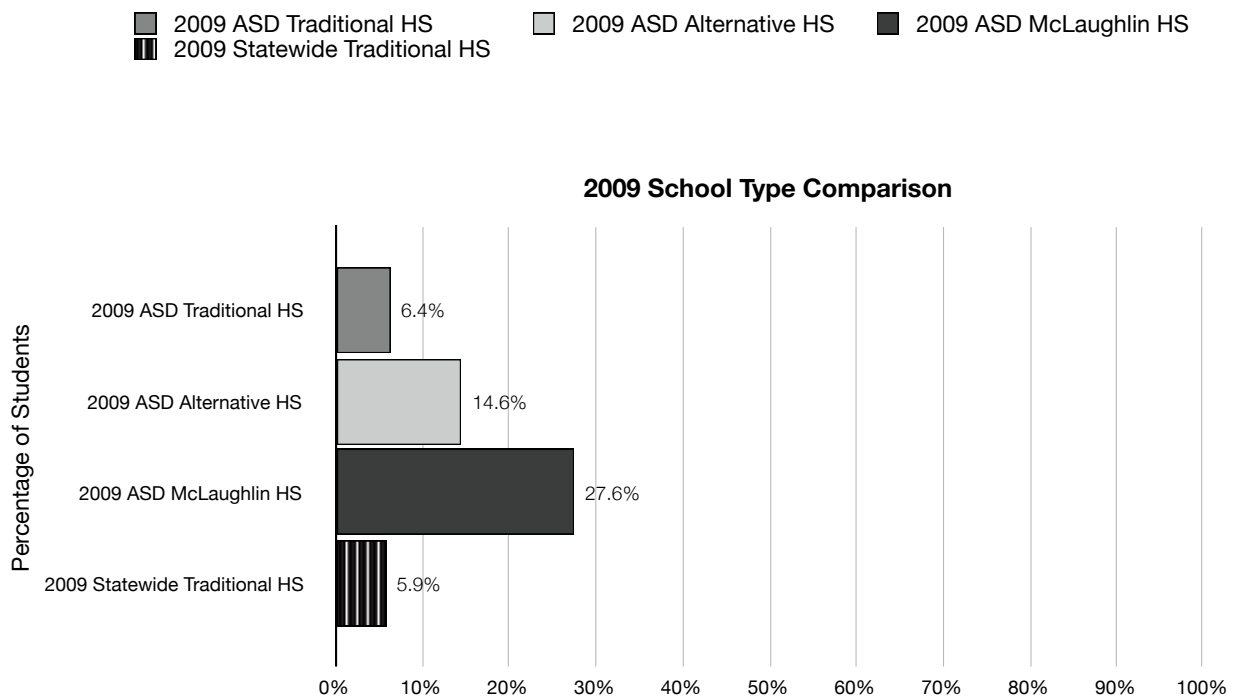

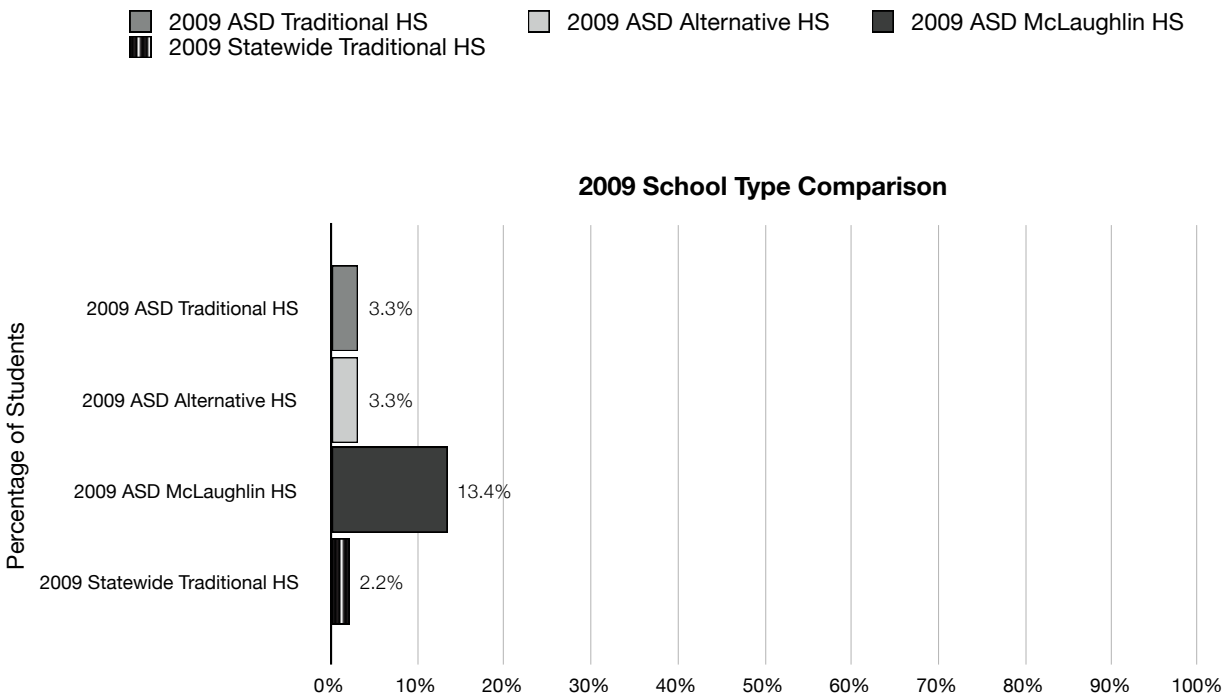

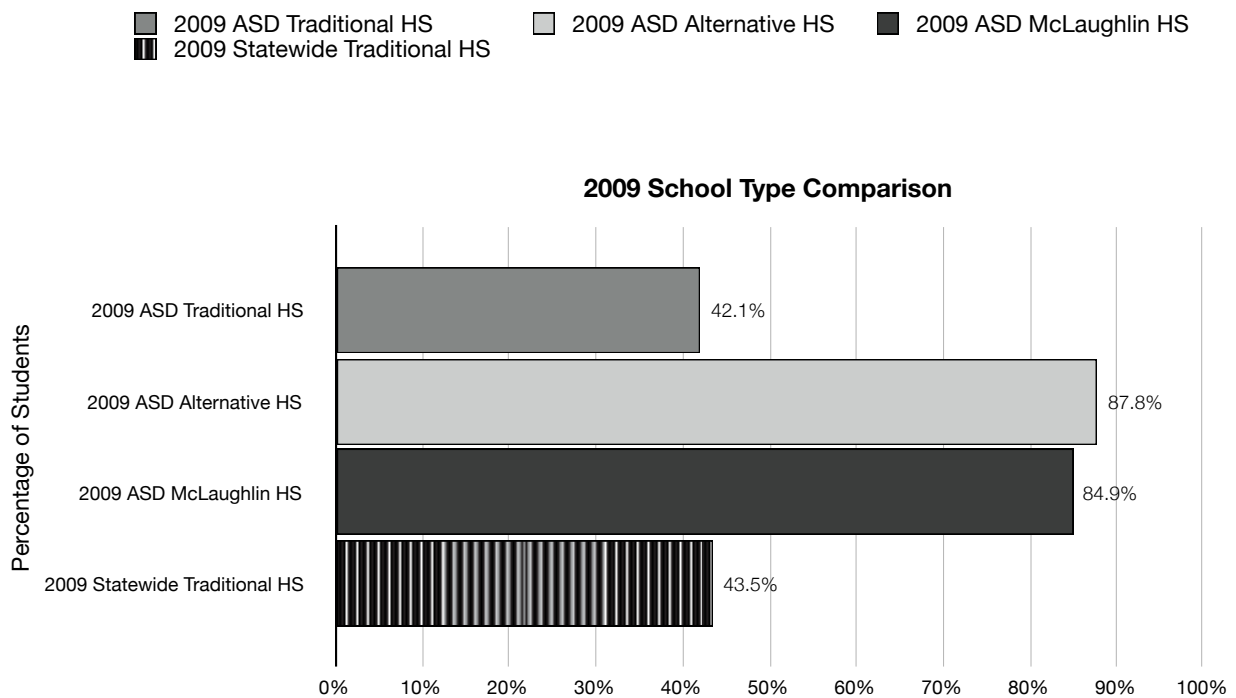

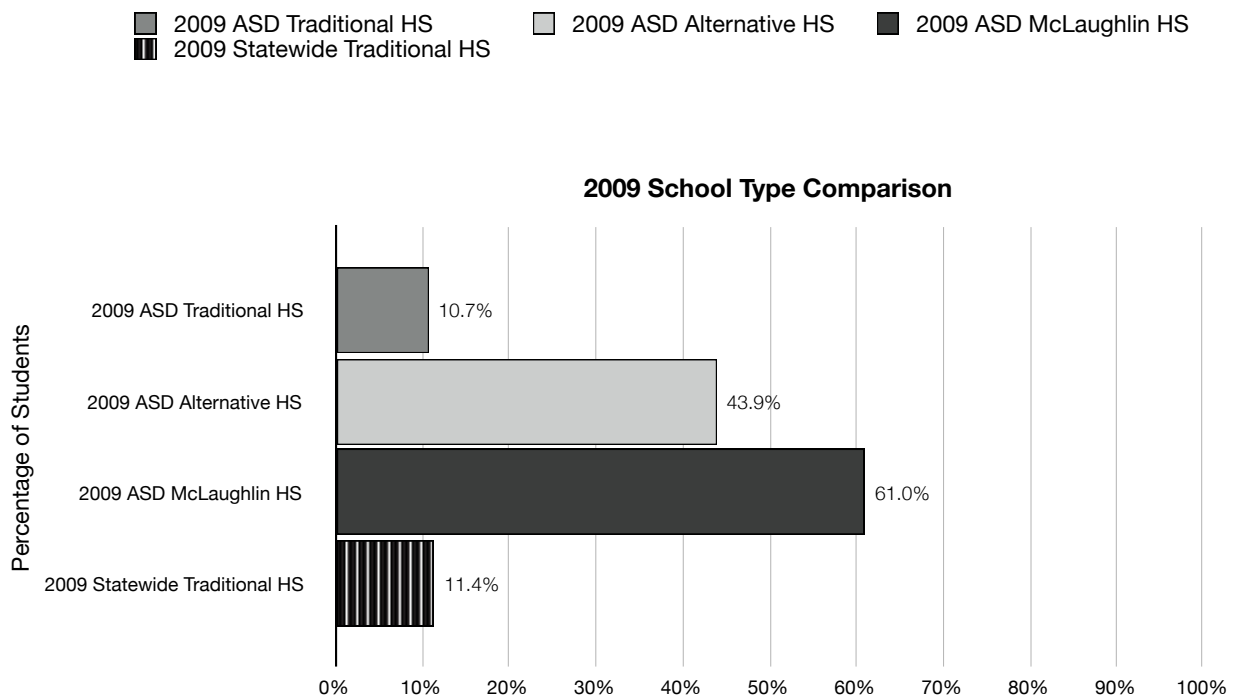

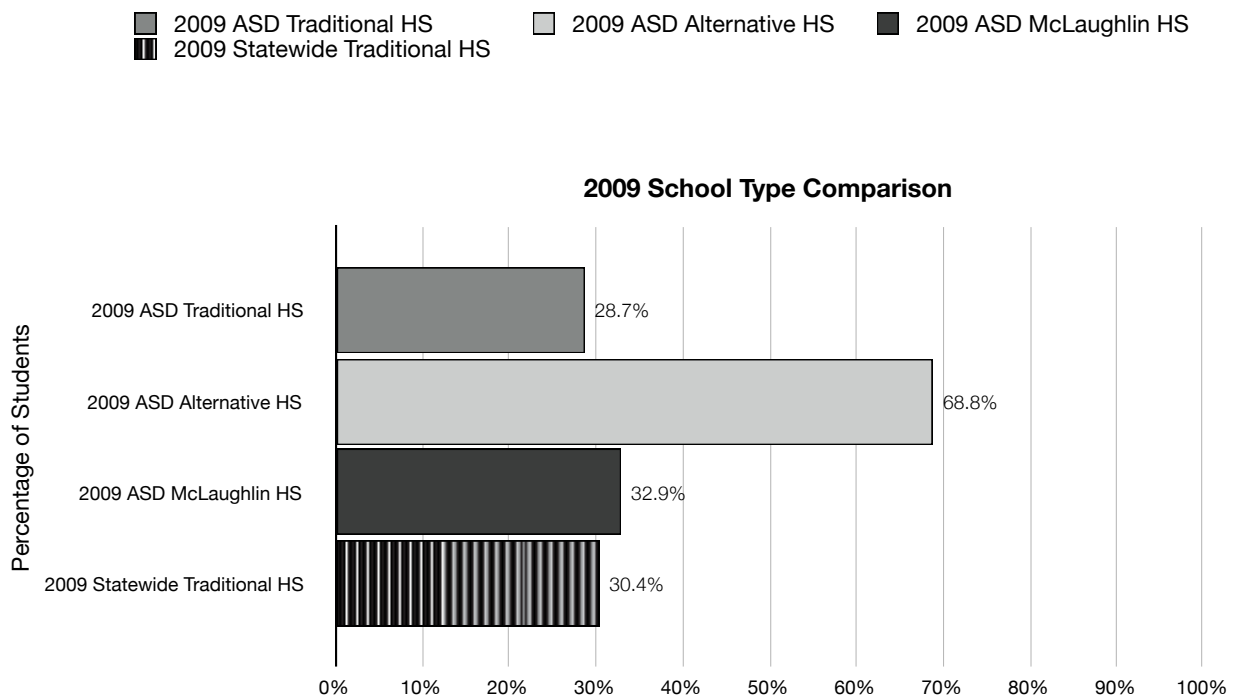
Question 66: During the past 3 months, with how many people did you have sexual intercourse?

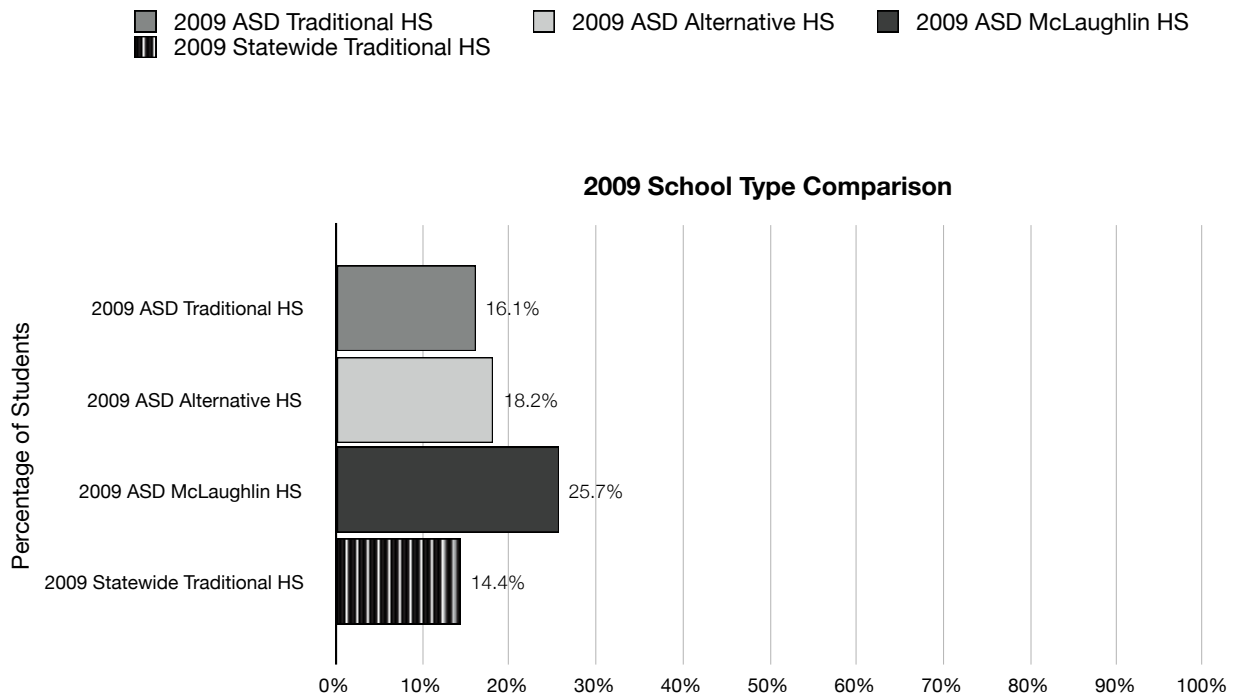

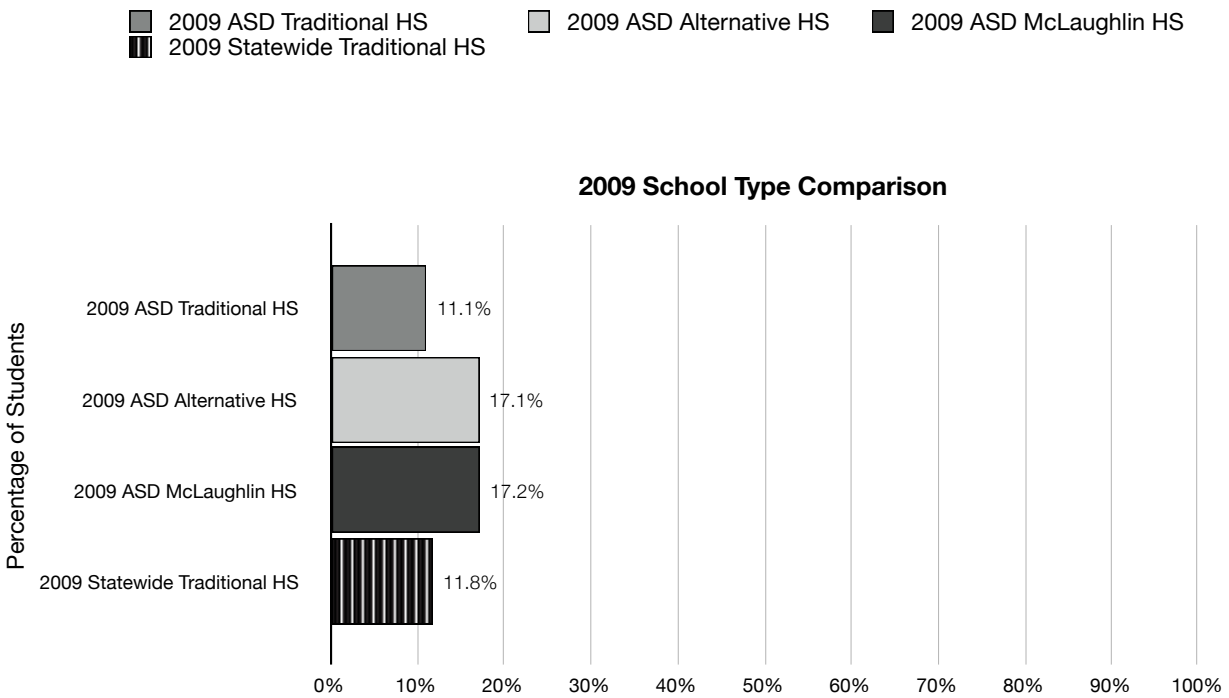

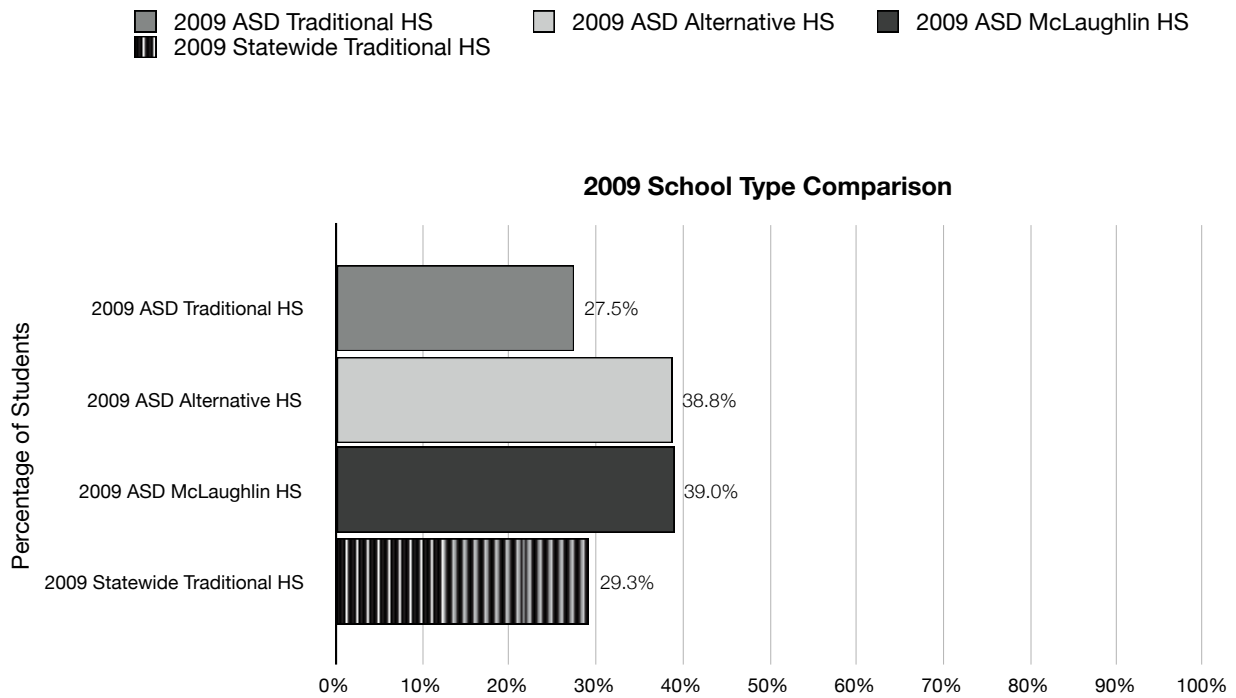
Question 70: How do you describe your weight?

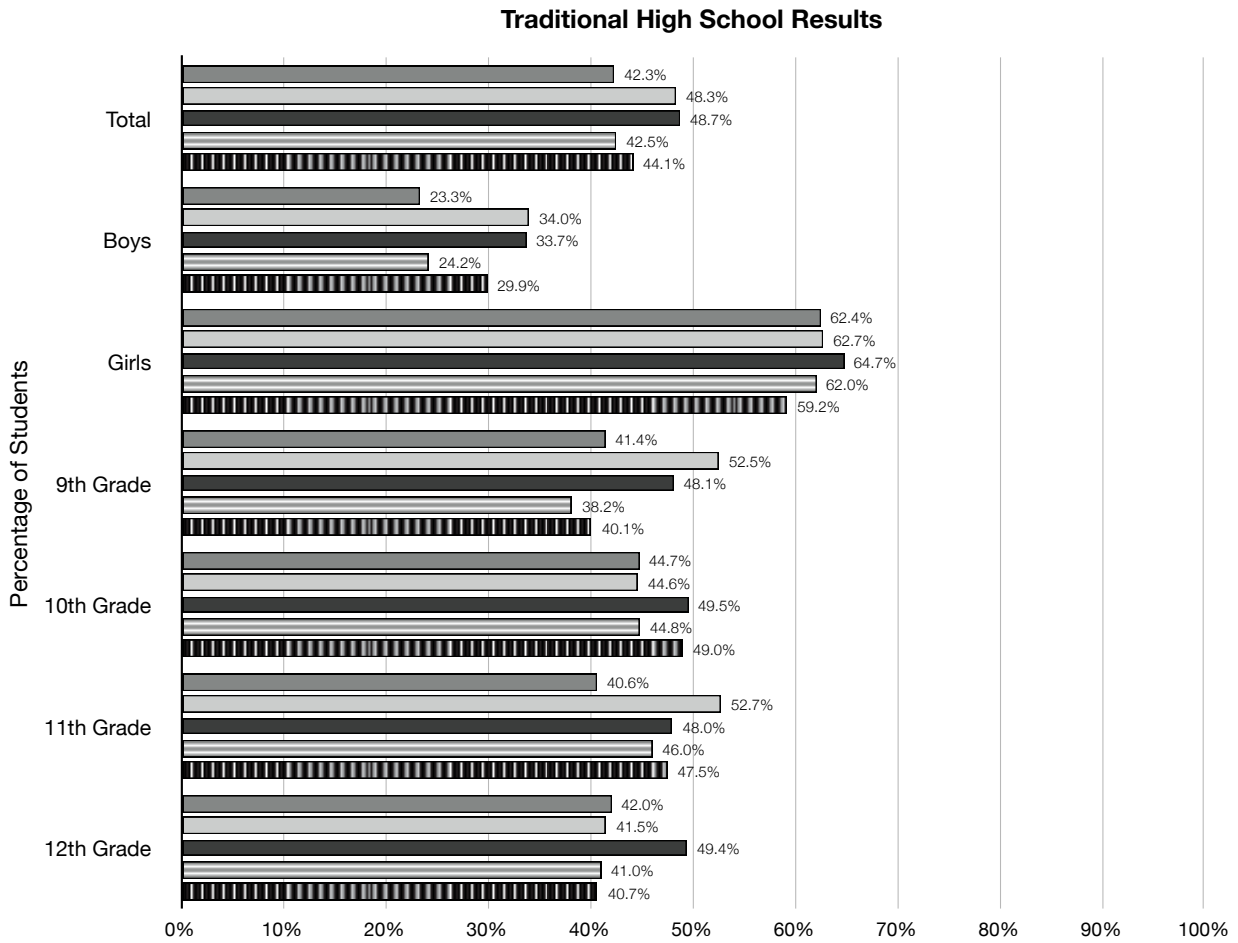

Question 71: Which of the following are you trying to do about your weight?

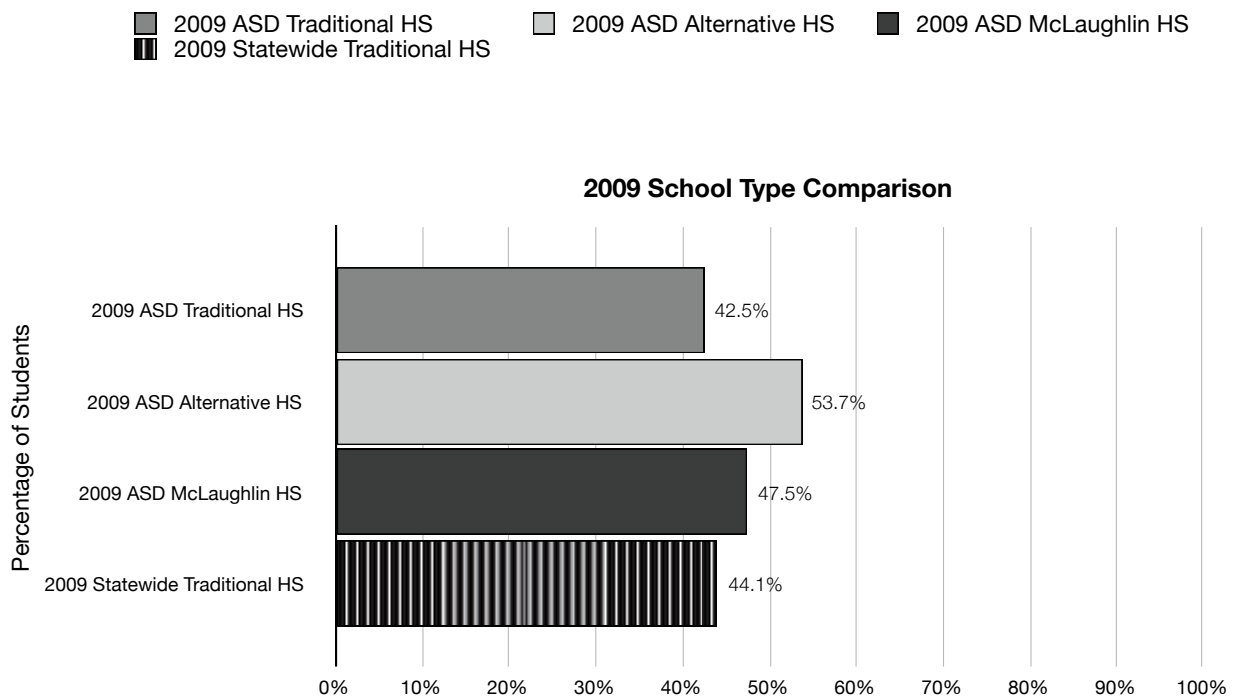

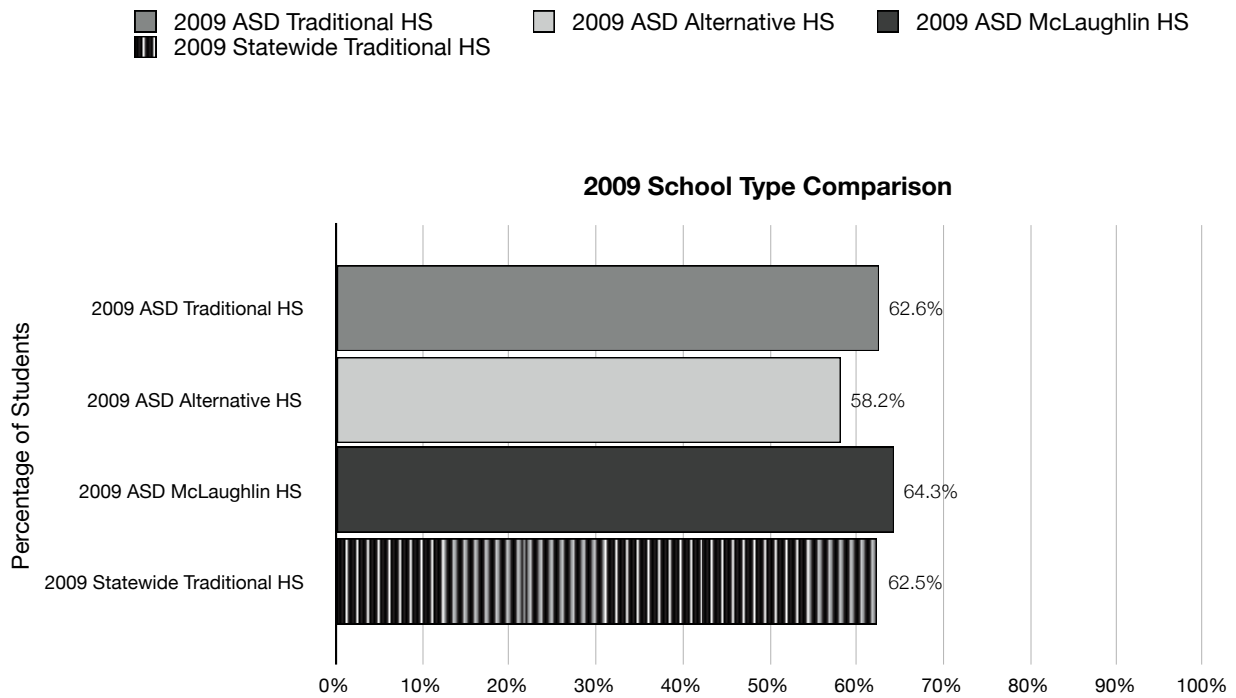

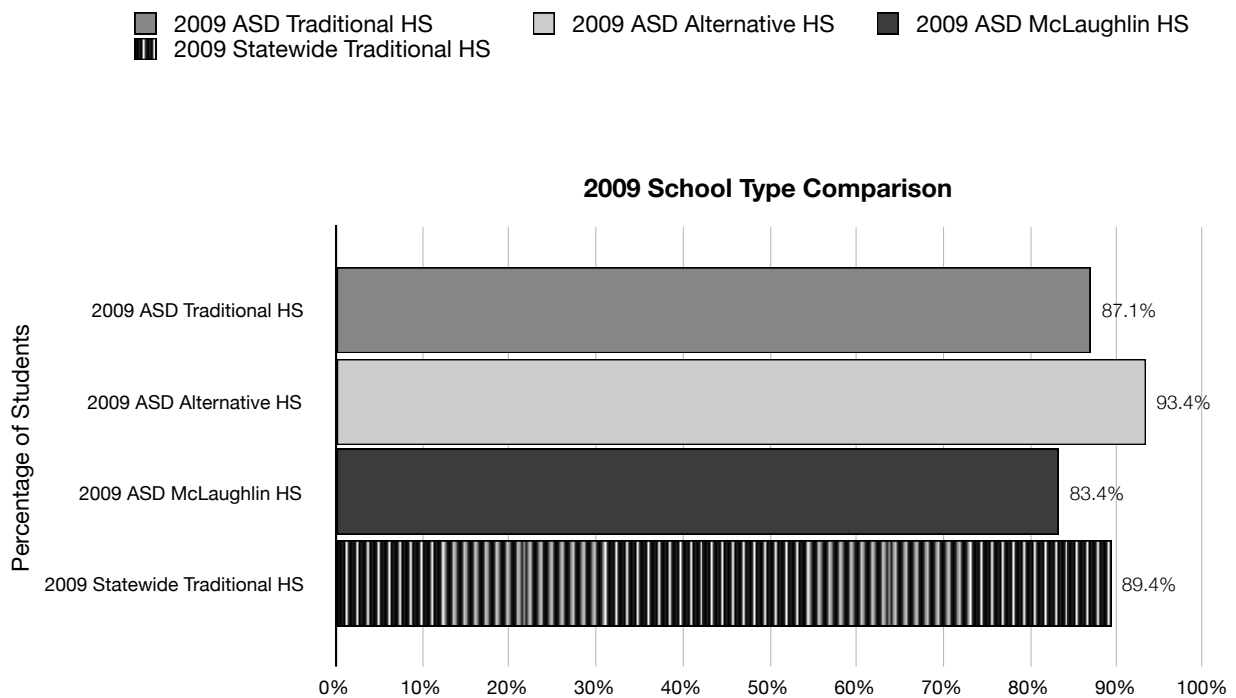

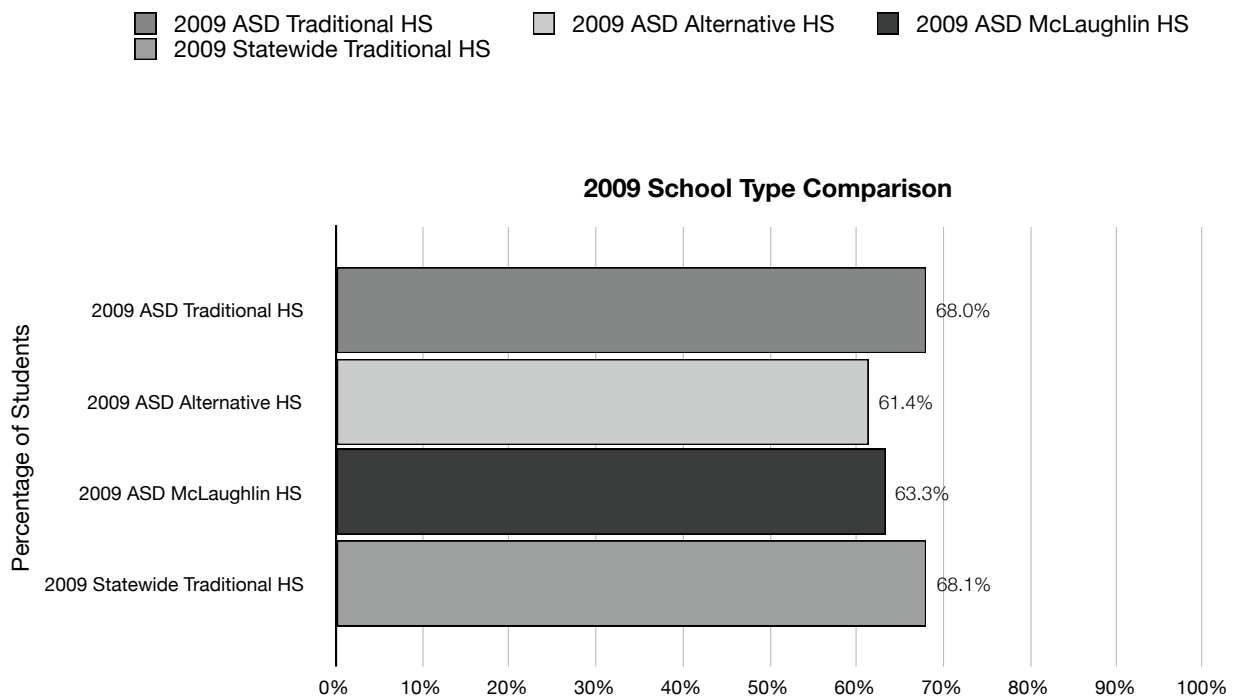

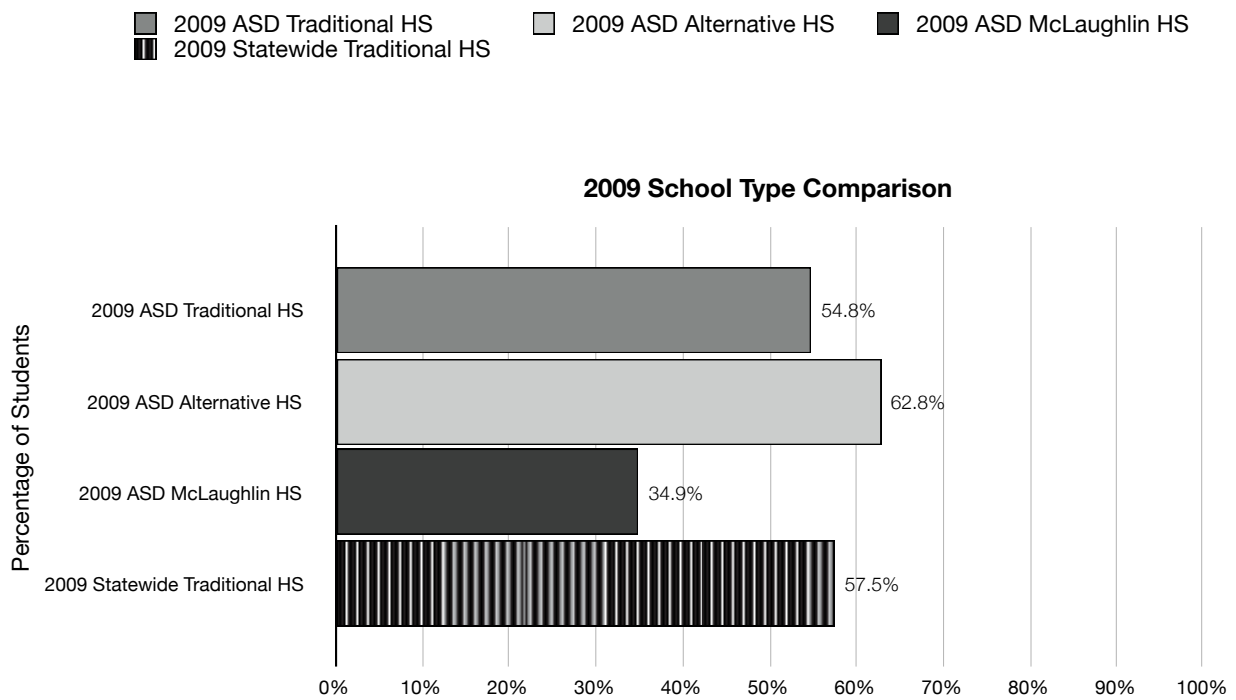

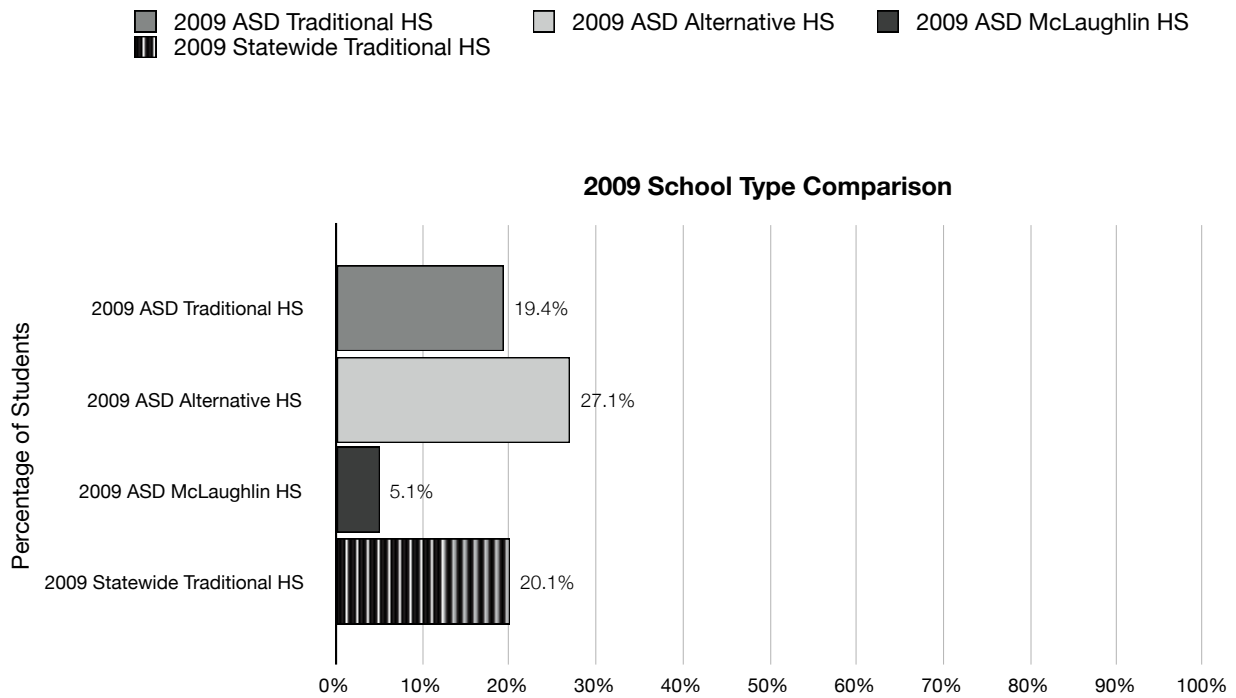

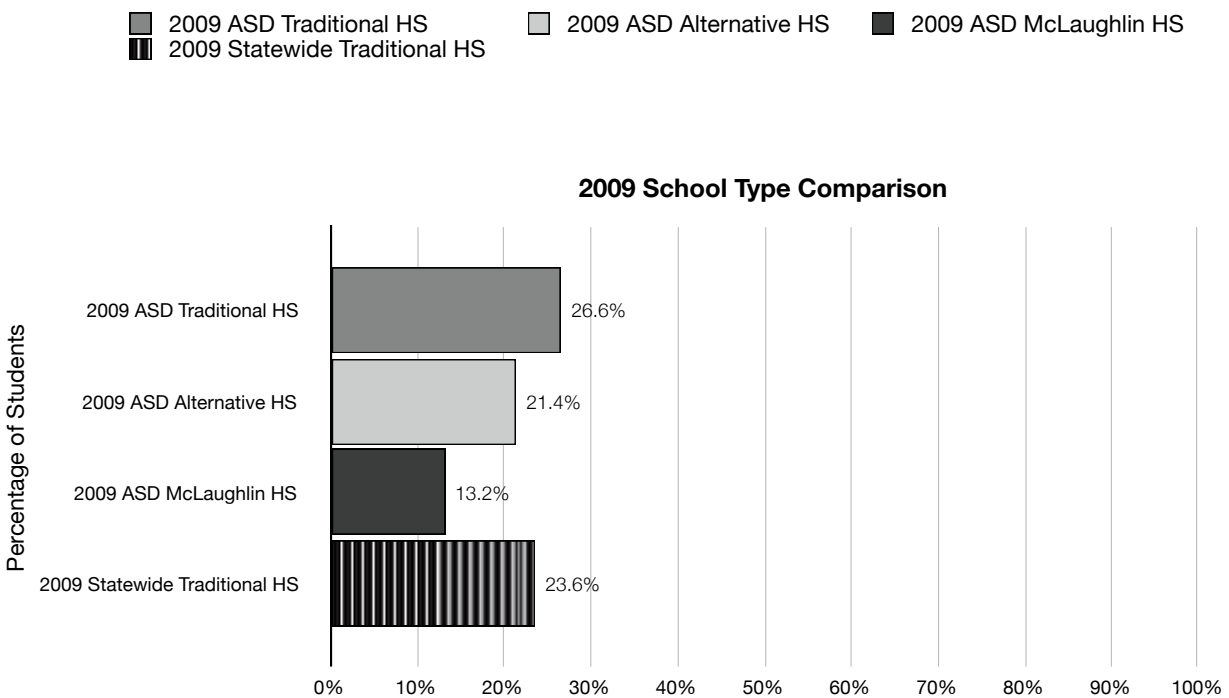

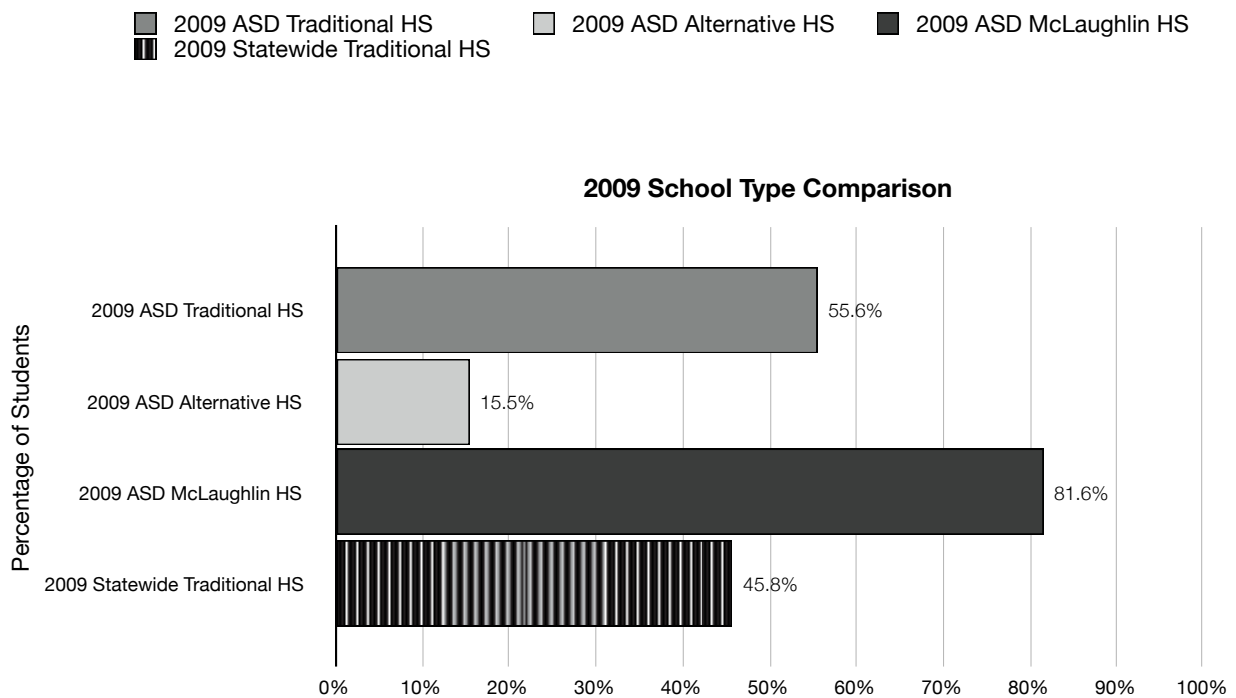

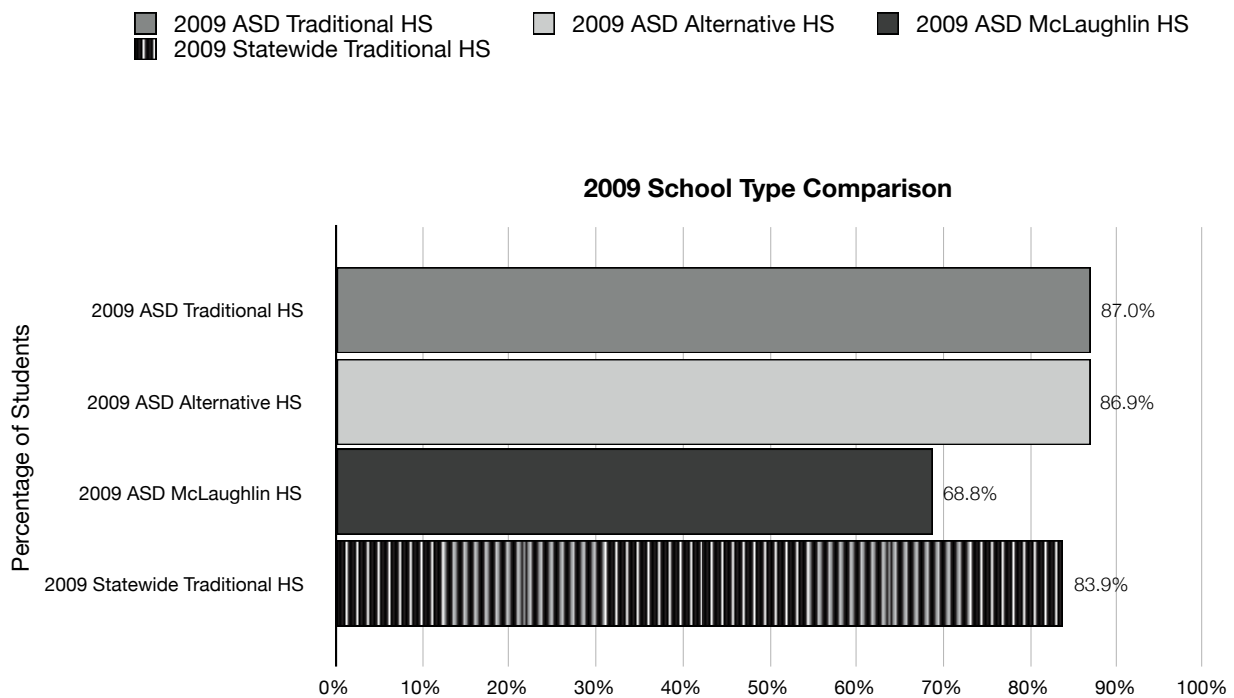

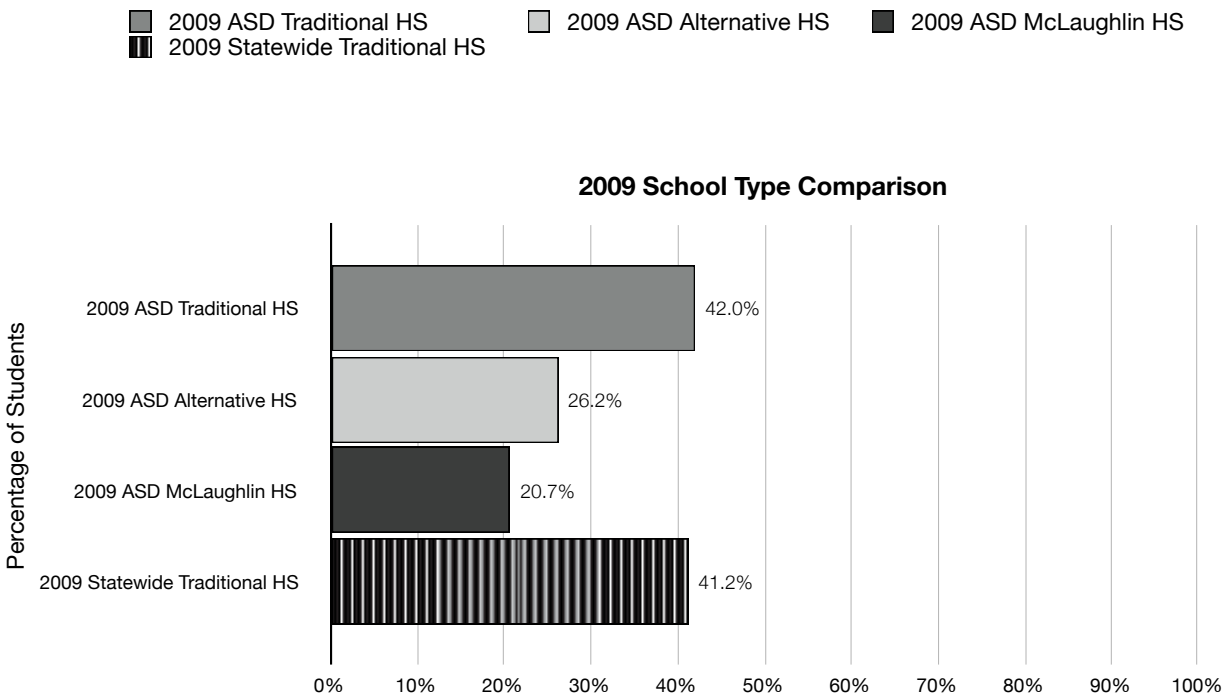

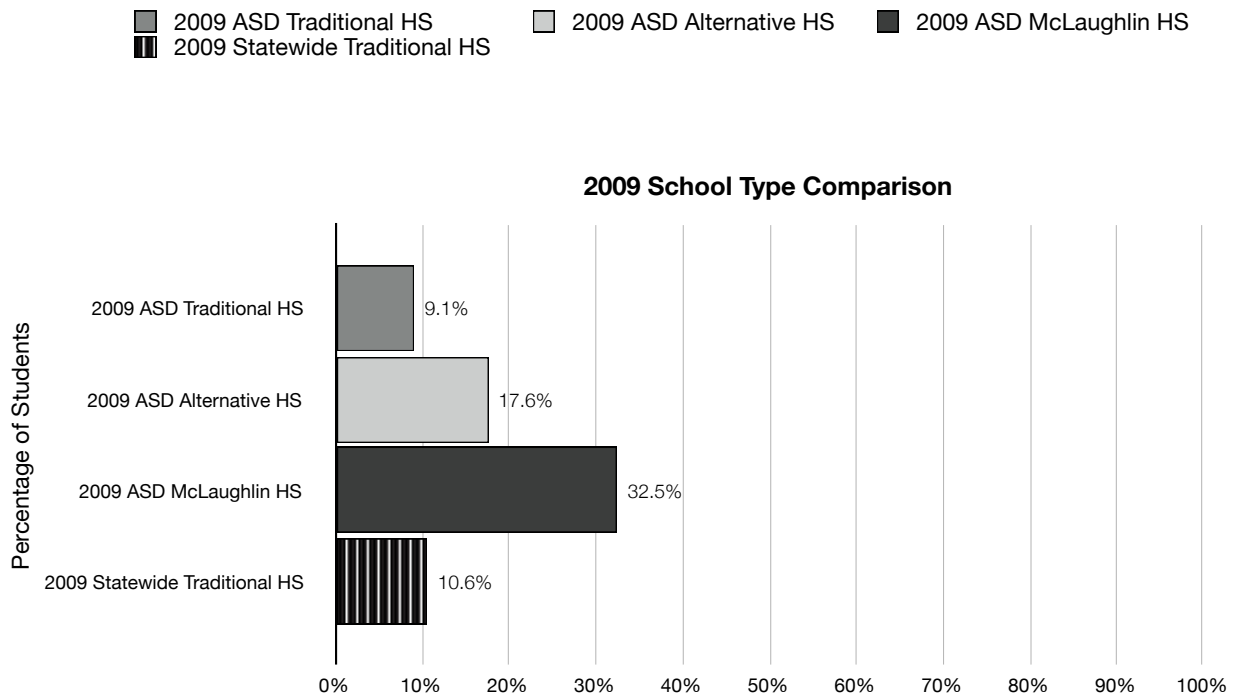

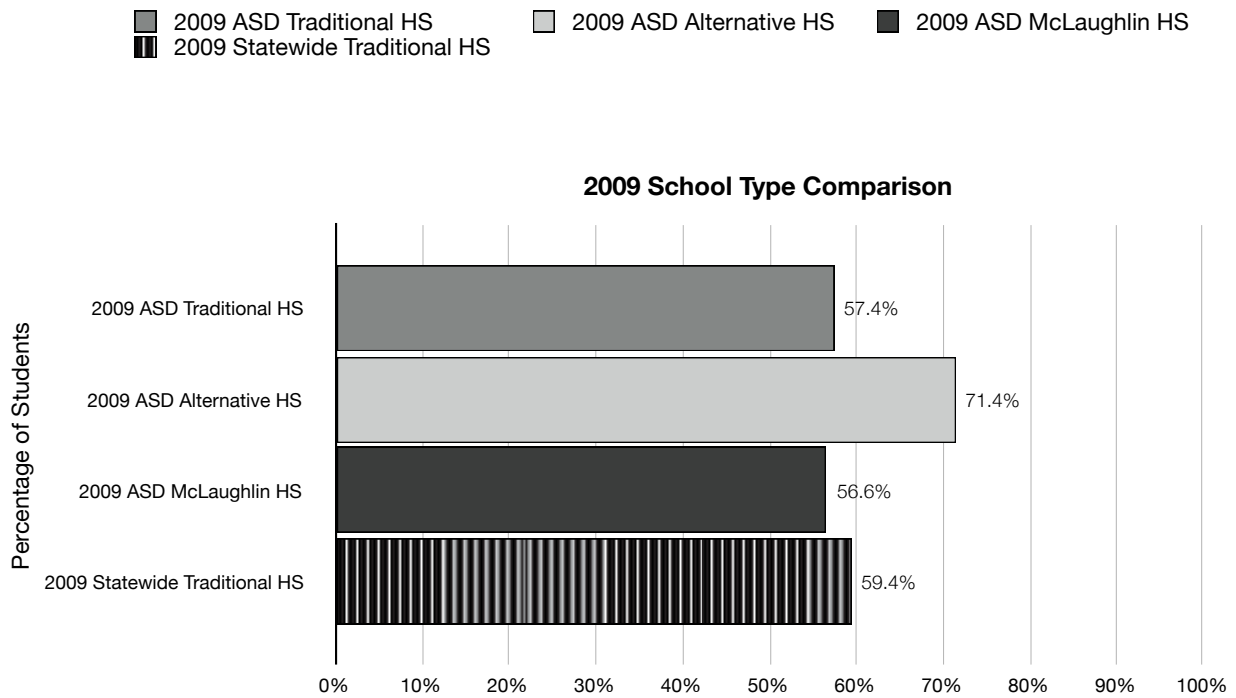

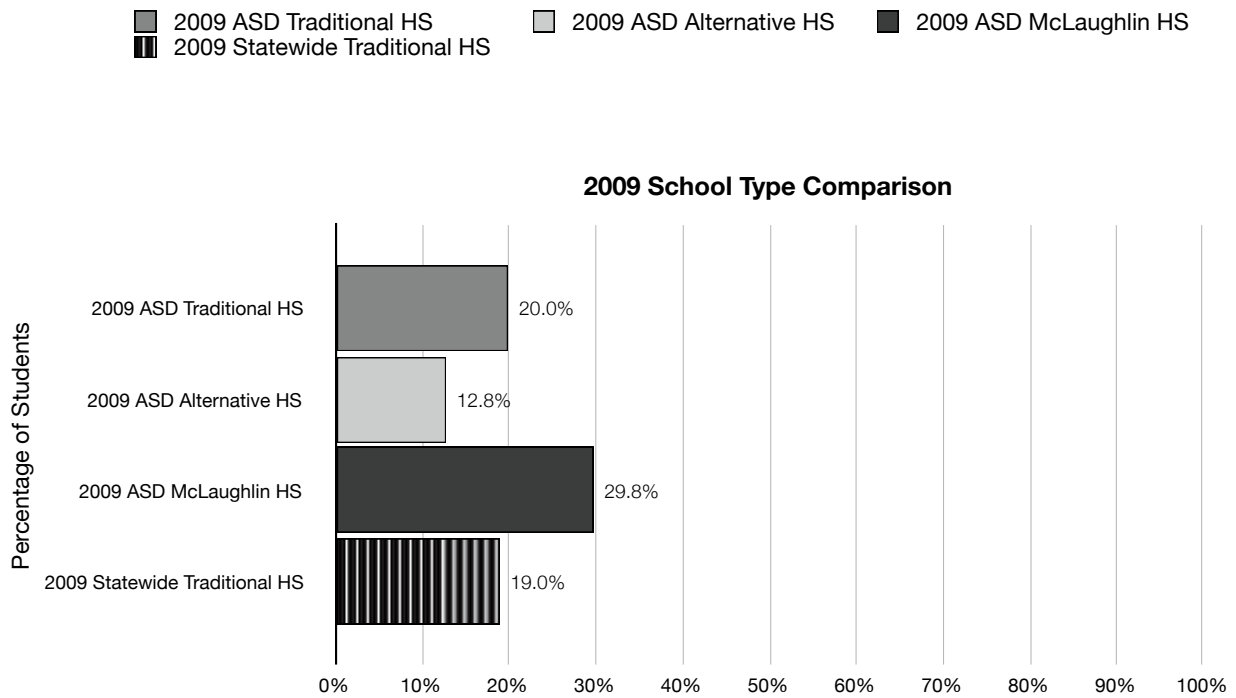

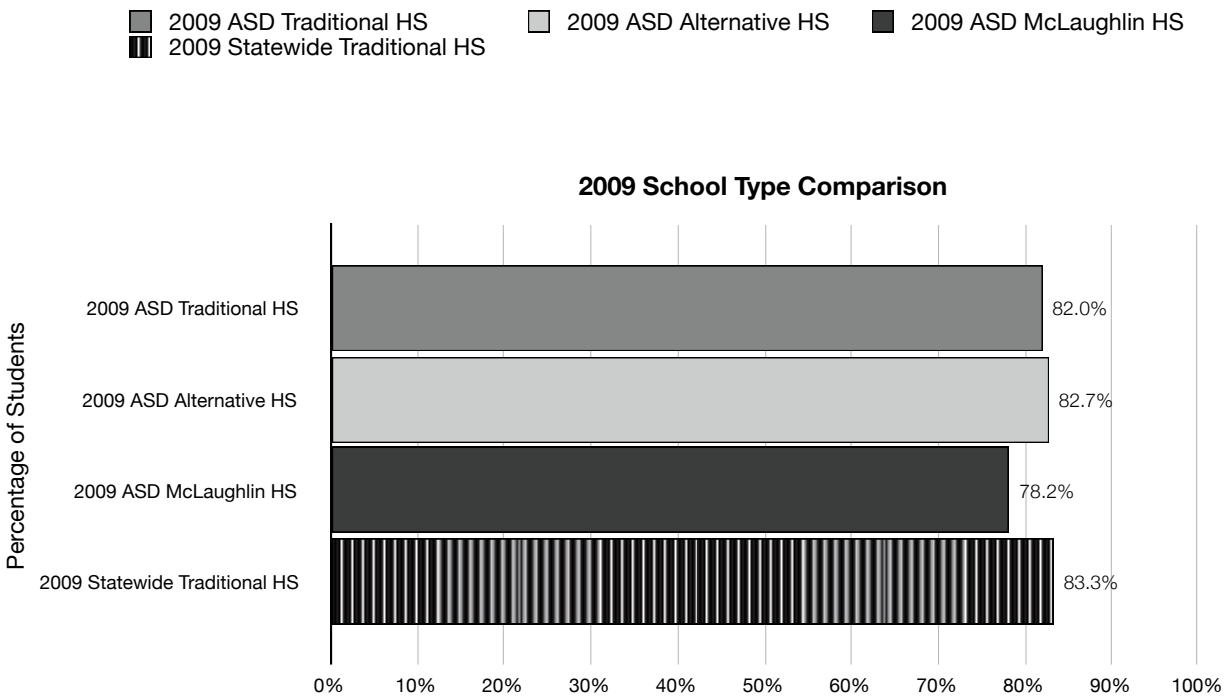

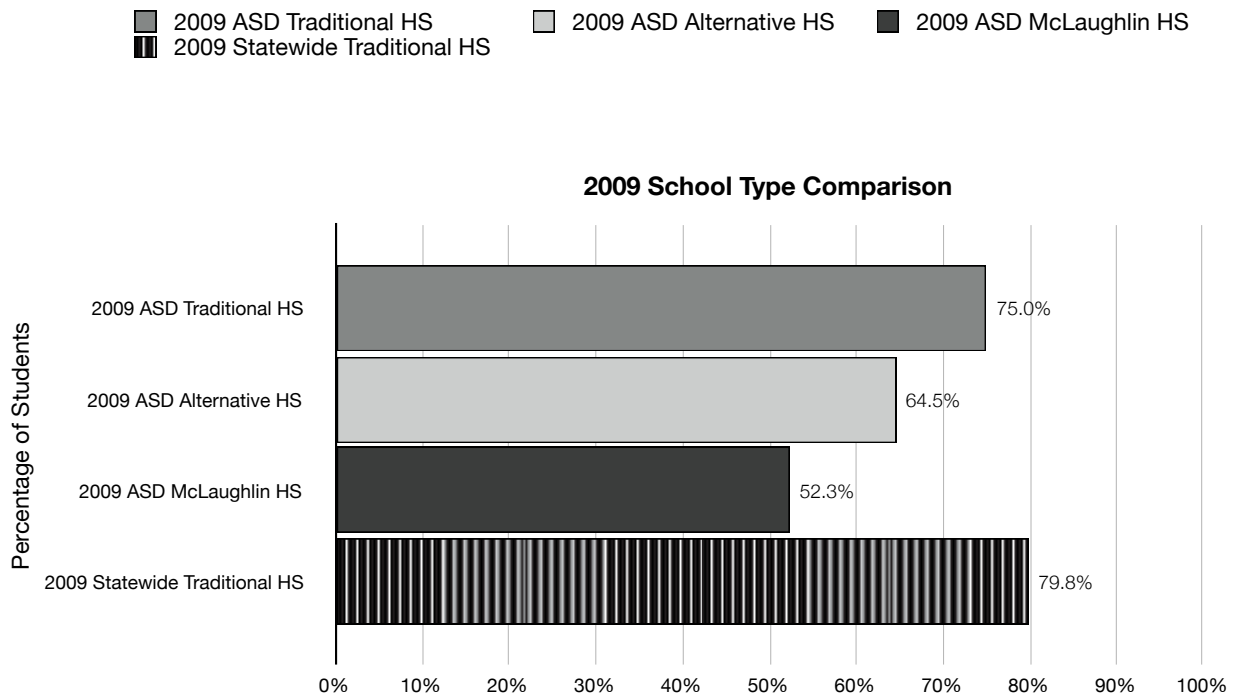

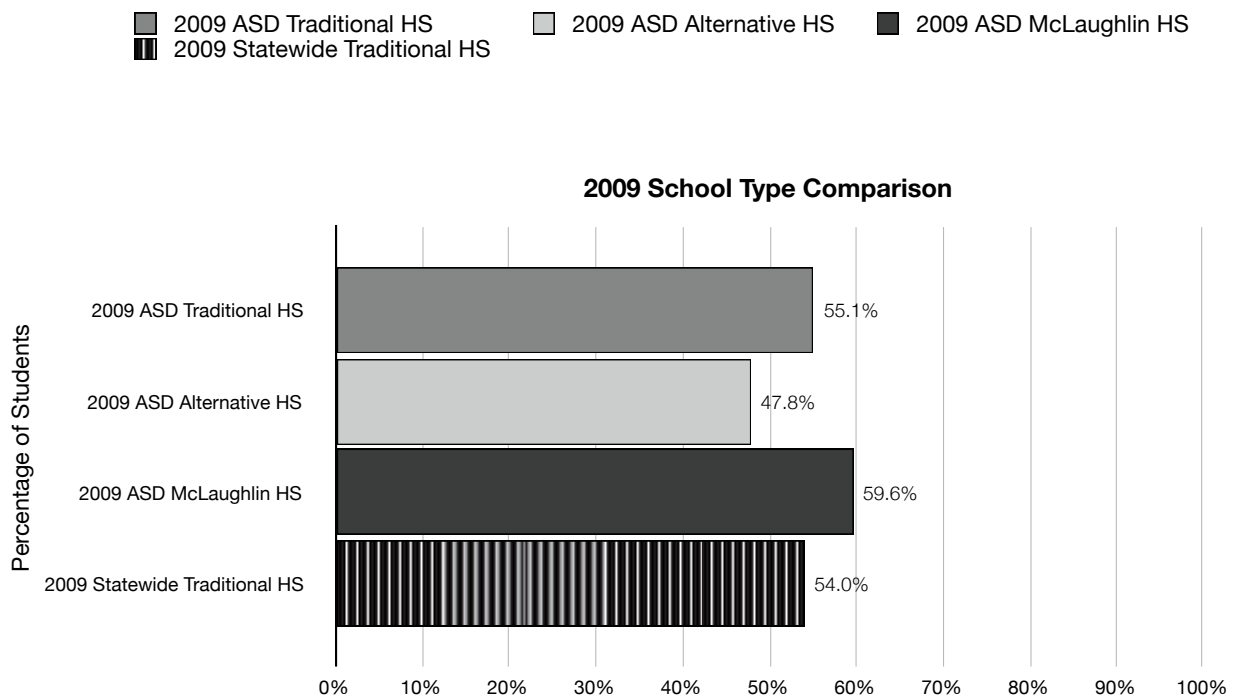

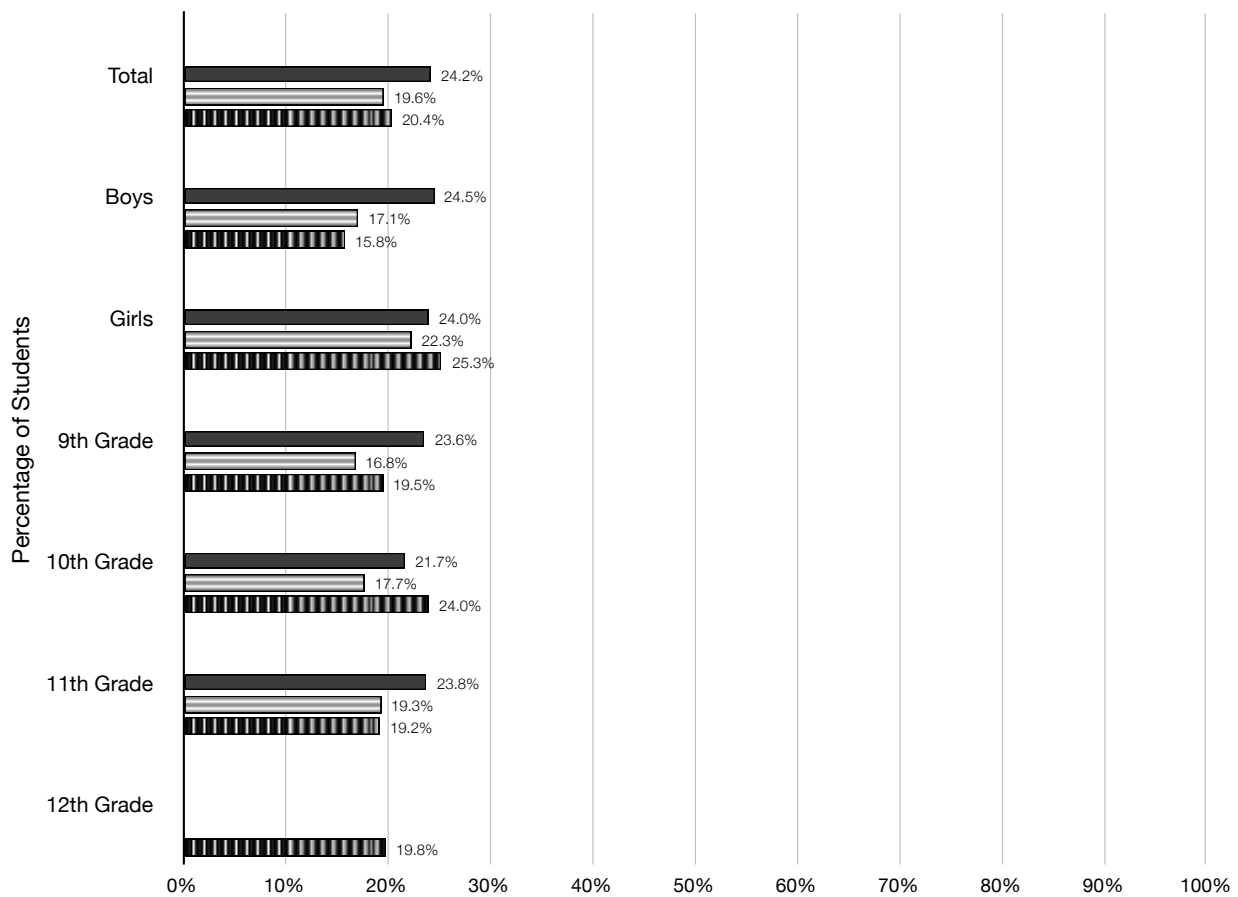

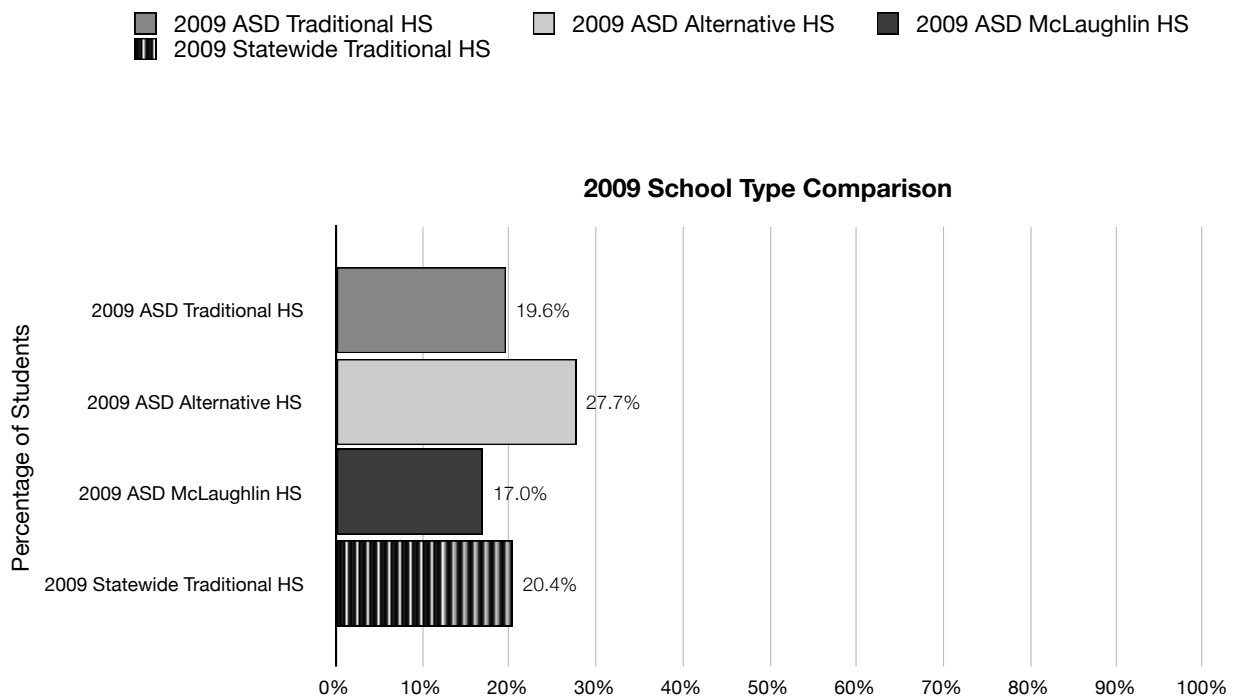

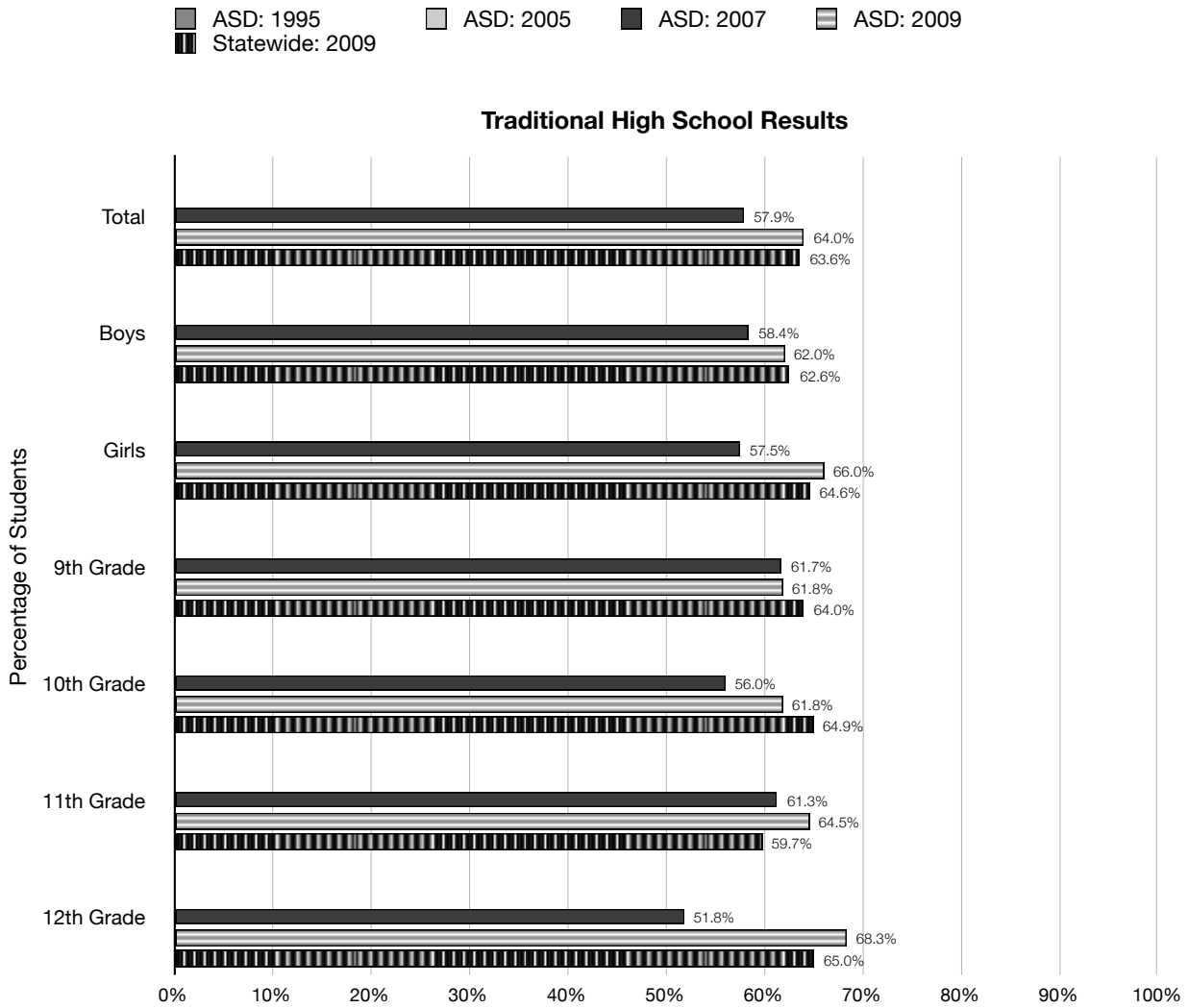

Percentage of students who agree or strongly agree that their school has clear rules and consequences for behavior

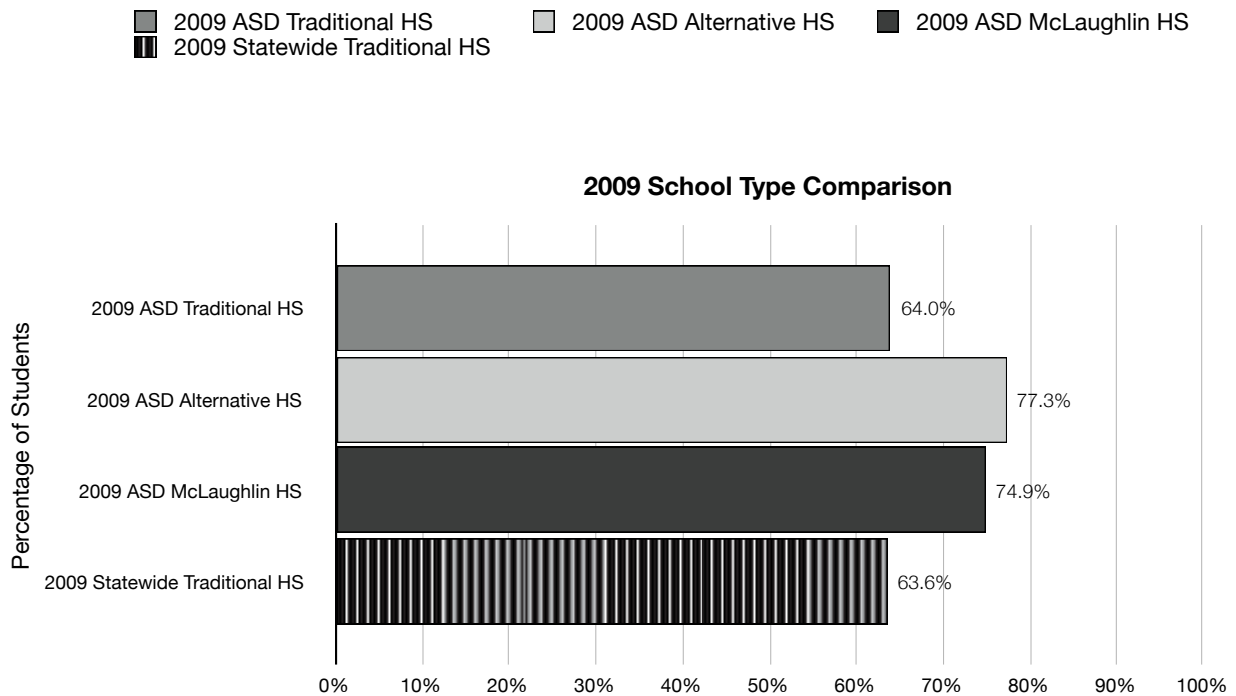
Question 99: Do you agree or disagree that your school has clear rules and consequences for behavior?

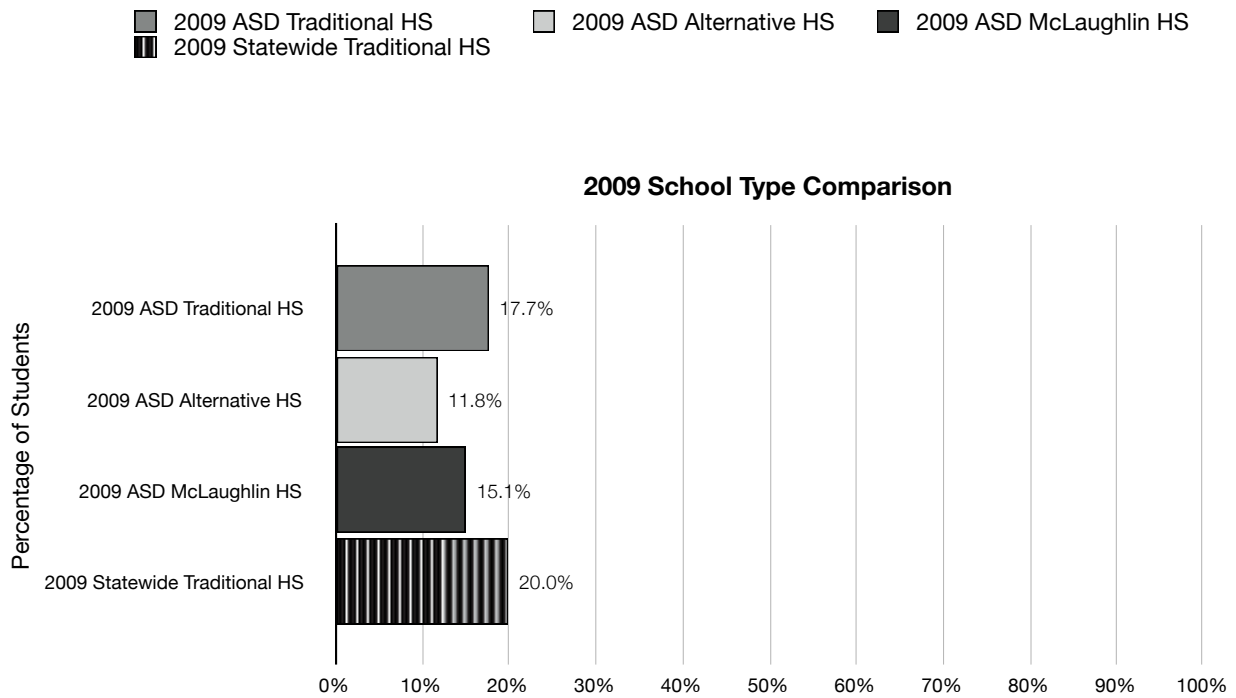

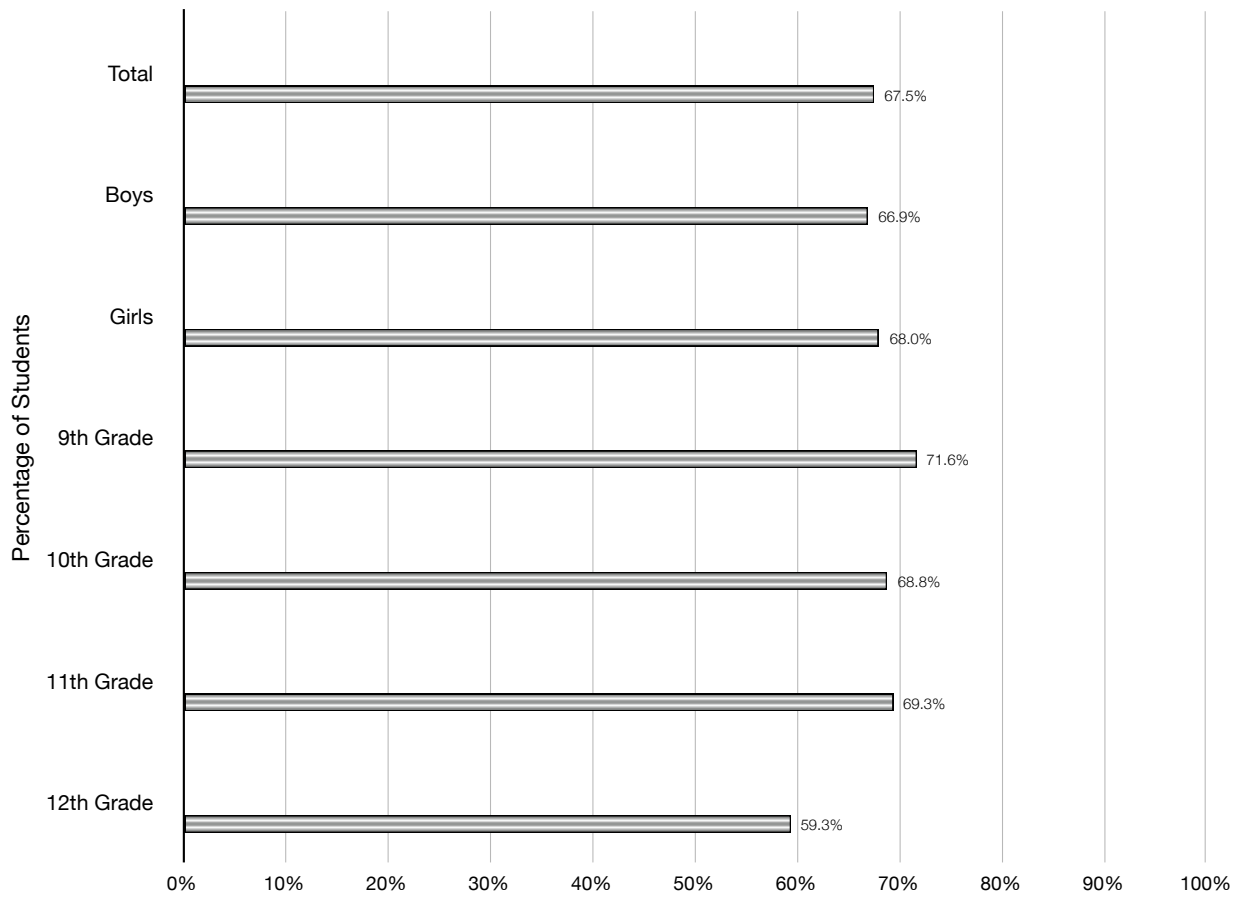

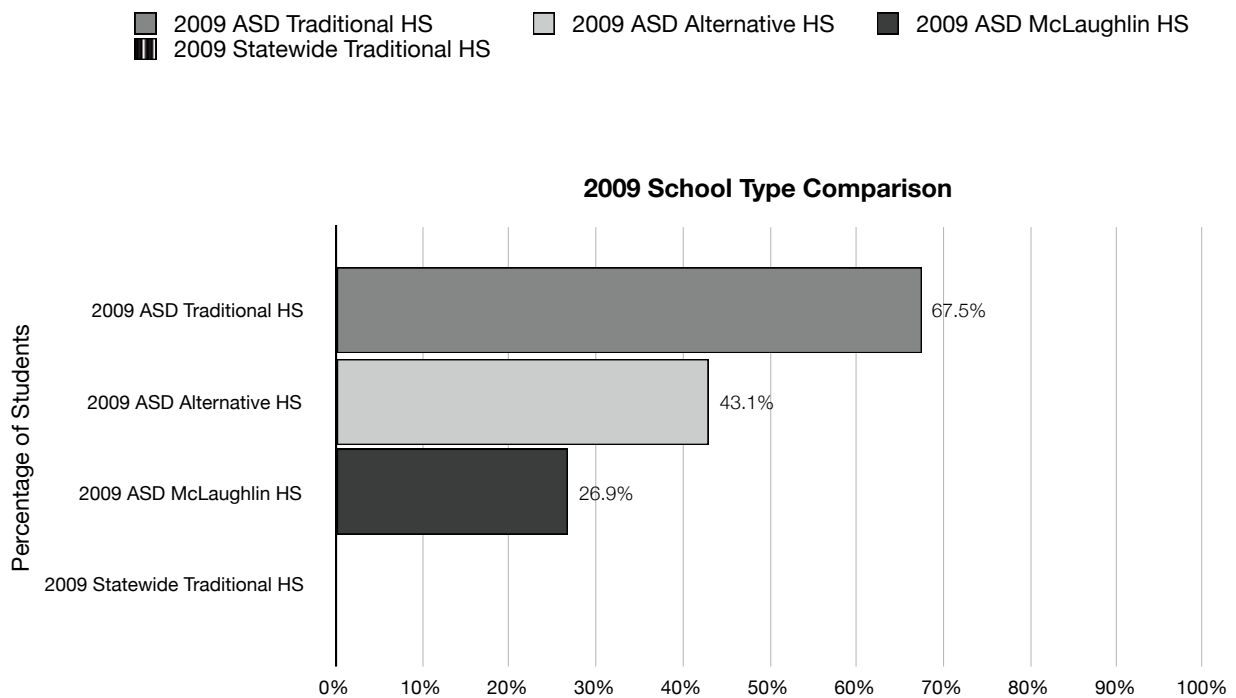

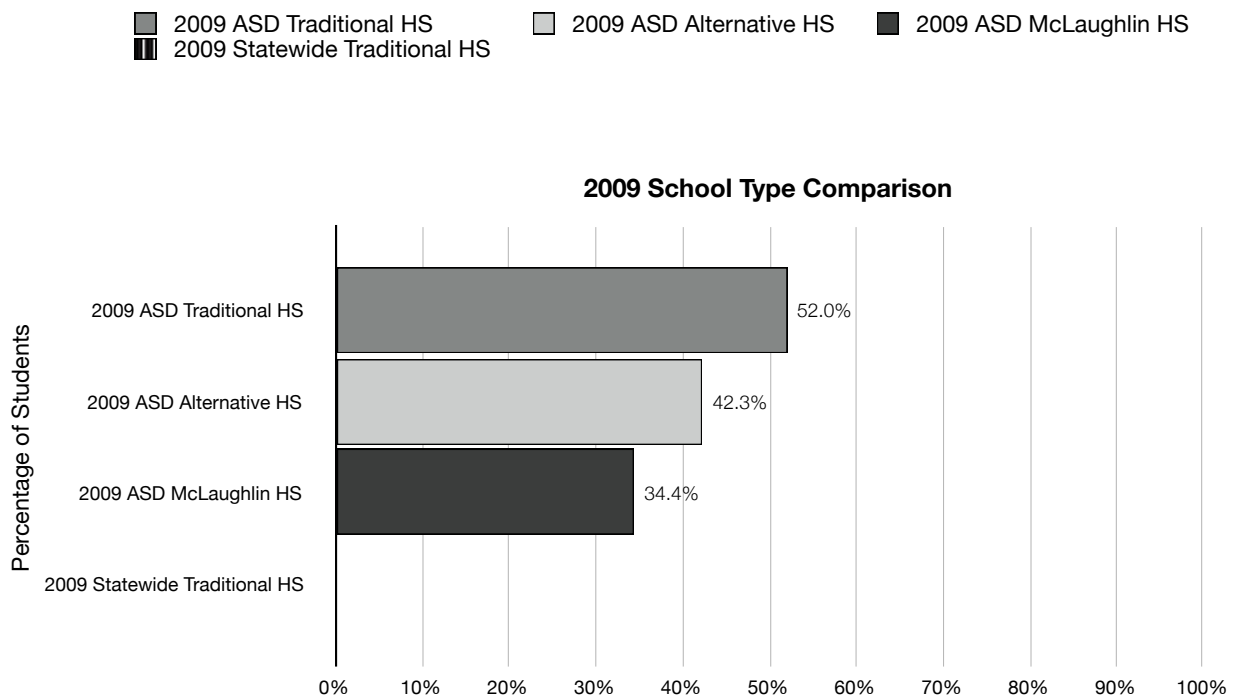

Question 102: How wrong do your parents feel it would be for you to smoke cigarettes?

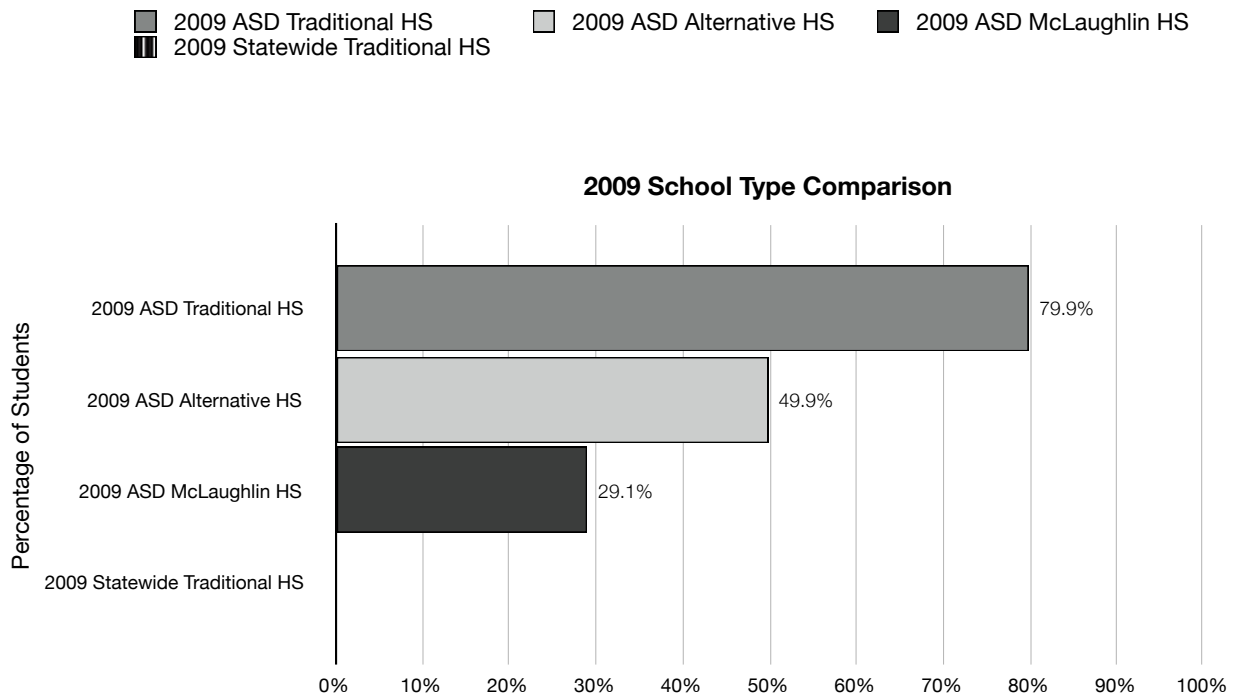

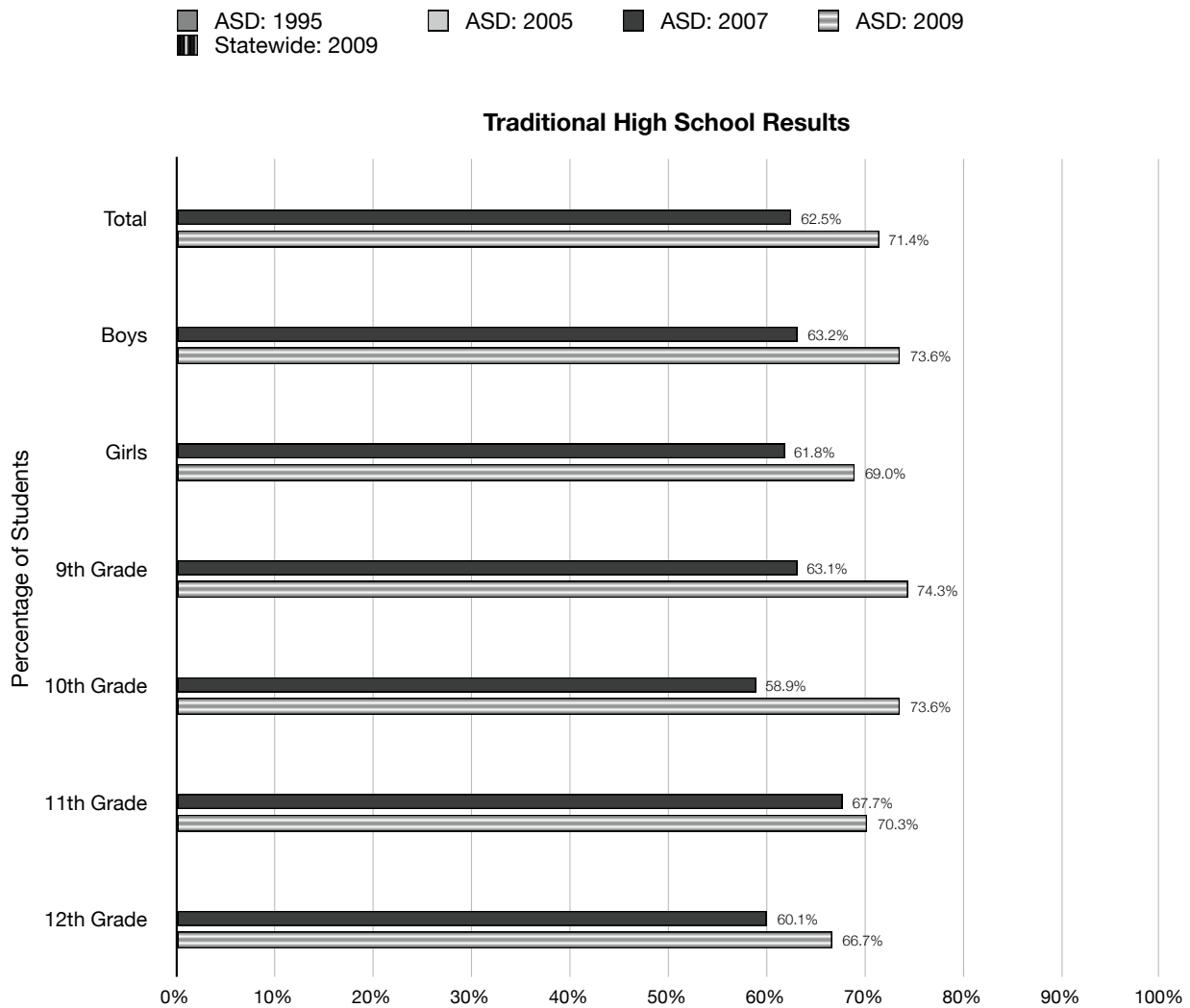

Percentage of students who think there is no or very little chance of smoking cigarettes as being seen as cool

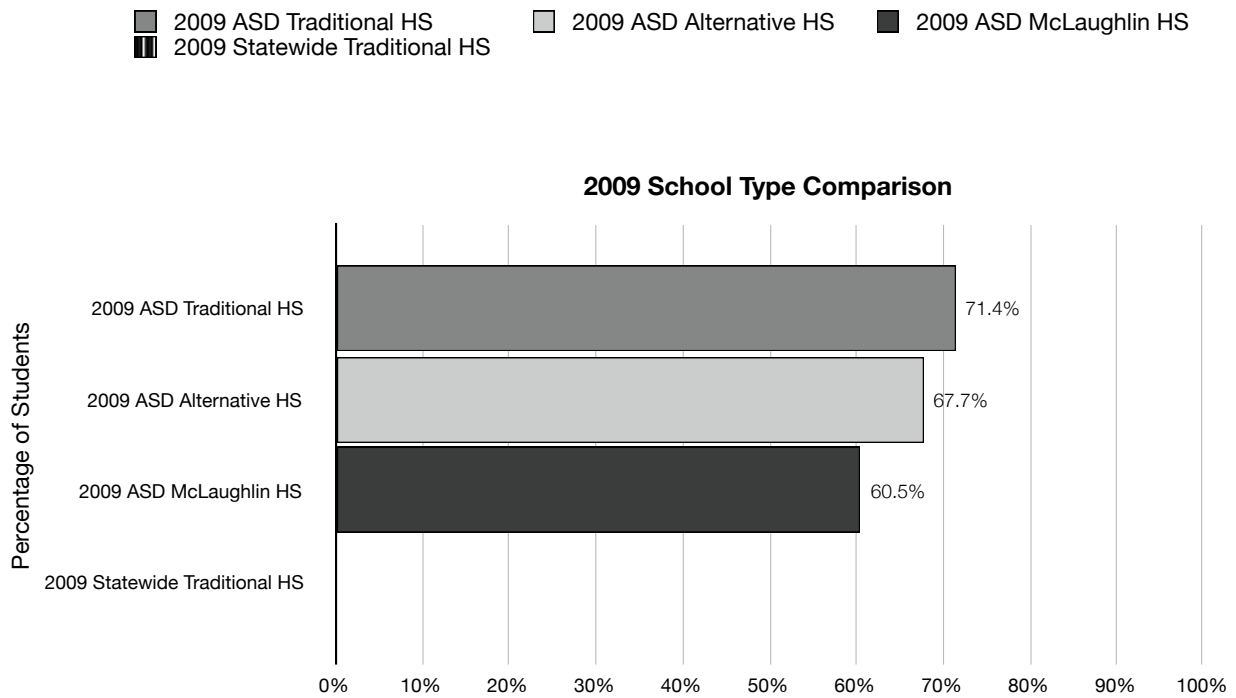
Question 103: What are the chances you would be seen as cool if you smoked cigarettes?

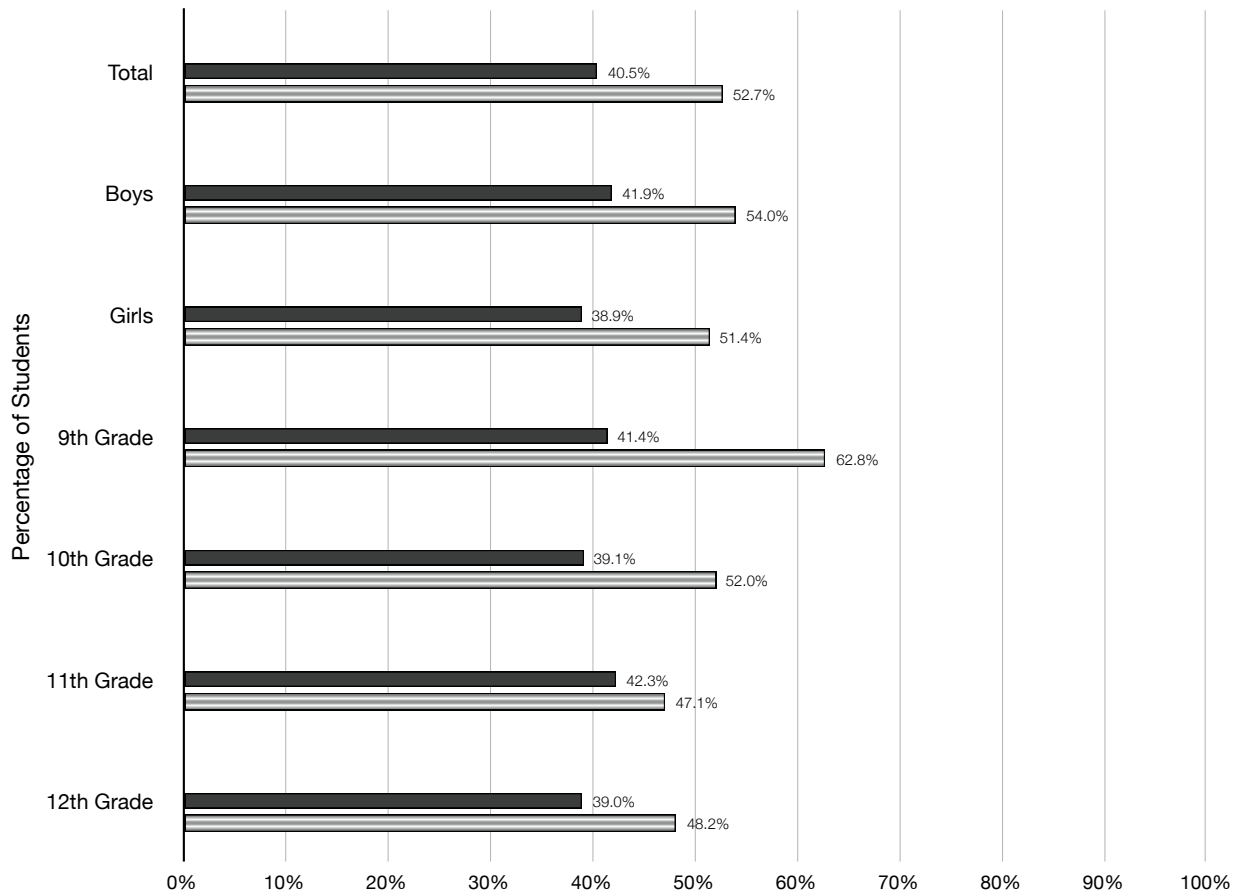

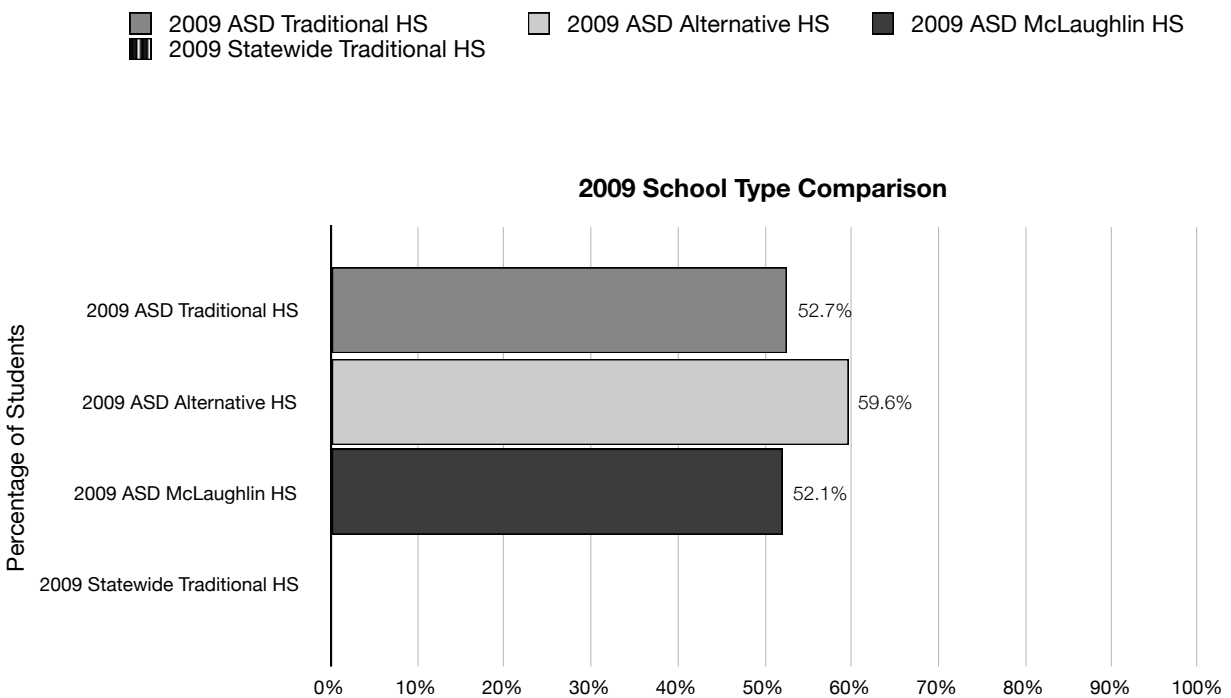

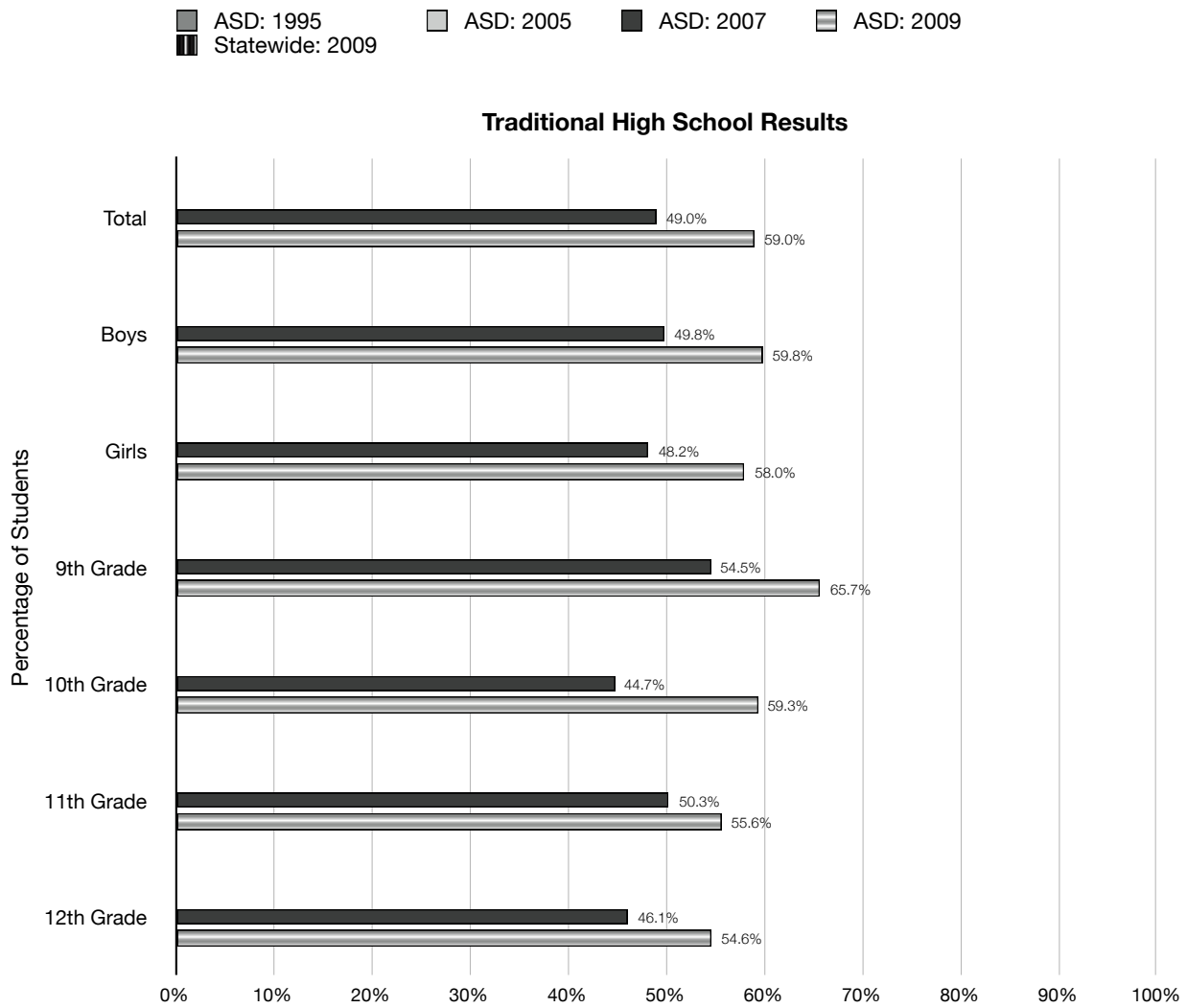

Percentage of students who think there is no or very little chance of smoking marijuana as being seen as cool

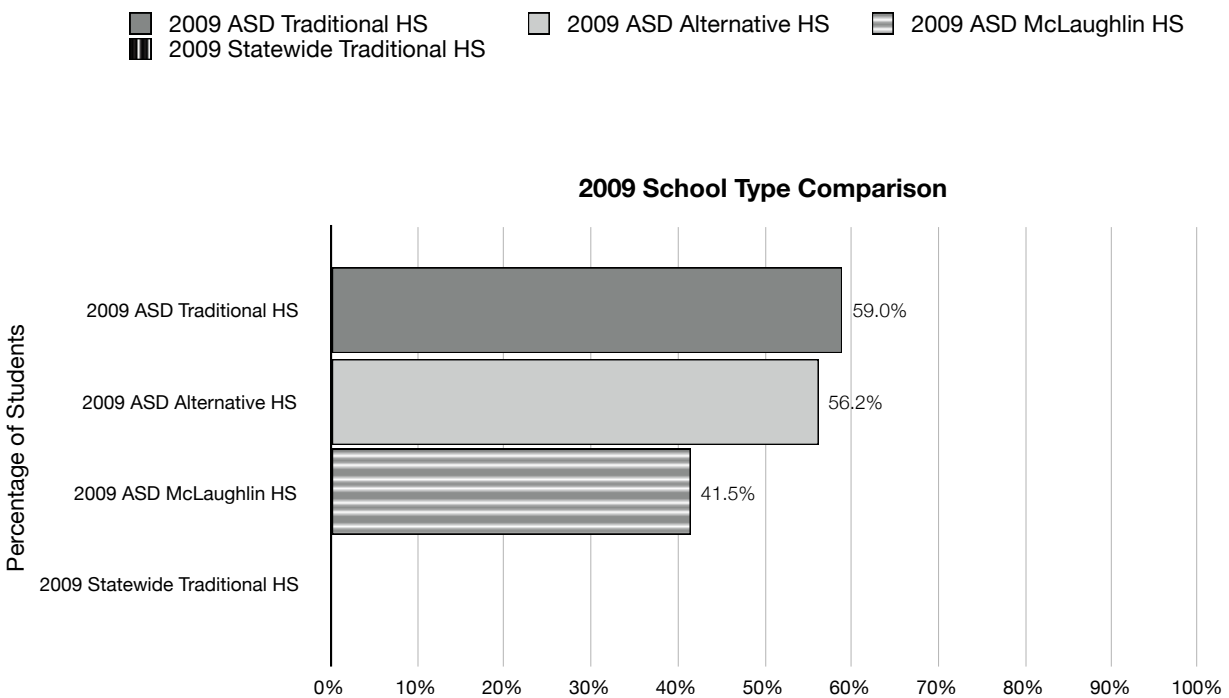
Question 105: What are the chances you would be seen as cool if you smoked marijuana?
