











Chart 2. Nonfarm payroll employment over-the-month change, seasonally adjusted, March 2008 – March 2010









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### Insourcing State Job Facts

- U.S. subsidiaries in Alaska play a vital role in supporting jobs. They now employ 12,200 Alaskans—an increase of 16.2% over five years.
- In fact, the relative portion of jobs in Alaska supplied by U.S. subsidiaries remains significant. They provide the livelihood for more than 5% of Alaska's private-sector workforce.

### INSOURCING MANUFACTURING JOB FACTS

- U.S. subsidiaries support 2,400 manufacturing jobs in Alaska. Manufacturing companies tend to have a strong "multiplier" effect on the economy—stimulating a substantial amount of activity and jobs in other sectors through their demand for inputs from other suppliers.
- Almost 18% of manufacturing jobs in Alaska are supported by U.S. subsidiaries

### Insourcing National Job Facts

- U.S. subsidiaries consistently support millions of American Jobs. They now employ 5.3 million Americans—or 4.5% of private sector employment.
- U.S. subsidiaries support an annual payroll of \$364.2 billion.
- U.S. subsidiaries provide an average compensation per U.S. worker of \$68,317; this is 32% percent higher than compensation at all U.S. companies.
- U.S. subsidiaries also spent \$160 billion on plant construction and new equipment.
- U.S. subsidiaries' share of U.S. manufacturing employment represents π percent of American manufacturing jobs.






**Graph 1**: U.S. Parent Companies Account for Large Shares of the Overall U.S. Economy






Graph 2: U.S. Parents Account for the Large Majority of Worldwide Activity of U.S. Multinationals









### Lessons for Policy Makers

- ☐ Jobs...: Unwise to pursue policies (e.g., tax deferral) that handicap MNCs, the source of one-fifth of our employment and nearly half our exports
- ☐ Exports: US growth depends on access to overseas customers
- ☐ FDI: Need a physical presence to be close to these customers
- ...and more jobs: Investing overseas creates jobs at home
