SUBJECT: FOURTH QUARTER AND END OF 2006-2007 SCHOOL YEAR
SUSPENSION/WEAPONS/EXPULSION REPORT

ASD Goal: Establish and maintain a supportive and effective learning environment by providing safe, caring, barrier-free schools.

PERTINENT FACTS:

Information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the elementary, middle, and high schools each quarter. This information, as well as year-end summaries by school and category for each Instructional Division level for the 2006-2007 school year, is shown in the narrative information below and in Attachments A-L.

In accordance with the School Board's adopted goal, all efforts were focused to provide safe and healthy schools. This goal has been supported by the employees at each school, as well as by the students and their parents and the business and general community. Again this year, the Anchorage Police Department was extremely supportive in its assistance to the schools. The attached discipline/suspension reports from the elementary, middle, and high schools, show the statistics for the fourth quarter and the recently completed school year and the schools' efforts to address this important goal.

Fourth Quarter Expulsions

Ten middle school students and 24 high school students were expelled by the School Board during the fourth quarter of 2006-2007, for a total of 34 students. This compares to the 35 students expelled during the fourth quarter last year. Of the middle school students expelled fourth quarter this year, two were for false alarm/bomb threats, two were for drugs/sales/criminal acts, one was for criminal acts/vandalism, and five for drug/alcohol violations. Thirteen high school students were expelled for drug/alcohol violations, one for vandalism, four for assault, one for arson/fire, one for harassment/bullying, one for theft/robbery, and three for firearms.

Expulsions During 2006-2007

A total of 127 elementary, middle school and high school students were expelled by the School Board for various reasons during the 2006-2007 school year. This compares to 95 students in 2005-2006, 140 students in 2004-2005, and 153 students in 2003-2004. One elementary student was expelled during each of the last two school years and one elementary student was expelled during the 2003-2004 school year. There were no elementary expulsions in 2004-2005 or 2002-2003.

Causality

There were only two findings of causality during the 2006-2007 school year. This compares to past years when there were two students in 2005-2006, eight students in 2004-2005, eight students in 2003-2004, and 12 students in 2002-2003.

The decrease in Finding of Causality for the last two school years is reflective of the implementation of changes in the discipline policies of the reauthorization of IDEA. The new criteria more clearly defines that manifestation determinations find causality only when "the conduct was caused by a direct and substantial relationship to the child's disability or the conduct was a direct result of the school district's failure to implement the child's IEP." In addition to the more distinct policy, the decrease indicates that the Special Education Department is doing an excellent job of ensuring the student's IEP is accurately documented and appropriately implemented.

Discipline Reports

The elementary, middle school, and high school discipline summaries follow; these are shown for fourth quarter and for the entire school year. Fourth quarter information by school and category for elementary schools is shown on Attachments A and B; elementary cumulative information is shown on Attachments C and D; middle school fourth quarter information by school and category is shown on Attachments E and F; middle school cumulative information is shown on Attachments G and H; high school fourth quarter information by school and category is shown on Attachments I and J; and high school cumulative information is shown on Attachments K and L.

Elementary Schools

The suspension report for the 2006-2007 school year (reasons for suspension and suspensions for the fourth quarter) is attached for your information. Also attached is a chart comparing suspensions by category and by repeaters for the last three years and a comparison of cumulative totals for the past three school years. Suspensions involving weapons and drugs and alcohol, as well as suspensions that deal with fighting/assault, sexual harassment and/or harassment/bullying are compared in this narrative for the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 school years. There were no expulsions or findings of causality for the fourth quarter of the 2006-2007 school year.

As compared to the 2005-2006 school year, elementary suspensions decreased in the fourth quarter of 2006-2007. There were 413 recorded suspensions in 2005-2006 compared to 380 in 2006-2007. There were nine weapons violations (four small knives, one toy gun, one pair of scissors, one throwing star, one pepper spray and one shocker), which resulted in suspension during the fourth quarter of 2006-2007; there were 18 reported weapons incidents during the fourth quarter of 2005-2006.

There were three drug and alcohol suspensions for the fourth quarter compared to eight during the fourth quarter last year. There were 108 suspensions for fighting this quarter compared to 120 last year. The largest areas of decrease were seen in reckless behavior which decreased by 11 suspensions and disobedience which decreased by seven.

For fourth quarter 2006-2007, nine schools increased suspensions by one to two when compared to the same time period last year, while 16 schools increased suspensions by three or more. Twenty-seven schools had a decrease in the number of suspensions from the fourth quarter of last year, while at eight schools the number of suspensions remained the same.

Middle School Suspension Summary

Six hundred students were suspended during fourth quarter of the 2006-2007 school year for grades six, (Mirror Lake only), seven and eight. There were 830 suspensions during the fourth quarter in 2005-2006. This is a decrease of 230 suspensions compared to the same period in 2005-2006.

Increases are noted in the following categories: attendance-excess tardies, vandalism/destruction of property, false alarm/bomb threat, failure to serve/refused option, inappropriate sexual behavior, and reckless & unsafe behavior categories.

Other suspension categories showing significant decreases are fighting/threats from 191 to 86, threats/instigating from 44 to 29, and disruptive behavior from 35 in to 17. A few categories remained relatively constant or showed minor increases across the Middle School Division. The schools continue to deliver the 12-lesson Aggressors, Victims and Bystanders Program to all seventh grade students with refresher lessons taught to the eighth graders. Middle school teachers and administrators put forth substantial effort and energy with this program to address the issues of bullying through a comprehensive change in school climate.

All middle schools are taking proactive steps to reduce aggressive/bullying behaviors. These steps include:

- 1) Implementation of the Aggressors, Victims and Bystanders (AVB) programs.
- 2) Early intervention referrals to Prevention and Intervention Coordinators
- 3) Collaboration with School Resource Officers (SROs).

The Division goal is to decrease the suspension rate by continuing early intervention and remediation work with students particularly in areas such as harassment/bullying, disruptive behavior, and profanity.

In the category of weapons other than firearms, there were two incidents for quarter four. Six students were suspended under the category of false alarm/bomb threats. One student was suspended for the fourth quarter for arson/fire.

The middle school overall suspension rate for 2006-2007 reflected a decrease of 45 suspensions, and the overall rate continues to decrease on a yearly basis. One factor that has contributed to the decrease is the Division-wide effort to implement the Aggressors, Victims, and Bystanders (AVB) antibullying and school climate program. This intervention program has shown positive cumulative results throughout the three years of implementation. Two additional contributing factors include collaboration with School Resource Officers and the use of a Prevention and Intervention Coordinator in every middle school.

High Schools

The number of high school suspensions for the fourth quarter of the 2006-2007 school year is 598, a decrease of 150 suspensions, as compared to the fourth quarter of the 2005-2006 when there were 748 suspensions.

There were 41 fighting incidents during the fourth quarter of the 2006-2007 school year and 64 fighting incidents the fourth quarter of 2005-2006 for a decrease of 23 suspensions for fighting. There were 20 incidents of threats during the fourth quarter of this year compared to 19 during the fourth quarter of 2005-2006.

Charter Schools

There were no suspensions or expulsions during the fourth quarter of the 2006-2007 school year at Family Partnership, Frontier or Winterberry charter schools.

Aquarian Charter School had three suspensions and no expulsions during fourth quarter 2006-2007; fighting (1), dangerous behavior (1), and accidentally hitting a teacher (1).

Eagle Academy Charter School suspended a total of three students during the fourth quarter of 2006-2007; one for reckless and unsafe behavior on the playground, one for harassment and bullying on the playground, and one for general disruptive behavior in the classroom.

Highland Tech Charter School had 11 suspensions (listed below) and no expulsions during the fourth quarter of 2006-2007.
